QUIET TIME LEADS TO PRAYER

Quiet, reflective time is an endangered species in our culture. For many of us, individually and as families, every moment of life is filled with noise and activity, and “down time” is seen as empty rather than rich and full.

The importance of quiet time is something that our culture fails to respect, an overemphasis on competition and social interaction that leads to our lives, especially our children’s lives being over-scheduled. Through our example we teach our children to fear silence and solitude. We are easily distracted from becoming acquainted with the voice of God within.

The person who appreciates and respects their quiet time benefits in many ways. We have a chance to develop our own individuality and sense of self, to follow ones own creative passions, to learn that we are good company, if for oneself, then also for others, to develop our imagination, and to discover deep inner resources for healing and inspiration. Such quiet time is also a very good preparation for prayer.

We can help develop a love for quite time by simply entering into the presence of God. Praying with Him as our true companion on life’s journey. We can help our families to learn how to pray by teaching them the traditional prayers of the Church, by praying with them, by letting them see you pray, and by protecting their times of quiet. Silence is an acquired taste, especially if we’ve been on a steady diet of noise and activity. But once gained, quiet time will feed you and your family for a lifetime. Quiet time can lead us into prayer, and prayer will lead us into a personal relationship with God.

Saint Ignatius taught that when we pray, it should “resemble one friend speaking to another;” we need to recognize that God is approachable in prayer. The notion of speaking to God as a friend has deep roots in the Jewish faith: only a friend could say some of the things said to God in the psalms and get away with it! Similarly, in the great film: *Fiddler on the Roof*, the title character, Tevye, constantly talks to God as

a friend, covering topics that include his horse, his wife, his five daughters, the political climate, his lack of income, and, of course, his faith. And yet the idea of talking to God as a friend is either surprising or foreign to many Catholics, even though Jesus says to us, “I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father”. That’s what intimate friends do: they share intimate thoughts and ideas.

Jesus reinforced this notion about the approachability of God when he taught his disciples to pray by addressing God as “Father.” The term that Jesus used was *Abba*, it is the equivalent of “papa” or “daddy” which is a term of endearment and affection used by children who feel close to their father. As people made in the image and likeness of God, we are called, through discipleship, to intimacy with God and with each other, His children, our brothers and sisters. Allow yourself the gift of quiet time, prayer and an intimate relationship with God.
