

## AWAKE, WATCHING, WAITING

There were lines of people anxiously waiting for the doors to open at the Malls and the stores last Friday. They so wanted to be the first inside a store to get that incredible sale. I suppose you could call these bargain hunter Advent people, for they are awake, watching and waiting for something great. Just imagine if we as a Christian community had that same sense of anticipation, excitement, if we were awake and watchful for the coming of God in our lives? But wait! If we are really attentive to the scriptures, we hear that we already have all that we need. We do not need to wait in line for the doors to open to find something else that we need. No, we have it all. This Advent season begins with a reminder that we "have it all." In a moment, in an instant, in our baptism, in our sharing in the life of Christ, we are gifted. As Saint Paul says, "I give thanks to my God on your account for the grace of God bestowed on you in Christ Jesus, so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift. Brothers and sisters we have it all. We have all we need because the grace of God in Christ has been bestowed on us."

But do we really believe this? Do we believe that we are already gifted with God's grace in such a way that we have all we need? Or, do we think that there is something missing, something more, something we don't have? We are promised so much. We are told that God is present and active in our lives. Yet at times we may feel like crying out, like the voice of distress in the Book of Isaiah, wondering if God has left us, abandoned us? It seems like God is nowhere in our world when we see so much suffering in the face of those at war, or in exile, or victims of violence of all

sorts. If God is always faithful, as Paul says, why is it so so difficult to find God? Why does it seem so often that God has hidden his face from us, not only in worldly situations, but in our everyday lives?

Perhaps it is because we don't know where to look. We look outside and forget the gift of God's spirit is within us. In this Advent season we are invited into a profound experience of God's awakening in us. We have what it takes. We call it prayer. It is that attentive listening to God's spirit moving in us.

In this Advent season, there are so many ways to tap into this experience of prayer. Today, we come to Mass and pray together, listening to the Scripture herald the coming of Christ, our Savior. Every Saturday afternoon during Advent there is an invitation to come to the Sacrament of Penance. We have daily Mass in which you are most welcome to join us. At home you may enter into a deeper spirit of prayer by saying the rosary or your own favorite prayers. The question is will you take the time in this Advent season to know how near at hand God is to you? Advent is a precious time of year, enjoy it and use it well!

**SAINT FRANCIS XAVIER**  
**1506 - 1552**  
**Feast Day - December 3**

Francis Xavier (baptized Francisco de Jasso y Azpilicueta) was born in 1506 in Navarero, Spain. Francis left his war-torn home in 1525 for the University of Paris, the young nobleman had great plans for instructing the uneducated, but only in philosophy.

During his time in Paris, Francis became a friend of Ignatius of Loyola. This relationship would change his life. Ignatius had experienced a radical conversion to Christ and had devoted his life to helping others in their spiritual quests. He challenged his friends to yield their lives to Christ, abandon their own plans, and follow the Lord's design for their lives. Although Francis felt drawn to Ignatius's ideals, he was reluctant to make them his own. He resisted Ignatius's magnetic influence for six years because it threatened the comfortable life he wanted as a church-supported scholar.

Yet Francis kept hearing the voice of God in the scripture passage from the Book of Genesis: "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you." That verse gave him a prophetic inkling of the unanticipated direction his life would take. And so, in 1534, Francis Xavier was among the first seven men to decide to formally join Ignatius of Loyola's community. They were the first Jesuits, and Francis was ordained a priest three years later. Francis Xavier became the first missionary priest of the Society of Jesus (the Jesuits). His first journey was to India, when the king of Portugal asked him to minister to the Portuguese who had settled in the Near East.

Not long after Xavier arrived in Goa, however, he began reaching out to the native people with as much zeal as he reached out to the Portuguese merchants and sailors. Traveling up and down the Pearl Fishery Coast, Xavier instructed the people of southern India and Ceylon in the Christian faith, baptizing thousands and building more than 40 churches.

