FROM FR. PAWEL

We feel extremely uncomfortable when people are correcting, judging, criticizing us, or even condemning our words or actions. We think about how they can be so cruel, unfair and so judgmental towards us. We feel hurt because often they do not know the whole story behind our deeds, words or choices. Often, they only get a small portion of the truth or only a distorted version of what happened. The version that is narrated to show us in the worst possible light and often this image has nothing to do with the reality.

In today's gospel the woman who got caught of adultery was guilty of what she was accused. There was no misunderstanding in it. Although nobody asked the questioned what pushed her to make such choices in her life. Nobody looked with compassion on her miserable life except one person. There was no mercy or compassion just anger, judgment, and desire to destroy another human being. By condemning her, others would feel better about themselves. There was no forgiveness because in their hearts there was no love for God, themselves, or others. They were empty vessels.

In the middle of it is Christ who is telling them that unless they are perfect and sinless, they have no right to condemn another human being. But they were not sinless. They walked away one by one. At least they had some shame and decency to see their twisted motives and deeds.

Dear brothers and sisters we are sometimes those merciless people who judge and condemn causing others to suffer. Sometimes we do it and we are aware of it. Sometimes we are not. We need to examine our conscious in this matter. But very often we are like the condemned woman; misunderstood, wounded, suffering, pleading for mercy and forgiveness, pleading for a better life.

I believe Christ is teaching us a few lessons here. First of all, we MUST be the relief, not the cause of suffering to others; kind words, forgiveness, and love above disapproval and judgment. Secondly when we are hurt, misjudged and condemned by others, let's remember that God's mercy, presence, love and forgiveness is always there. Even if we are at our lowest, we need to hear the assuring words of Christ to each one of us; your sins are forgiven, I do not condemn you.

The mercy of God is extended to us every day. Let the same divine mercy and sympathy find reflection in our words and deeds in this wounded world.

ANNOUNCEMENT FROM THE PASTOR & COMMITTEE ON THE SACRED LITURGY

St. Catherine of Bologna Committee on the Sacred Liturgy

In an effort to elevate our worship and increase reverence in the Sacred Liturgy, and relying on magisterial teachings from Sacrosanctum Concilium, Musicam Sacram, Tra Le Sollecitudini, as well as recent teachings by prominent members of the USCCB, we have decided that the use of additional instruments (such as guitars and drums) are not suitable for "accompaniment at Holy Mass".

Recognizing, as we do, that sacred music has a dual purpose in divine worship: "the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful", we desire a musical expression in liturgy that elevates the mind and heart to the Lord Whom we worship in the Sacrifice of the Holy Mass.

It is our desire to promote sacred music that points to the transcendentals of truth, beauty and goodness. It is our unanimous agreement that the use of guitars and drums do not lend themselves to this in the Sacred Liturgy and act more as a distraction.

"Contemporary compositions often use a diversity of musical forms that have a certain dignity of their own. To the extent that they are helpful to the prayer of the Church they can prove a precious enrichment. Care must be taken, however, to ensure that instruments are suitable for sacred use, that they are fitting for the dignity of the Church and can accompany the singing of the faithful and serve to edify them (*Tra Le Sollecitudini* 14) – Pope St. John Paul II

It is in recognition of these points, and with a desire to offer the Lord the very best in our worship, that we have decided that the use of guitars, drums and any other instruments aside from piano and organ are not be used in the Sacred Liturgy at St. Catherine of Bologna.

ARCHBISHOP SAMPLE ABOUT SACRED MUSIC

Sacred music is an essential element of the Liturgy - electric guitar and drums are "never appropriate" during Mass, says Archbishop Sample of Portland.

Archbishop Alexander King Sample of the Archdiocese of Portland in Oregon penned a pastoral letter, aiming to teach about the "art of celebrating" Mass and sacred music's role therein.

"We should always aim high to offer God the best and the most beautiful music of which we are capable."

Archbishop Sample says sacred music has a dual purpose role in divine worship: "the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful," and has three qualities: "sanctity, beauty and universality."

"Sacred music is an essential element of worship itself. It is an art form which takes its life and purpose from the Sacred Liturgy and is part of its very structure."

Gregorian chant should enjoy a "place of pride" within the Liturgy that will require "great effort and serious catechesis" to make it a prominent part of Mass. He wrote on the importance of the pipe organ, as it is most in harmony with the spirit of the Roman liturgy." Sample said instruments like the electric guitar are "not suitable for accompaniment at Holy Mass," and drum sets are "never appropriate."

Sample hopes his letter will help Catholics with "an authentic renewal of the Sacred Liturgy according to the teaching of the Second Vatican Council and the mind of the Church."
