



## Reflecciones del Parroco

### Supernatural Faith

The final paragraph of this Sunday's Gospel reading is very revealing: Jesus did not “trust” himself to the converts whose faith in him was based on the signs and wonders that he had done. The reason: He did not want anyone to testify (i.e., spread the faith) about the limitations of human nature. Faith based on signs and wonders is human nature: It's easier to put faith in what we can humanly see, touch, and hear than to believe in a God who is invisible and who usually sounds very silent. There is nothing supernatural about this kind of faith, but God is very supernatural. What happens to our faith when we pray and pray and pray for God's intervention and there are no signs indicating that we'll get what we want? Our reaction to unanswered prayers is an indicator of how natural or supernatural our spiritual life really is. Jesus knew that his physical presence was the greatest sign of all, but it would soon be taken away. Don't we sometimes wish that Jesus would appear in front of us and make himself audible to our human ears? We think it would make our faith stronger. Typically, we base our faith on many signs: prayers being answered, love being evidenced, peace and happiness filling our hearts, etc. But what happens to our faith when we enter the dark night of trials and difficulties? Do we continue to trust God when we can no longer see or feel signs that he cares? The kind of faith we need when faith matters most comes from a relationship of trust. Real trust. We choose to trust God for who he really is and how much he really cares, rather than on what the evidence seems to say. To succeed in this, we need supernatural faith. When we're united to the divinity of Christ, we join ourselves to his faith. We then trust him so much that we don't need signs. Remember this the next time you receive Jesus in the Eucharist. Not only are you consuming his body, you are also uniting yourself to his divinity. And he is uniting himself to you! If you truly believe this, of course there will be miracles, but that is not the greatest gift that he's sharing with you. ### Fe Sobrenatural

El último párrafo de la lectura del Evangelio de este Domingo es muy revelador: Jesús no “confiaba” mucho en los conversos cuya fe en Él se basaba en los signos y prodigios que Él había hecho. La razón: él no quería que nadie diera testimonio (es decir, tuviera fe) por las limitaciones de la naturaleza humana. La fe basada en señales y prodigios es naturaleza humana: es más fácil poner la fe en lo que podemos humanamente ver, tocar, y oír, que creer en un Dios que es invisible y que normalmente es bastante silencioso. No hay nada sobrenatural sobre esta clase de fe, pero Dios es muy sobrenatural. ¿Qué le pasa a nuestra fe cuando oramos, y oramos, y oramos para que Dios intervenga y no hay señales que indiquen que obtendremos lo que queremos? Nuestra reacción a las oraciones sin respuesta es un indicador de cuán natural o sobrenatural es realmente nuestra vida espiritual. Jesús sabía que su presencia física era la mayor señal de todas, pero pronto sería arrebatada. ¿No deseamos a veces que Jesús se aparezca frente a nosotros y pudiésemos oírlo con nuestros oídos humanos? Pensamos que eso fortalecería nuestra fe. Típico, basamos nuestra fe en muchas señales: oraciones contestadas, amor que es evidente, paz y felicidad que llena nuestros corazones, etc. Pero ¿qué le pasa a nuestra fe cuando entramos a la noche oscura de las pruebas y las dificultades? ¿Continuamos confiando en Dios cuando ya no vemos o sentimos las señales de Su amor? La clase de fe que necesitamos cuando la fe es lo que más importa, viene de una relación de confianza. De verdadera confianza. Escogemos confiar en Dios por quien Él realmente es y por su gran amor, en vez de hacerlo por lo que la evidencia parece afirmar. Para triunfar en esto, necesitamos una fe sobrenatural. Cuando estamos unidos a la divinidad de Cristo, nos unimos a Su fe. Confiamos entonces tanto en Él, que no necesitamos señales. Recuerda esto la próxima vez que recibas a Jesús en la Eucaristía. No solamente estás consumiendo Su cuerpo, sino que también te estás uniendo a Su divinidad. ¡Y Él se está uniendo a tí! Si verdaderamente crees esto, por supuesto que habrá milagros, pero no será el regalo más grande que Él está compartiendo contigo. # Serving in Love...

## Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture  
3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent

Many prefer a “create as you go” approach to life where laws and protocols primarily exist to secure and protect liberties rather than dictate and outline proper and right behavior. There are no real benchmarks for acceptable ethical and moral behavior, with a “you can’t tell me what to do” attitude prevailing. Parents are even limited in what they can request of their children, and dealing with threatening behaviors, especially from adults, are a challenge as well. Acceptable and expected conduct seems to amount to safeguarding each other’s space rather than increasing awareness of necessary relationships that require a more refined and higher response.

