



Reflexiones del Parroco

The 'Mountaintop Experience' of Lent

Think of a "mountaintop experience" you've had. What was the peak moment of that? What generated it? What did it mean for you? Did it change your life forever or was it just a momentary high? In Biblical symbolism, a mountain represents getting close to God. Did your mountaintop experience bring you closer to God? It was at the top of Mount Tabor where Jesus revealed the glory of his Godliness to his closest friends. Called a "high mountain" in scripture, Mount Tabor is, in reality, not huge. What was huge is the event that took place there -- and why. Some of the most significant moments in our spiritual lives might not have felt like a mountaintop experience, but indeed they were. The three disciples who witnessed Christ's transfiguration greatly benefited from seeing his glory revealed, because someday they would be commissioned to take over his earthly ministry. The Father told them, "This is my beloved Son; *listen to him.*" As we listen to Jesus, it is *we* who are now transfigured. Lent is meant to be a mountaintop experience for each of us. If we follow Jesus up the mountain, his light will consume any darkness within us. The more we listen to his teachings and apply them to our daily lives and ministries, the more we become like him. And the more we become like Jesus, the more our lives are transfigured by his light, and the more our lives then transfigure the world around us. As the first reading tells us, Abraham did not withhold his son from the Lord, just like God the Father did not withhold his Son from us. Likewise, we are faithful to the responsibilities of Christian living if we do not withhold the Son from the people we encounter. Whether it's through an evangelizing word or a helping hand, or a compassionate and attentive ear, or the generous giving of mercy and forgiveness or money or time, we are Christ's hands and feet and voice in the world today. We are his earthly body. We are the answers to people's prayers. We have been empowered through our baptisms to shine with the glory of Christ's love. We have all been commissioned to continue his earthly ministry. La 'Experiencia Cumbre' de Cuaresma

Piensa en una experiencia "cumbre" que hayas tenido. ¿Cuál fué el momento pico de esa experiencia? ¿Qué lo ocasionó? ¿Qué significó para ti? ¿Cambió tu vida para siempre, o fué solamente una emoción momentánea? En el simbolismo bíblico, una montaña representa un acercamiento a Dios. ¿Te acercó más a Dios tu experiencia cumbre? Fué en la cima del Monte Tabor donde Jesús reveló la gloria de Su Santidad a sus amigos más cercanos. Conocido como una "alta montaña" en la escritura, el Monte Tabor es, en realidad, no muy alto. Lo grande fue el evento que ocurrió allí – y el por qué. Algunos de los momentos más significativos en nuestra vida espiritual pueden no haberse sentido como una experiencia cumbre, pero de hecho lo fueron. Los tres discípulos que fueron testigos de la transfiguración de Cristo se beneficiaron inmensamente al ver Su gloria revelada, porque algún día ellos serían comisionados para asumir Su ministerio en la tierra. El Padre les dijo, "Este es mi Hijo amado; *escúchenlo.*" Escuchando a Jesús, somos *nosotros* quienes somos ahora transfigurados. La Cuaresma debe ser una experiencia cumbre para cada uno de nosotros. Si seguimos a Jesús hacia la montaña, Su luz consumirá cualquier oscuridad dentro de nosotros. Mientras más escuchamos Sus enseñanzas y las aplicamos a nuestra vida diaria y a nuestros ministerios, más nos parecemos a Él. Y mientras más nos parecemos a Jesús, más nuestras vidas son transfiguradas por Su luz, y más nuestras vidas transfiguran al mundo a nuestro alrededor. Tal como nos dice la primera lectura, Abraham no le negó su hijo al Señor, así como Dios Padre no nos negó a Su Hijo a nosotros. De la misma manera, somos fieles a nuestras responsabilidades de la vida Cristiana si no le negamos al Hijo a las personas que encontramos. Ya sea a través de una palabra evangelizadora, o una mano que ayuda, o un oído compasivo o atento, o dadores generosos de misericordia y perdón o dinero o tiempo, somos las manos y los pies de Cristo hoy en el mundo. Somos su cuerpo terrenal. Somos la respuesta a las oraciones de las personas. A través de nuestro bautismo, hemos sido capacitados para brillar con la gloria del amor de Cristo. 
Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture
2nd Sunday of Lent

A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed, “You are absolutely beaming!” The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn’t mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald’s and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat. A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new “digs,” received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you’re really “into it” this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it’s only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God’s call. Then, there is God’s request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen.

Thoughts from the Principal

The Diocese of Wilmington is now accepting tuition assistance applications for the upcoming 2021-2022 school year. Each year through its Vision for the Future Education Trust, the Diocese offers tuition assistance to a number of families who desire a Catholic education for their children but who cannot afford the full cost of tuition. Families with children registered in grades K-12 in an inter-parochial or diocesan parish school who believe they are in need of tuition assistance are encouraged to apply. To be considered, parents must submit an application online to FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment for evaluation at online.factsmgt.com/aid. FACTS representatives are available to guide you through the application process and to answer your questions. For assistance, simply call 1-866-441-4637.

Tuition assistance will be granted to only those families whose children are officially **registered** in an inter-parochial or diocesan parish school. Enrollment must be official before tuition assistance can be offered. In addition to your completed application, you will be required to provide the following information:


1. Copies of your most recent tax forms including all supporting tax schedules
2. Copies of your 2020 W-2 forms for both you and your spouse
3. Copies of supporting documentation for Social Security Income, Welfare, Child Support, Food Stamps, Workers’ Compensation, and TANF
4. Non-refundable payment of the \$35 application fee

Refer to the FACTS Grant & Aid Checklist for a full listing of required documentation. The Diocesan deadline to submit your application and all required documentation is **Thursday, March 4th**. Applications and/or required documentation received after March 4 cannot be considered for tuition assistance through the Diocese. **There are no exceptions to this deadline.** When completing your application be sure to provide accurate contact information – your email address and telephone number – should it become necessary for FACTS to contact you. Also, FACTS has discontinued accepting supporting documentation by way of fax or mail. Therefore, all required documents must be uploaded and sent to FACTS electronically.

Families currently receiving tuition assistance from the Diocese must reapply for 2021- 2022 consideration. Assistance is not automatically renewed from year to year. Upon the completion of FACTS evaluation of all applicants, awards will be made based on each family’s financial need and the amount of money available for distribution from the Diocese’s Education Trust.

All applicants will be notified accordingly by the Diocesan Development Office by early May 2021. Please understand that applying for tuition assistance does not guarantee that an award will be made. Diocesan funds are limited and therefore assistance is provided to the neediest of applicants.
