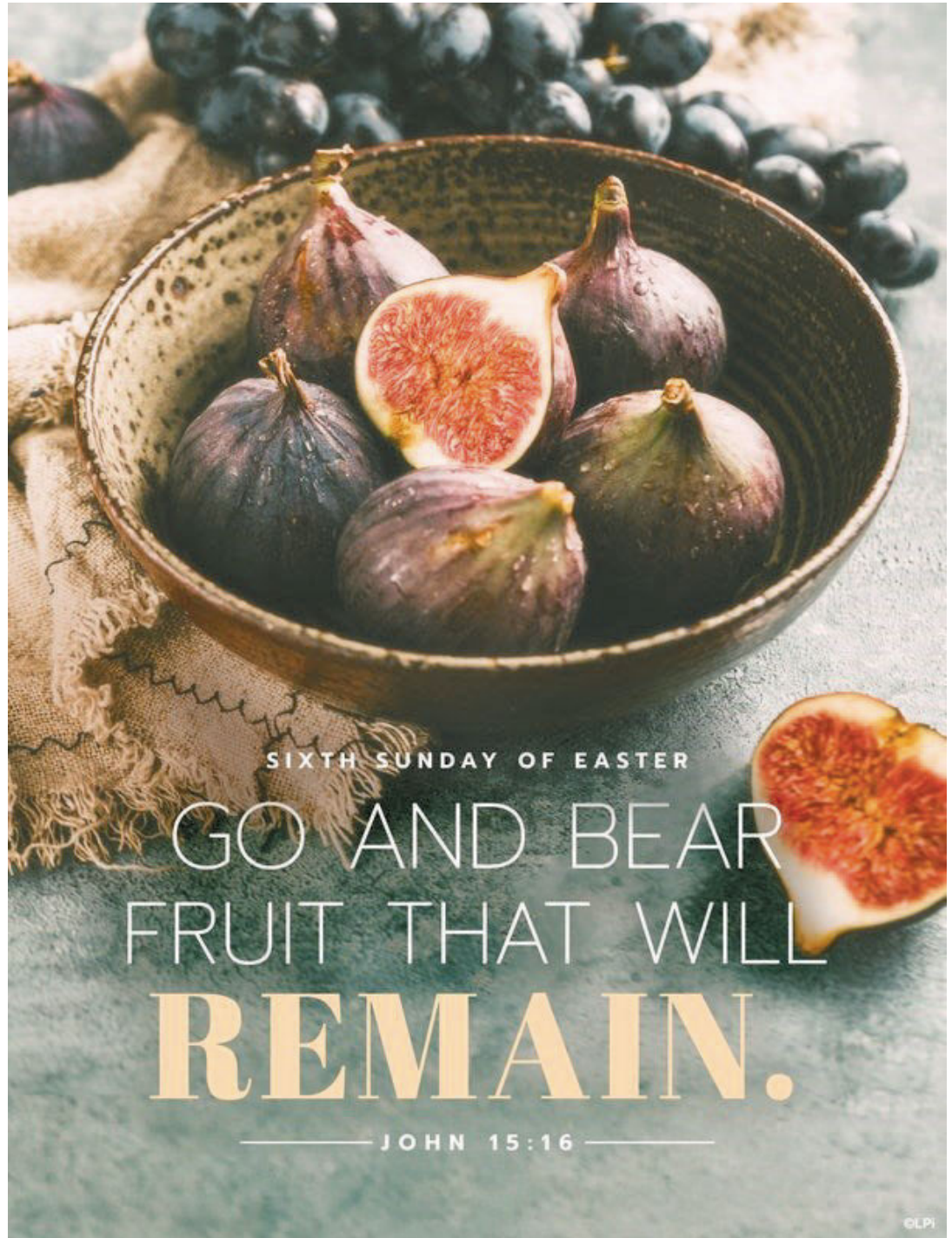

Saint Clare of Assisi (1194-1253). Foundress Abbess of The Poor Clares.



Saint Clare, ca. 1320

Born into great wealth and privilege she rejected it all for a life of extreme poverty among her Sisters. Expected by her social class to accept a marriage arranged to increase her family's fortune she refused her father's command to obey. Ordered by Cardinal Ugolino, her Order's protector and the man who would become Pope Gregory IX, to abandon strict poverty she argued against that decision and when he became the Pope convinced him to change his mind. Her convent attacked by undisciplined soldiers she saved her Sisters by her trust in the Blessed Sacrament. There are few in history who have shown similar personal courage and determination to stay the course their Faith had shown them.