We have lost our axis to the world of “anything goes” and no longer see the Ten Commandments as practical and wise guideposts to effective living. We live on “relativism island” where only a possible suggestion to “love and do not harm” may be the only standard able to be preached. While Jesus most certainly emphasized love above anything else, it was never about warm fuzzy feelings or halfhearted humanitarian efforts. The love of which Jesus spoke establishes an intimate connection with God, neighbor, self, and creation. Because this love, who is God Himself, is at the foundational core of our lives, it demands actions and attitudes that serve to build up, increase, and free up those relationships. Love requires proper conduct. Preserving and enhancing these love centered relationships is at the heart of the Ten Commandments (and the Beatitudes) and the reason for Jesus’ display of anger in the temple.

The Ten Commandments can save the world from turmoil and conflict by instilling basic moral and relational principles within us. They also hold a healthy sense of sin in balance and always remind us of our relationship with God and the freedom God offers. Our faith preserves these jewels of truth that we often look beyond, dismiss altogether, or seek to remove from public view. Human beings can be so arrogant at times. Our Lenten journey, especially when embarked upon with sincerity and resolve, can restore all of our essential relationships. When we get absorbed in life’s preoccupations and demands, things can quickly get distorted and we can find ourselves way off track. In short, we find ourselves in sin. Humanity is losing a sense of both grace and sin. We need both to understand what is real and true. Until we do, the oppressive systems and ideologies that hurt so many will never change. We will never change. We are grateful for those courageous souls who willingly embrace the conversion and hard work Lent demands and stand against antiquated systems and ideologies. They give us hope that all is not lost. ©LPi

### Tuition Assistance

Don’t let financial concerns keep you from sending your children to St. Francis de Sales for a Catholic education. Each year several of our students are awarded support from BOOST.

The Broadening Options and Opportunities for Students Today (BOOST) Program provides scholarships for some students who are eligible for the free or reduced-price lunch program to attend eligible nonpublic schools in the State of Maryland. Awards are granted based on household income, with the lowest income served first. Families with students in kindergarten through eighth grade are eligible.

The BOOST program and its funding are governed by the annual budget bill. Scholarship awards are dependent on available funding. Senate Bill 190, the fiscal year 2022 Budget Bill, which governs the 2021-2022 program year, is currently being considered by the Maryland General Assembly.


### Use of 529 College Savings Accounts for K-12 tuition

The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, which was signed into law in December 2017, allows families to use 529 plans to pay for up to \$10,000 in tuition expenses at elementary or secondary public, private or parochial schools. The changes became effective January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018.

529 plans offer tax-free earnings growth and tax-free withdrawals when the funds are used to pay for qualified expenses. Prior to the Act, the definition of qualified expenses was limited to costs associated with attendance or enrollment at a college, university or other accredited post-secondary institution. Today, families can also take tax-free withdrawals to pay for up to \$10,000 of K-12 tuition. Maximum deductions and credits vary by state. Maryland does allow for qualified distributions to be tax exempt.



## Everyday Stewardship

Recognize God in Your Everyday Moments  
Parents Just Don't Understand

Anybody remember the old rap song by the Fresh Prince, aka Will Smith, "Parents Just Don't Understand?" As we grow up, it is sometimes a struggle for us to imagine that our parents understand us. It can seem impossible that Mom and Dad remember the stress of exam week or peer pressure. We never saw them as children; we never saw their disappointed faces when they weren't invited to a party, or their dashed hopes at a bad test grade. We never saw them homesick their first week of college or nervous to ask their crush to Homecoming.

We're often the same way about God. We gripe about what He asks of us. "He doesn't understand sin — He's all-good," we think. "He doesn't understand temptation — He is perfect."

In Scripture, God can be very much a father, telling us what we can and cannot do. And yet, in His divine genius, He is sometimes simply a man at a well, asking for a drink.

For me, it turns out I didn't need to tell my parents anything about what I was going through as a kid — they knew already. What I needed was for them to tell me what to do, and how to do it.

Similarly, we don't need to tell God about human nature. We need God to tell us about His nature. He's good enough to ask us for a drink, to enter into our humanity. But we have to remember, for our own sakes, to have the humility to ask Him for something, too — the water that will quench our eternal thirst.
