Sacraments:

Baptism: Arrangements must be made in advance. Please call the Parish Office to arrange a date and supply pertinent information. Individual Baptismal preparation is required.

Sponsors: must receive from their respective Catholic pastors a "sponsor certificate," which is the signed word of one priest to another that the proposed godparent is a Confirmed, fully-practicing Catholic who is qualified to be a godparent by living in harmony with our faith.

Reconciliation: at St. Francis of Assisi on Saturdays from 3:30-3:50PM and at St. Dominic's on Sunday from 9:00AM to 9:15AM. You can also call the office and make an appointment or see the Priest after morning Mass.

First Eucharist & Confirmation: Preparation – two years prior to receiving each Sacrament is mandatory as a registered student in the Faith Formation Program.

Matrimony: Couples are asked to consult with our priest at least six months in advance of the intended date to allow time for marriage preparation, including the Diocesan Program.

Ministry to the Sick: Please notify us if someone you know is homebound and would like to be added to our Communion call list, or would like to receive the Sacrament of the Sick.

Low gluten hosts available: Please let us know before Mass if you have a need to receive this type of host.

The Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The first reading is one of the most tender and personal moments in all of Scripture: "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I dedicated you, a prophet to the nations I appointed you." Our Lord is deeply personal, and this tender attention moves directly into the second reading.

The section of Paul's first letter to the Corinthians sums up most of our faith. It does so in a poetic way, and it's no surprise that this reading is often chosen by couples for a wedding liturgy. Paul states over and over, in a myriad of beautiful images, that you can be the most successful person alive, but it means nothing if it isn't done with love.

We get a nice list today of the things that love is not. "It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude, it does not seek its own interests, it is not quick-tempered, it does not brood over injury, it does not rejoice over wrongdoing but rejoices with the truth." Sit with this list awhile and think over your day.

ORDINARY AND "not-so-ordinary" TIME IN THE CHURCH

As I sit at my desk in the Swansea complex where I live surrounded by the "ordinary" and the "not-so-ordinary," I wonder what was in the minds of liturgists who decided to call that gap between the Epiphany and Ash Wednesday, Ordinary Time. I've discussed this with a few parishioners who also had been wondering about Ordinary Time. Is it a time to just "cool our heels" while waiting for the next big celebration or days of fasting and penance? Not exactly! Here is what the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB), under the guidance of the Holy Spirit have written:

"[while] Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the Incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, the Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ.

Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe."

"...a time for growth and maturation," OK, how do we do that? By starting with very ordinary things for example, babysitting your grandchildren, removing snow from an elderly neighbor's car, cooking a meal, sharing the home-baked cookies with shut-ins, washing the dishes, or, if you are fortunate, loading the dishwasher, doing the laundry. Oh, my, what ordinary tasks they are! We do many of them every day; they are quite ordinary. But don't be fooled because underlying many of those ordinary tasks you could name better than I, are gems of the "not-so-ordinary" or extraordinary. Opportunities for growth and maturation surely are evident here, drawing us to reflect on the "ordinary."

But getting back to the Ordinary Season – can the common or ordinary things and events in our lives numb us to the underlying reality? For instance, under the appearance of common or ordinary bread and wine dwells the mystery of the Eucharist, the body and blood of Christ. C.S. Lewis, --"the most reluctant convert in all of England" states it well in his book, *A Grief Observed:* "Tomorrow morning a priest will give me a little round, thin, cold, tasteless wafer. Is it a disadvantage – Is it not in some way an advantage --- that it can't pretend the least resemblance to that with which it unites me?"

And so, a blessed Ordinary Time (with Lent soon to follow). May it reveal to you all the glories and treasures it holds within.
