Father Joe's Notes

My dear friends,

My college roommate wouldn't eat fish. He wasn't allergic; he hated it. He never tried it, but he was convinced it was horrible. We lived at the shore in Rhode Island where we had access to all sorts of fresh fish. Still, he was convinced he wouldn't like it. Recently, he told me how much he loves sea food. I laughed. Now he lives in Chicago, where the fish has to be imported. When he had complete access to it fresh from the water, it was a no. Funny thing how we can convince ourselves something good is terrible, simply because we say it's so.

Many times we convince ourselves things will be terrible when they're new or outside our comfort zone. We want to keep the old and familiar. We want life to be the way it always was. Why change? Well, because life changes all the time. I can't wear the clothes that no longer fit. I could try, but it would look ridiculous! If I'm injured, I need to adjust my tasks. I shouldn't try running with a broken foot; I could do some serious and permanent damage. Change isn't the end of the world, it just means adapting to new conditions. We all have to do it in life.

I've been hearing, "Father, we've all been talking..." a great deal lately. That's never followed by, and we want you to have a raise! It comes with some litany of things people hate. "You're a tyrant, making us all wear masks." No, I'm just trying to protect the health of the children and the immune compromised, on advice of medical professionals specializing in infectious disease. It isn't political, it's a health thing. It's also trying to show mercy to people who are not able to make certain choices. It's a change to help in a time of illness. That's all.

The most common complaint is about the changes coming to the Mass schedule. "Father, why isn't there a Mass at St. Dominic's?" There is. "Not on Saturday." No, but we have two Masses on Saturday. "Why isn't there a Mass in

English at Immaculate Conception?" There is, on Saturday evening. "Well, that doesn't count. It isn't Sunday!" Trust me, it counts. "Why doesn't Mary Our Queen have a Mass?"

It does. The 4PM vigil Mass is at Mary Our Queen. "We don't go on Saturday!" There are other Masses on Sunday. Many people have convinced themselves it will be terrible and it will never work. That decision has been made before we have even tried it!

Let me explain a few things: Am I happy about all the changes? No. Do we have to make changes? Yes. How did we arrive at this schedule? The pastoral planning committee, with representatives from each of the parishes in town, looked at the data we have. We took the October counts, a head count of people attending all Masses in each church we do every year in the Archdiocese, and looked at the number of people attending at different times. We then looked at the seating capacity for each building. We matched that to the number of people attending at different times. We also needed to make sure every church building was being used, as we need to use each space we have as long as we have them. While also managing to find a time for a Mass in Polish to accommodate that need, we arrived at the schedule you have seen. We developed it this way. Will it work? I don't know. We hope it will, but we can adjust it if needed after a few months. We can't declare definitively how awful it will be before we see how things work. We need to try something, and this will help us meet the needs of changes that have already come and must be addressed. If it works, it works; if not, we will adjust. We won't know until we try.

liturgy corner

Baptism of the Lord Paul Turner

Christmas Time comes to its close when we celebrate the Baptism of the Lord, an event recorded in all four Gospels. To begin his public ministry, Jesus presented himself to be baptized by John the Baptist, and God manifested Jesus as the divine Son.

Because we associate baptism with the forgiveness of sins, the idea that the sinless Jesus would undergo baptism seems out of place. The evangelists must have thought the same; as a whole, they downplay the incident. But the baptism of Jesus had nothing to do with forgiveness; it had everything to do with manifestation. It was a new beginning because it publicly revealed Jesus' identity, and that testimony came not from just any witness but from God.

Three incidents in the Bible are traditionally called the "epiphany" events or the "manifestations" of Jesus, newly arrived on the biblical scene: the visit of the magi, the baptism, and the miracle at the wedding in Cana. Prior to 1969 we heard all three of these Scriptures in successive weeks: Jan. 6, Jan. 13, and on the following Sunday. All three stories form a unit because they progressively reveal the identity, the authority, and the power of Jesus.

In today's calendar the Sunday readings spread over a three-year cycle. On the Baptism of the Lord we hear a different evangelist's account each year. Only in year C, does the following Sunday feature the Gospel of the wedding at Cana to unify the three celebrations.

In the United States we celebrate Epiphany on a Sunday. But in countries where the Epiphany is a holy day of obligation, it is celebrated on Jan. 6. In the United States, the Baptism of the Lord is usually the Sunday after the Epiphany, but if Epiphany comes late, falling on Jan. 6 or 7, the Baptism of the Lord goes to the next day, Jan. 7 or 8, a Monday, in order to make room for the weeks of ordinary time.

Mass Schedule Changes Effective July 1st

With the merger of parishes, the Pastoral Planning Committee of the parishes in Southington have examined our Mass attendance from October counts and looked at seating capacity of each church building. Following guidelines from the diocese that Masses should be scheduled one and half hours from the start of one Mass to the beginning of the next (allowing time for transportation), we have come up with a schedule for the new merged parish effective the Weekends of July 2nd and 3rd, 2022. This will be the Mass schedule:

Question: Father, can a candidate in RCIA receive the Anointing of the Sick?

Answer: What a great question! Normally, the sacraments are reserved to members of the Catholic Church, both Roman and Eastern Rite Churches, but exceptions can be made. The Code of Canon Law allows for licit administration of sacraments to non-Catholics, especially if they have no access to their own church (#844). It also has provision for baptized Christians of other denominations receiving the sacrament of Reconciliation prior to their reception into the Catholic Church at the Easter Vigil. Since both Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick are sacraments of healing, and since we are allowed to anoint baptized non-Catholics in danger of death who have no access to their church's rites, and since the candidate has united him or herself to the Catholic Church and shows proper disposition to receive the Sacraments, we can offer a candidate Anointing of the Sick. It would be a different matter entirely for a catechumen. If that person were in danger of death, we would have to confer baptism.


