





Reflecciones del Parroco

The Redemptive Power of Christ

Now that we're a renewed people -- an Easter people -- the scriptures at Mass remind us of the stark difference between living a redeemed life and living in sin. The first reading for this Sunday says: "Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away." The second reading says: "Those who say, 'I know him', but do not keep his commandments are liars, and the truth is not in them." And the Gospel reading says: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name..." We are all liars in some way every day, professing our faith with our lips but not always in our behaviors. Our actions often say that we don't truly believe what we say about Christ's love. Our worries might be saying that we don't truly believe that God cares about each and every situation. Our decisions say that we don't truly believe that Jesus knew what he was talking about when he commanded us to love our enemies and do good to those who hurt us. Our moral relativism says that we don't truly believe he was smarter than us when he gave us his commandments. How loudly do your actions preach the truth about Jesus? Many of us undervalue what Jesus has done for us, thinking that his death and resurrection is enough to get us into heaven; we neglect the need to humble ourselves under the reality of the need for daily redemption. God's not expecting perfection from us on this side of heaven's gate. What he does want, however, is our desire to become more and more like Christ every day. As long as we're continually examining our lives and educating ourselves about how we can improve, and as long as we follow through by doing what is necessary to produce changes, God is very pleased with us. © 2018 Terry Modica, Catholic Digital Resources, www.catholicdr.com. At last, the Lady tells Bernadette her name: "I am the Immaculate Conception." Bernadette: The Princess of Lourdes, is the exciting true story of a visit by the Queen of Heaven that left the entire world a source of health for body and soul.

Nuestras decisiones dicen que realmente no creemos que Jesús sabía de lo que estaba hablando cuando nos mandó a amar a nuestros enemigos y a hacer el bien a aquellos que nos hacen daño. Nuestro relativismo moral dice que realmente no creemos que Él era más inteligente que nosotros cuando nos dio sus mandamientos. ¿Qué tan fuerte predicen tus acciones la verdad acerca de Jesús? Muchos de nosotros menospreciamos lo que Jesús ha hecho por nosotros, pensando que su muerte y resurrección es suficiente para llevarnos al cielo; descuidamos la necesidad de humillarnos bajo la realidad de la necesidad de redención diaria. Dios no está esperando nuestra perfección en este lado de la puerta del cielo. Sin embargo, lo que sí quiere, es nuestro deseo de ser más como Cristo cada día. Gospel Meditation

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture
3rd Sunday of Easter

We often act out of ignorance. Armed with the best of intentions, we think we are seeing clearly and correctly, but we are not. We don't always understand the full meaning of things and only perceive part of the truth. Hence, our judgments and actions can be impaired by myopic, incomplete or erroneous perceptions. The meaning of life, understanding of human experience, and negotiating life's challenges can all become skewed without proper understanding and vision. The resurrection of Christ is the corrective to our incomplete and limited view of life. Looking at things with the eyes of faith brings a depth of clarity and understanding to how we see God, ourselves, others, and the world.

Even the disciples struggled with their limited understanding and ignorant perceptions. It was only when Jesus opened their minds to understand the Scriptures that their eyes were opened. It was their "aha" moment when everything clicked. We all want the substance of our lives to come together, make sense, and have meaning. This is easier to achieve when things are going positively, and life is good. It is when suffering, disappointment, death, hardship, and injustice enter the picture that things can become unsettled and disoriented. Our faith in the goodness and love of God is tested. We tend to shift our focus on these difficult and challenging moments and do not see them within the greater picture of how God intends life to unfold. We can gain, from the passion and resurrection of Christ, the clear vision we need in order to move away from ignorance to enlightenment.

We need our "aha" moment when everything comes together and clicks. It can come in a fleeting instant when we feel totally connected with God, where we find ourselves, others and all of creation. It is a moment when all is right and good, regardless of how difficult our journey. Our "aha" moment assures us that God is here, right with us, in us and around us bringing us a gift and blessing we can receive nowhere else: peace. In those brief sacramental encounters when we are lifted up out of ourselves and centered, we can hear God say, "peace be with you," and we feel secure. It's all okay. The resurrected Christ has the power to bring this gift to us. Some people, as they are facing their deaths, remark about this peace. When looking into the window of eternity, they experience a depth of joy and are amazed at God's goodness and closeness. We are called to be witnesses to this Good News. ©LPi



Thoughts from the Principal

One of the joys of being principal is the opportunity to perform teacher observations. The Diocese of Wilmington requires teachers to be observed several times per year in both informal and formal formats. The purpose is to offer teachers feedback. They are given validation of their methods as well as suggestions for improvement. Information from these in classroom observations and outside the classroom observations are combined in the end of year teacher evaluations.

We have a blend of experienced and new teachers that make for a strong academic program. Mentor teachers observe and meet with younger teachers to provide support in their growth. This mentoring program is in turn guided by the Diocese and approved by the Superintendent. Each teacher participates in this Diocesan mentoring program for 3-4 years. New teachers also take part in an Initial Faith Formation program for one year as catechesis.

I feel honored and humbled to see our educators at work. Recently, I saw the eighth grade class participate in a Socratic Seminar. This involved students researching a topic for homework and then using this method to discuss the topic in class. The question they debated was whether or not society should work to save endangered species. Our middle school science teacher, Miss Kirchner, skillfully maneuvered students in this debate. Students were articulate in their chosen positions and had to follow strict rules of engagement to debate. Students had peers as coaches who gave support and suggestions throughout the discussion. What a great skill for future leaders in our society!

In Miss Lowe's classroom, second graders followed scientific design and build method to create something that would float. They had to make a hypothesis and then design and create their "boats". Then, they built the boat and tested it. If it didn't float they had to re-evaluate their design and try again.


Fourth grade wrote their own versions of a story they read together. This involved making a display which hung in the hallway for all classes to read. Students were very excited to share their hard work with the whole school. Many use their favorite super hero as the character of their own project.

In Mrs. Hall's prek4 classroom, four year olds were transformed into paleontologists. These tiny students could name various dinosaurs and could understand what a fossil is. Part of this lesson included "digging" for fossils in dirt and ice. The enthusiasm for this lesson was seen in both the students and the teacher.

The seventh grade class recited the *Gettysburg Address* for me in social studies class with Mrs. Gutierrez. The 5th graders recited part of the poem *The Midnight Ride of Paul Revere*.

The hallways and classrooms are covered with exemplary student work such as first grader's penguin projects. This is one of the many frustrations of our regulations due to COVID for me is that visitors don't get to see the hard work of teachers and students in person. As the leader of this school, I am proud to share with you just a few of the amazing examples of the learning environment I see each day.
