




THE SEARCH

Everyone likes a good movie/show recommendation. In that spirit, I'll share one with you. It's a series called *The Search*, which was produced by the Augustine Institute and which is available to our parishioners for free through our online FORMED account (you can access it through our parish website). Released last spring, so it's not technically brand-new, *The Search* is well worth your time. It is a seven-part video series hosted by Chris Stefanick, with each 30 minute episode engaging some fundamental question about life.

What makes *The Search* so effective, besides the beautiful visuals it provides, is that it starts with the basic questions that every person has, even non-religious people. Too often, people in our day presuppose that existence has no intrinsic meaning. We think we must decide for ourselves what life is going to be about, since life in itself is meaningless. This usually has the effect of making us feel dissatisfied and sad. That's because our desire for meaning always turns out to be greater than any "meaning" we might be able to dream up for ourselves. This is the insight presented by *The Search*. It addresses the mystery of human desire, which nothing seems to satisfy except for that which transcends the natural world. It examines the question of what it means to be human, and what we mean (and don't mean) when we speak of God. The program only begins to delve into the identity of Christ Jesus and His significance for us in episode 5, after having laid a compelling foundation that opens our eyes to our need for salvation. Then, finally, the series explains to the viewer why the Church is necessary – what it is, what it isn't, and what it has to offer us as its members.

Throughout the series we hear not only from catechists, but also from scientists, psychologists, artists, a lawyer, and even an astronaut. Their contributions move us to consider again the wondrous world in which we find ourselves, the remarkable and unique strangeness of human beings, and the adventure that life is when we discover that we live it together in relationship with God and each other. If you're looking for something to watch with your family – especially high school and college students - *The Search* is a great option. If you do watch it, please let me know what you think.

Mass for the Second Sunday of Lent

Entrance Antiphon: Call to remembrance Thy tender mercies, O loving Lord, and Thy loving kindness, which have never of old, O let us not be dominated by our enemies; deliver us O God of Israel, out of all our difficulties. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.

First Reading: Gn 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

God put Abraham to the test. He called to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am!" he replied. Then God said: "Take your son Isaac, your only one, whom you love, and go to the land of Moriah. There you shall offer him up as a holocaust on a height that I will point out to you." When they came to the place of which God had told him, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. Then he reached out and took the knife to slaughter his son. But the Lord's messenger called to him from heaven, "Abraham, Abraham!" "Here I am!" he answered. "Do not lay your hand on the boy," said the messenger. "Do not do the least thing to him. I know now how devoted you are to God, since you did not withhold from me your own beloved son."

As Abraham looked about, he spied a ram caught by its horns in the thicket. So he went and took the ram and offered it up as a holocaust in place of his son. Again the Lord's messenger called to Abraham from heaven and said: "I swear by myself, declares the Lord, that because you acted as you did in not withholding from me your beloved son, I will bless you abundantly and make your descendants as countless as the stars of the sky and the sands of the seashore; your descendants shall take possession of the gates of their enemies, and in your descendants all the nations of the earth shall find blessing—all this because you obeyed my command."

Gradual: I believed, therefore have I spoken I was greatly afflicted. I will pay my vows unto the Lord now in the presence of His people. I will offer to thee a sacrifice of thanksgiving and will call on the name of the Lord.

Second Reading: Rom 8:31b-34

Brothers and sisters: If God is for us, who can be against us? He who did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for us all, how will He not also give us everything else along with Him?

Who will bring a charge against God's chosen ones? It is God who acquits us, who will condemn? Christ Jesus it is who died—or, rather, was raised—who also is at the right hand of God, who indeed intercedes for us.

Gospel: Mk 9:2-10

Jesus took Peter, James and John and led them up a high mountain apart by themselves. And he was transfigured before them, and his clothes became dazzling white, such as no fuller on earth could bleach them. Then Elijah appeared to them along with Moses, and they were conversing with Jesus. Then Peter said to Jesus in reply, "Rabbi, it is good that we are here! Let us make three tents: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He hardly knew what to say, they were so terrified. Then a cloud came, casting a shadow over them; from the cloud came a voice, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." Suddenly, looking around, they no longer saw anyone but Jesus alone with them.

As they were coming down from the mountain, he charged them not to relate what they had seen to anyone, except when the Son of Man had risen from the dead. So they kept the matter to themselves, questioning what rising from the dead meant.

Communion Antiphon: Tell no one what you have seen until the Son of man has risen from the dead.

Help Stop State Sponsored Suicide

Politicians in Hartford are again considering assisted suicide legislation. The Public Health Committee of the Connecticut General Assembly is considering legalizing a form of suicide in our state commonly referred to as "aid-in-dying" or "physician-assisted suicide." The Committee has raised *House Bill 6425 "An Act Concerning Aid in Dying for Terminally Ill Patients."*

Modern hospice care and the proper use of pain medications render suicide unnecessary, and we need to be mindful of the threat that a suicide mentality poses to vulnerable people and to people with disabilities. Many people believe that a physician is deeply involved in this process. This is not true. The physician orders the mixture of medications, the patient must then consume the deadly cocktail of drugs without assistance. Many times without even a physician or nurse present.

We should never allow legislators to establish suicide as a solution to medical issues. Don't let the state persuade us that it's dignified for an ill person to sign their own execution order. Don't let the state create an environment where ill people will feel they have a "responsibility to die."

Catholic teaching condemns physician-assisted suicide because it, like murder, involves taking an innocent human life:

Suicide is always as morally objectionable as murder. The Church's tradition has always rejected it as a gravely evil choice: To concur with the intention of another person to commit suicide and to help in carrying it out through so-called "assisted suicide" means to cooperate in, and at times to be the actual perpetrator of, an injustice which can never be excused, even if it is requested. Saint Augustine writes that "it is never licit to kill another: even if he should wish it." True "compassion" leads to sharing another's pain; it does not kill the person whose suffering we cannot bear. (John Paul II, The Gospel of Life, no. 66).


"He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." - Matthew 3:11