Chiara Offreduccio, our Clare of Assisi, was born into the family of the Counts of Sasso-Rosso. The family was rich and powerful, controlling the towns of Assisi and Spello on Mount Subiaso. Her father, Favorino Sceffi, planned to betroth her when she was 12 to a wealthy man of the town but she persuaded him to postpone his plan until she was 18. Her mother, Ortolana Fiumi, was a devout daughter of the Church who is said to have made several pilgrimages including one to Jerusalem. She later joined Clare in the first convent of the Clares.

Saint Francis of Assisi had been preaching in the towns around Subiaso and Clare had been inspired by his practice of strict poverty and total reliance upon God to provide his needs. It seemed to her that the way to true devotion, the practice of the Faith in all its facets, required complete renunciation of every worldly attachment. Marriage, family life and children, possessions all must be surrendered by a soul whose focus was to be God's will in all things as shown by Holy Mother Church and the example of Her saints.

After Mass on Palm Sunday, 1212 the officiant singled her out by bringing her palm to her hands instead of requiring her to approach the altar rail to receive it like everyone else. That night, in secret but accompanied by an aunt, Clare sought out Saint Francis in his chapel Porziuncula and asked to be received as one of Il Poverello's follower's. Francis clothed her in gray and cut her hair as she asked and sent her for refuge to the Benedictine convent near Bastia. Her father tracked her down and forcibly began dragging her away from the altar where she had fled for safety but when he saw her shaven head he realized she was following the orders of one greater than he and left the convent. A little more than a fortnight later Clare's sister, Agnes, joined her and the two overcame their father's anger and were thereafter left untroubled by family claims. Some time later the third sister, Beatrice, joined them and when the father died her mother also entered the convent.

Clare's group of young women dedicated to extreme poverty and mortification grew as more candidates requested entry and guidance. Saint Francis recognized Clare's vocation to the cloistered life and found for her a place to begin their work in the chapel of San Damiano that he had largely built, himself. Clare's convent grew under Saint Francis' guidance and the brief rule he drew up for her, which included strict poverty and the prohibition of owning any communal property. Her nuns were to live on whatever Francis' monks could bring to them from their rounds. Clare met her second great challenge during Saint Francis' absence on crusade.

Troubled by a women's order so dependent upon charity for its survival the Franciscan Protector, Cardinal Ugolino, argued that such strict poverty was unbecoming a women's order and with Pope Honorius III's approval drew up a new Rule for the Poor Ladies that allowed communally owned property.

Following Honorius's death Ugolino was chosen his successor and as Gregory IX he visited Clare in San Damiano. He urged her to relax the Order's strict poverty but she replied "Holy Father, I crave absolution from my sins but I do not wish to be absolved from the obligation of following Jesus Christ." Her spiritual father, the Pope, recognizing Clare was following the orders of a Higher Power just as earlier her earthly father, Favorino had done, granted her Order an unprecedented Privilege of Poverty in 1228.

Saint Clare of Assisi is often portrayed holding a monstrance. The reason for that attribute lies in the troubled disturbances of her time, when Pope and Holy Roman Emperor engaged in political and spiritual warfare for hegemony in Italy. Each side mustered armies against the other, towns were burned and cities besieged until each was exhausted. Among the battles and skirmishes of great armies little towns and even smaller places like Clare's convent of San Damiano stood little chance of survival. On one occasion in these interminable wars an Imperial army prepared to assault Assisi and in preparation sent a force to attack San Damiano to secure its flank. The story is told that the Imperial troops scaled the walls and entered the convent while the Sisters were sleeping. Clare was awakened by the alarm and although she was not well she had the monstrance brought up from the church and given into her hands. Holding the Blessed Sacrament high above her head she showed herself to the attackers. Awestruck by the sight the invaders fled back over the walls leaving the convent unmolested. Later in the wars, when Assisi was threatened by an even greater Imperial army, Saint Clare led her Sisters in prayer for God's protection whereupon a great storm arose which scattered the army. Assisi declared Saint Clare their Seraphic Mother. She had met a third challenge and seen off two armies just by prayer.

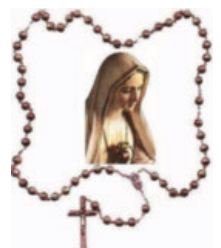
Clare died in 1253 surrounded by people who knew she was a saint. Pope Innocent IV began the canonization process during her funeral Mass. She was canonized just two years later. She is entombed in the Basilica di Santa Chiara in Assisi.

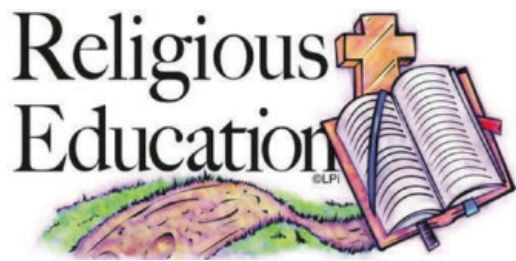
