

## Pastor's Ponderings

## Reflecciones del Parroco

### Seeing a Miracle at Every Mass

‘My Lord and my God!’ This exclamation of Thomas in this Sunday’s Gospel reading used to be our exclamation at the raising of the Eucharist during Mass. It would be good to renew this habit. It’s an awe-filled, humble recognition of Christ’s Lordship and of the reality of his presence in the form of bread and wine. Saint John Paul II wrote in his encyclical on the Holy Eucharist, *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*: “To contemplate Christ involves being able to recognize him wherever he manifests himself, in his many forms of presence, but above all in the living sacrament of his body and his blood.” Notice how Jesus convinced the disciples that he had truly come back to life in the flesh. At first, they thought he was a ghost, or they didn’t know what to think. They found the miracle of the resurrection too incredible to grasp. Jesus opened their minds to the truth of the miracle by showing his wounds. He does the same for you and me in every Mass. Through the use of our logic and our senses, it’s difficult to grasp the truth that the bread and wine miraculously become the actual body and blood of Christ -- the same broken and bleeding body that died on the cross 2000+ years ago. It’s even harder to see and understand that the resurrected Jesus is also there! During Mass, we enter the timelessness of eternity to benefit from the living Christ. When we realize that we personally need the sacrifice he made on Good Friday, because we’ve sinned, we begin to look at his wounds from a crucial perspective. It is then that we begin to understand the truth about the Eucharist. The first step toward believing in the miracle of the Eucharist is to want Christ’s death to save us from our sins and to want his resurrection to take us to heaven. The final step occurs when our desire to unite to Jesus is so thorough that we yearn for him to consume our lives with his presence. We want the divine Jesus to come to us in the flesh, in whatever manner he chooses, to transform us into his likeness. It is this desire that makes us exclaim whenever we see the Eucharist, “My Lord and my God!”

Jesus told St. Faustina, “Mankind will not have peace until it turns with trust to My mercy.”

### Viendo un Milagro en Cada Misa

“¡Mi Señor y mi Dios!” Esta exclamación de Tomás en la lectura del Evangelio de este domingo solía ser nuestra exclamación al elevar la Eucaristía durante la Misa. Sería bueno renovar este hábito. Es un reconocimiento humilde y lleno de asombro, del Señorío de Cristo y de la realidad de su presencia en la forma de pan y vino. San Juan Pablo II escribió en su encíclica sobre la Santa Eucaristía, *Ecclesia de Eucharistia (La Iglesia Vive de la Eucaristía)*: “Contemplar a Cristo implica ser capaz de reconocerlo dondequiera que él se manifieste, en sus diversas formas de presencia, pero sobre todo en el Sacramento viviente de su Cuerpo y su Sangre”. Observa cómo Jesús convenció a los discípulos que verdaderamente había regresado a la vida en la carne. Al principio, pensaron que era un fantasma o no sabían qué pensar. Encontraron demasiado difícil de entender el milagro de la resurrección. Jesús abrió sus mentes a la verdad del milagro mostrando sus heridas. Él hace lo mismo para ti y para mí en cada Misa. Mediante el uso de nuestra lógica y nuestros sentidos, es difícil de captar la verdad de que el pan y el vino se convierten milagrosamente en el verdadero Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo -- el mismo cuerpo roto y sangrante que murió en la Cruz hace más de 2000 años. ¡Es incluso más difícil de ver y comprender que el Jesús resucitado está también allí! Durante la misa, nos adentramos en la atemporalidad de la eternidad para beneficiarnos del Cristo viviente. Cuando nos damos cuenta que personalmente necesitamos el sacrificio que hizo el Viernes Santo, porque hemos pecado, empezamos a ver sus heridas desde una perspectiva crucial. Es entonces que comenzamos a entender la verdad sobre la Eucaristía. El primer paso para creer en el milagro de la Eucaristía es querer que la muerte de Cristo nos salve de nuestros pecados y querer que su resurrección nos lleve al cielo. El último paso se produce cuando nuestro deseo de unirnos a Jesús es tan profundo que anhelamos que consuma nuestras vidas con su presencia. Queremos que el divino Jesús venga a nosotros en la carne, de cualquier manera, que él decida, para transformarnos a su semejanza. ## Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture  
2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

What a wonderful joy fills us today as we ponder the inexhaustible mercy of God. "Mercy is the heart of God," Pope Francis tells us. The image of a heart has been used to point to the very life source of a person as it is the organ that allows life to flow through our veins and sustain us. Mercy is the heart of God. Imagine this dynamic, powerful, compassionate, piercing, embracing, loving, propelling, penetrating, absorbing, and enveloping, transforming presence of God flowing into the very depth of our souls. It is God's mercy that allows blood to flow through our veins. It is God's mercy that forms every atom of our being and leads us to what is true. God's mercy reveals all superficiality and falsehood, and lays bare all distortions, empty promises, weakness, and sin.

"Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope," Pope Francis continues. God's all forgiving, compassionate love is with us. When we finally believe and accept that Christ's resurrected transfigured presence resides with us, we then find within us a strong confidence to accept life's imperfections and disappointments and move on. Every day is a new adventure in new life. God leaves the past behind and opens doors to the future. It doesn't matter how many mistakes we made yesterday. All that matters is what we do tomorrow and what we learn along the way. It is so easy to remain tethered and mired in the past, but there is no need to do so. God is all about tomorrow and the work God has yet to do in our lives.

Mercy gives birth to hope. Hope for the greatest of sinners and hope for the worst of disasters. There is nothing God cannot do and nothing God cannot fashion. After all, everything we know and treasure was once nothing, and look what God did with the nothing God had! The resurrected Christ stands before us with nail marks in his wrists and wounds on his body as a testament that not even injustice, suffering and death can trample over and destroy God's mercy. What have we to fear? Why do we keep ourselves from peace? Our lack of faith prevents us from going forward and fully receiving the holiness God desires to breathe upon us. ## Thoughts from the Principal

While COVID has certainly presented us with challenges this year, St. Francis de Sales Catholic School has risen above and is stronger than ever. Enrollment for this year is 217 students and we have more than this number enrolled for the 2021-2022 school year. This is the largest student body in more than ten years. Many grade levels are already full and we have begun waiting lists from which we will add students to classes providing the COVID restrictions are less stringent in the fall.


The faculty, staff, students and families have worked together diligently to follow health and sanitization procedures set forth in our reopening "Forward in Faith" plan. This disciplined approach led to having only five confirmed student cases and three confirmed faculty cases of COVID. All of these cases were a result of contact outside our school day. We continue to follow the guidance from the Wicomico County Health Department who have been very professional and supportive.

Fundraising had to necessarily look quite different this year since we could not gather in large groups or have parents inside the building. The Home and School Association creatively sponsored a carryout Bull and Shrimp Dinner as well as a Holiday wreath sale. They are holding a Golf Tournament on April 17<sup>th</sup> at Nutters Crossing. Please support this event in any way that you can. 
Some of the funds raised this year will be used toward a major playground improvement project. This will be completed before the 2021-2022 school year begins. Additionally, they have committed \$75,000 to the much needed new HVAC system in the 70 year-old section of the building.

The school board has been having a successful Annual Fund campaign so far which kicked off with a formal request letter in November. This fund is supported by 100% of the faculty, staff and school board members. Many alumni and parishioners donated to this fund this year for which we are truly grateful. We are approaching our goal of \$45,000.

I personally want to thank this community for the love and support we continue to receive in order to spread the Gospel message to families. In turn we know from experience that our graduates serve the community as adults.