Eventually, Xavier expanded his mission beyond India, traveling throughout Malaysia and Japan before eventually reaching Shangchuan, an island just off the coast of China. Almost everywhere he traveled, Xavier was the first Christian missionary the people had met. At the time of his death in 1552, Francis Xavier had baptized more than 30,000 people. It's said he was responsible for more conversions to Christianity than any one single person since Saint Paul the Apostle.

## GUIDELINES DURING COVID 19 PANDEMIC

Immaculate Conception Parish Mass Schedule is as follows: 4:00 PM Mass on Saturday and the 7:00 AM, 9:00 AM, 11:00 AM and 5:00 PM Masses on Sunday. The Kenyan Catholic Community Mass is at 12:30 PM on Sunday. Daily Mass is now celebrated at 6:30 AM in the upper Church.

Cardinal Seán continues to leave the dispensation from the Sunday Mass obligation in place for the present time. We encourage people in vulnerable populations, especially the elderly, to continue to watch Mass from their homes on Catholic TV.

## GUIDELINES FOR WORSHIPERS AT MASS

- **Parishioners will be allowed to enter 15 minutes prior to each Mass.** We ask that you wait in your cars or line up along the sidewalk on Pleasant Street, keeping social distance of six feet apart.
- **Only one entrance of the Church will be open.** The main entrance on Pleasant Street will be used to enter and exit the Church for Mass.
- The elevator will be available only for those with special needs - a Restart Mass Team member will assist you in the elevator process.
- All members of the congregation need to wear masks, with a few exceptions: Children under the age of two should not wear masks. Parents should judge for children between the ages of two and five whether they should wear a mask.
- **If the Cities of Malden and Medford are designated as Red Zone Communities by the State of Massachusetts , we are required to take the Temperatures of all people as they enter the Church. Anyone with a temperature greater than 100.4 Fahrenheit cannot be admitted. Names and phone numbers of all people attending Mass will also be taken.**
- The priest and others with him in the sanctuary do not need to wear masks in the sanctuary as long as strict social distancing is maintained. They do have to wear masks when assisting with the distribution of Holy Communion.
- There will be no social gatherings either before or after Mass. All parishioners must exit immediately after Mass in a timely manner. The Church will be cleaned before the next Mass begins.
- There will be no processions at the Masses, no entrance procession, no offertory processions. The priest will enter from the sacristy.
- There will be no altar servers.
- The Holy Water fonts will remain empty.
- There will be no public access to the sacristy of the church.
- Hymnals and missalettes have been removed.
- The Congregation is asked not to sing during Mass.

## GUIDELINES FOR WORSHIPERS continued ...

- There will be one lector for each Mass seated in the sanctuary with proper social distancing.
- There will be no passing of the basket for the Offertory Collection. Instead, there will be a basket as you exit church to place your offering.
- There will be no holding of hands for the Our Father.
- There will be no invitation for a sign of peace.



## FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

- The priests only will distribute Holy Communion at all the Masses. There will be a plexiglass shield at each communion station. The communicants and the priest will wear masks. (If needed a COVID trained Eucharistic Minister will also assist.)
- Neither the priest nor the communicants should wear gloves during the distribution of Holy Communion.
- Congregants who are not coming forward to receive Holy Communion or a blessing should still get out of their pews at the beginning, so that no one will have to climb over anyone else.
- The priest will have a table next to him with hand sanitizer.
- The priest will hold the consecrated host over the communicants' outstretched hands and drop the host into their hands without touching their hands.
- Communicants will receive the consecrated host in their hands, step to the side, lower their mask, consume the host, replace their mask, and return to their pew.
- In the case of unintentional contact, the priest will sanitize his own hands immediately.
- There will be no distribution of the Precious Blood.
- **Parishioners may well decide not to receive Holy Communion if they feel the risk is too high, and that decision will be honored and respected.**
- We will return to our pews slowly as directed, keeping 6 feet apart to avoid contact with other people.
- There will be tape on the floor to show where to stand as we approach to receive communion. There also will be tape on the floor to show where to stand to demask and consume the host.
- The Congregation will leave the church exiting row by row directed by the trained volunteers, so as to allow for cleaning the church before the next Mass.


