Mass Schedule Changes Effective July 1st

With the merger of parishes, the Pastoral Planning Committee of the parishes in Southington have examined our Mass attendance from October counts and looked at seating capacity of each church building. Following guidelines from the diocese that Masses should be scheduled one and half hours from the start of one Mass to the beginning of the next (allowing time for transportation), we have come up with a schedule for the new merged parish effective the Weekends of July 2nd and 3rd, 2022. This will be the Mass schedule:



Question: Father, why did you say the Church set the date of Christmas? Isn't it Jesus' birthday?

Answer: Not really. No one bothered to record the actual day on which Jesus was born. The Church was much more interested on the day he resurrected. All other feasts and dates came to be celebrated after that. There is no record in the birth narratives, but some details lead us to believe it was actually spring with the birth of lamb. Celebrating the birth of Jesus at Eastertime would never work. December 25th in Rome was the Feast of the Unconquerable Sun. As daylight had been waning, on this date, it became noticeable that the days were getting longer. Light was returning to the world. The imagery fits perfectly into the image of Christ coming to enlighten the world as Savior.

Constantine first celebrated Christmas on December 25, 336. In the Eastern Church, they preferred to celebrate January 6th. Eventually, the twelve days of Christmas would conclude with Epiphany, the revelation of the Son of God to the world with the Magi on the 6th. That is what I mean by setting the date of Christmas on December 25th.


