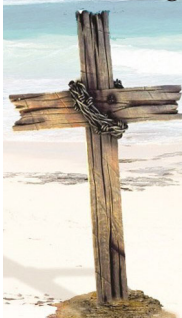

✧ A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ✧

Dear Friends,

This past Tuesday, August 11, was the liturgical memorial of St. Clare of Assisi, the great friend of St. Francis of Assisi, and the foundress of the family of cloistered, contemplative nuns known as the Poor Clares.

And that brings up a story which has to do with Roswell, New Mexico. Like many people, for much of my life I associated Roswell, New Mexico with only one thing: the mysterious "Area 51." However, some years ago, I learned that there is a blessed, tucked-away place also in Roswell, but of much deeper significance than Area 51, whatever Area 51 may hold. The place of which I speak is the Poor Clare Monastery of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

The history of the Poor Clares began on March 18, 1212, when Chiara Offreduccio, (known today to the world as St. Clare of Assisi) courageously left her parents' home to follow the radical discipleship preached and lived by St. Francis of Assisi. From her first little monastery at San Damiano in Assisi, many new communities quickly sprang up throughout Italy and Europe. Today the vigorous vine of Poor Clare life extends to nearly every corner of the world, including the monastery in Roswell, which was founded in 1948.

Back when I was chaplain of St. Joseph High School in Trumbull, there was a student there named Brianna Farens. I had known her and her family from St. Joseph Parish in Shelton, many years before. Brianna went on to study at and graduate from Providence College in Rhode Island. She had always thought about pursuing a career in medicine, like her father, who inspired her with the compassion he showed to his patients. But in college, she began to pray more and felt a deep desire to grow closer to Christ. A mission trip to Peru after graduation, where she worked with people living in shantytowns, changed the direction of her life. Having entered the monastery in 2020, she – now known as Sr. Maria Antonia of the Holy Wounds of Jesus – made her First Vows in 2024.

Shortly after Easter of this year, I visited the Monastery with Sr. Maria Antonia's parents, Dr. John and Donna Farens. I offered Holy Mass each day for the Sisters, and visited with them in the visitors' parlor. It was a deeply joyful experience, and I found the monastery to be a place of exceptional peace and tranquility.

There is a stillness and peace there which is palpable. When I was there, I had a very strong impression that, even though this place is unknown to much of the world, it is in some sense the very center of the world, because from there, the prayers, love, and sacrifices of these consecrated women of incredible faith and goodness ascend to God's throne as a plea for grace and salvation for people in every time and place and circumstance.

The vocation of these nuns is so beautiful! Within the walls of the monastery, they offer their very lives for the salvation of the world. Around the clock, they chant the praises of the Lord, and they lift up to Him all the needs of the Church and the world. They pray especially for the sanctification of priests. I have often written to these wonderful Sisters and entrusted to them particularly important intentions. I have asked them to pray in a special way for this Parish of St. Catherine of Siena.

What a magnificent and deeply fruitful and necessary vocation this is in the Church! Whenever you or I receive some particular grace from God – be it a grace of a deeper conversion of mind and heart, or when a young heart is moved with the first stirrings of a vocation to the Priesthood or to the Consecrated Life, or when someone miraculously is brought from dire sickness back to health – that grace doesn't just come from nowhere. It comes from God, of course – but chances are that such a grace was obtained from God through the prayers and generosity and sacrifice of someone, somewhere, who is praying for us.

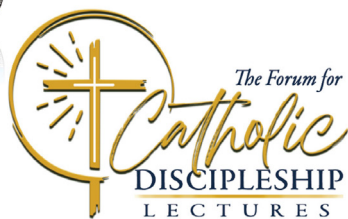
God's grace has been superabundant here at St. Catherine's, and we hope and trust that it will continue to be so. I know that for a lot of these graces, we have the nuns in their monastery in New Mexico to thank, who always hold us before the Lord in their prayers. So please join me in giving thanks to God for these wonderful women of faith and goodness. And join me in thanking God for the life and witness, and faith of their Holy Mother, St. Clare of Assisi.

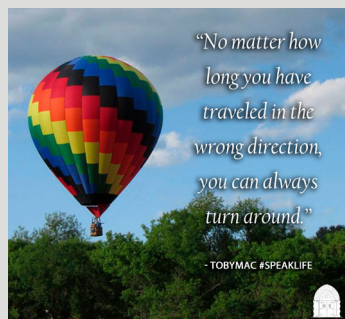

MAKE YOUR DONATION: Our Online Giving Platform will accept your donations for Mass intentions; please use the **"Memorial Masses"** fund for Mass Intention or **"Sanctuary Lamp"** fund for Sanctuary Lamp.

Announced Mass intentions are customarily for deceased persons. Should anyone desire to request a Mass for a living person or persons, such requests will be addressed individually by the parish office.

We cannot accommodate all requests, as there are about 500 intentioned Masses available each year, and we receive easily twice that number of requests! In order to be fair to all, it is our parish's policy that an individual family may request up to five (5) Masses in a calendar year, including: up to two (2) weekend Masses, & up to three (3) weekday Masses. For a Mass intention, either one (1) or two (2) individual names may be listed as the intention for a Mass. Should the person requesting the Mass desire more than two names, the Mass should be designated for all the deceased members of that family. Thank you for your kind understanding. It is a great "problem" to have that so many people want to request Masses at our parish!

TO PARENTS OF OUR CHILDREN: RELAX!

God put the wiggle in children. Don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house. Everyone is welcome here at St. Catherine's! You may find it helpful to sit in the pews near the front, where it is easier to see and hear. Don't hesitate to quietly explain the parts of the Mass. Sing the hymns and songs, pray and voice the responses together with your children. They learn liturgical behavior by copying YOU! If you need to leave Mass with your child, please feel free to do so, but please do come back! As Jesus said, "Let the children come to Me." Remember that the way we welcome children in Church directly affects the way they respond to the Church, to God, to Christ, and to one another. Let them know that they are at home here! To all the members of our Parish: a smile of encouragement is always welcome to parents with small, active children. The presence of children is a GIFT to the Church! They give us a future full of hope.

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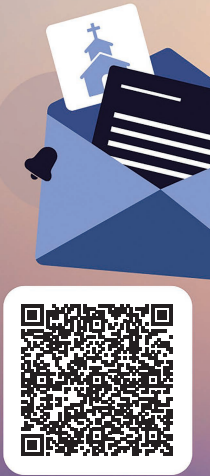
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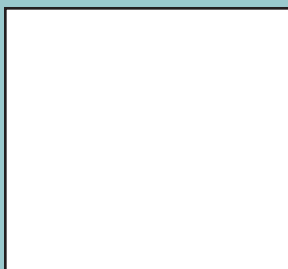
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
