

#### HEROES OF THE FAITH Saint Oliver Plunkett, S.J. and the Irish Martyrs. 1537-1681. Unified feast day: June 20

Beginning with Henry VIII and continuing through the reign of Charles II, English Protestants waged active persecution by means of eviction, arrest, kangaroo courts, torture and judicial murder against Irish Catholics simply for the public practice of their faith. Despite temporary relaxations of judicial severity and the occasional enactment of more liberal legislation, state trials leading to unjustifiable executions remained a noxious feature of English-Irish colonialism for nearly two centuries. Holy Mother Church, in recognizing the sufferings of 264 of Her Irish faithful in these years, has beatified and or canonized 22 Irish men and women. The best known of all of them is Saint Oliver Plunkett, S.J., Primate Archbishop of Armagh, beatified by Pope Benedict XV in 1920 and canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1975. His particular feast day is July 1, the day of his death in London.

Oliver Plunkett was well born to the minor Irish landed gentry in 1625. Educated by his cousin, the abbot of St. Mary's in Dublin, Oliver was promised to the priesthood. He was ordained aged 29 in Rome, becoming the spokesman for Irish Catholics as well as a professor of theology. He was appointed Archbishop of Armagh and thus primate of the Church in Ireland in 1669. The following year he was allowed to return to Ireland on the promise of toleration following the restoration of the monarchy a decade earlier. That promise did not last long. The English Parliament, afraid Charles II would bring Roman Catholicism back to England, passed a law prohibiting Roman Catholics from public office. In Ireland, Oliver's Jesuit college was closed and he was forced into hiding. English authorities in Ireland knew where he was but didn't

dare arrest him, so they waited their time. Five years later, anti-Catholics in Parliament and on the King's Privy Council concocted a false tale of a Catholic plot to assassinate the king. Oliver was accused of being part of the plot. Arrested and brought to Dundalk to stand trial the witnesses against him refused to appear so the trial collapsed in farce. His English accusers then sent him to London for a new trial. The first grand jury indictment failed for lack of evidence so a second was convened to convict the archbishop. Oliver was denied counsel. refused time to gather testimony and witnesses in his defense and his challenges of witnesses against him were dismissed with contempt. Oliver Plunkett was duly found guilty of treason for promoting the Roman Catholic faith. Appeals were denied, even one from the French ambassador. The king berated the chief accuser, the Earl of Essex, saying"...his blood be on your head, you could have saved him but would not. I would save him but dare not." Saint Oliver Plunkett was taken to Tyburn where he suffered a traitor's death, becoming the last Roman Catholic priest murdered on Tyburn Tree by the English state.

# A Look at the Christian Initiation Process

In the early Church those who desired to be baptized and become followers of Jesus engaged in a lengthy period of preparation and instructions.

They were called "catechumens" and their process of initiation

- formed them in the ways of discipleship
- incorporated them into the Christian community

- culminated in the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist (Holy Communion)

In recent years, the Catholic Church has reclaimed this process now called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, or RCIA process.

*Initiation is a journey of conversion* that is gradual and suited to individual needs. It is a process rather than an educational program and this process takes place within the community of the faithful, our parish.

# First Period: Inquiry or Pre-Catechumenate

"Come and see!" This is a time to share personal stories, hear the stories of the Catholic faith, ask your questions, be introduced to parish life, and foster initial conversion. We are beginning this journey now, in June. Join US!
