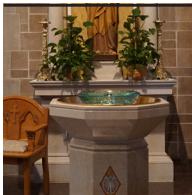

✧ A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR ✧

Dear Friends,

At long last, we have reached the weekend on which our new outdoor statue of St. Catherine of Siena will be unveiled and – weather permitting – also blessed when Bishop Caggiano visits for the 11:00 a.m. Mass.

I've received many questions about how this project came to be. When Msgr. Shea passed away in January of last year, several of his friends asked what an appropriate memorial would be. Knowing that Msgr. had always admired the statue of St. Catherine of Siena on Bernini's colonnade overlooking St. Peter's Square in Vatican City, I thought that we could do something similar (the statue – not the whole colonnade!) on our already beautiful parish campus.

So I contacted sculptor Cody Swanson in Florence, Italy, who, in my opinion, is one of the most talented sculptors and figural artists alive today. I mentioned to Cody the statue in the Vatican, with which he was familiar. And the process took off from there.

It began with an initial sketch. In this rendering, St. Catherine is shown with the Stigmata, but without the Crown of Thorns. Actually, during her lifetime, the Crown of Thorns was visible only to St. Catherine herself. If you look closely at the shrine, on the capitals atop the two columns, the Crown of Thorns is found there: one for St. Catherine, and one for Christ.

Then we set about designing the pedestal, columns, and pediment. I once had the opportunity to visit the Papal Villa at Castel Gandolfo, where the Pope spends his summers. Near a pond on that property is a beautiful shrine to Our Lady, and the shrine surround for this project was inspired by the shrine at Castel Gandolfo.

Next, when I had approved the architectural design, Cody gave them to a technical draughtsman who produced CAD production drawings for cutting, shaping, and honing the marble. The marbles used in this design are botticcino classico (the whitish/greyish stone) and giallo sienna (the yellowish stone).

For the statue itself: Cody produced a small model at about 1/3 scale, to convey the composition with maximum flexibility. From there, the full-scale model was enlarged by hand with a pantograph, and further developed. Throughout this process, Cody and I were in touch – often through transatlantic Zoom calls – to refine the design to get it just right.

A silicon mold was then taken from the clay model to produce a wax copy, which was invested and cast in bronze in several pieces through the ancient “lost wax” process. This is the same way the Greeks and Romans cast bronzes, in several pieces. Then the pieces are soldered together, the seams hidden, and the patina is brought out using a blow torch, which oxidizes the acid on the surface of the metal, thereby achieving the desired tonal effect.

Then it was all crated in up in Florence, shipped here on a boat, cleared customs in New York, and assembled on our campus!

I pray that for generations to come, this new statue and shrine of St. Catherine will serve to inspire our parishioners and friends, and all passersby, with deeper interest in and devotion to one of the most remarkable women in the history of the Church, our patroness, St. Catherine of Siena.

PS: People have been asking: Why five trees? (The question refers to the five dogwood trees planted in a semicircle behind the St. Catherine shrine). The five trees recall the five wounds of Christ, which St. Catherine bore on her own body, in the sacred Stigmata.

Over the centuries, people have noticed in the flower of the dogwood tree reminders that point to Christ's Passion and Death: the middle of the dogwood flower has a tight spiny grouping which resembles the thorns with which Christ was crowned; the tips of each of the four petals of the dogwood flower are indented, as if they bear the imprint of a nail. And at the indentation there is a tinge of red, a reminder of the blood Christ poured out so that we might be saved, and pass from death to life.



THIS WEEKEND AT ST. CATHERINE'S

MAJOR RELICS OF ST. MARGARET MARY ALACOQUE

The relics will be present for all five Masses on Oct 3 & 4. Veneration available immediately following.

The major relics of St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a cloistered, contemplative nun known as the Apostle of the Sacred Heart, are traveling in the U.S. under the custody of the Knights of Columbus. The tour celebrates the U.S. Catholic bishops' consecration of the nation to the Sacred Heart in June for our country's 250th. St. Margaret Mary was a member of a religious community known as the Order of the Visitation of Holy Mary. Beginning in 1673, at her convent in France, she experienced multiple visions of Jesus during which he stressed his divine love for humanity and revealed devotion to his Sacred Heart. At Jesus' instruction, and with the assistance of her priest spiritual director, the Jesuit priest St. Claude de la Colombe, the nun introduced the series of spiritual practices to the world which continue to be observed today. She was canonized as a saint in 1920.

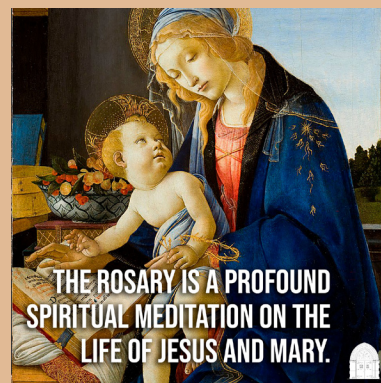

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come. A second time he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."' Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.' 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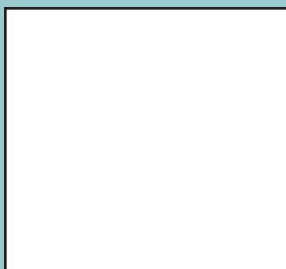
