



## Reflecciones del Parroco

### Moving forward with the Holy Spirit

Sometimes we find ourselves in the same posture as the disciples in today's first reading, looking up at the sky where we last saw Jesus, not moving, just staring at nothing, waiting for him to come back and do something to rescue this world from its evil. It seems like he's not finished. There's more he should be doing. Our world needs the Second Coming of Christ -- and now! What's the delay? Ahhh, but he's told us not to stand about gawking and waiting but to go forth and spread the Good News. He told us to take what he's given us and use it to serve others, to make a difference somewhere, somehow, to someone. Why do we stare at the empty sky? Because we feel inadequate. Parents know this feeling. After giving birth or adopting a child in an amazing partnership with God the Giver of Life, we have the awesome task of raising this tiny human into a faith-filled, emotionally healthy adult. Wow. More than a few miracles will be needed. Graduates know this feeling. After completing college or a Lay Ministry training program or ordination or final vows, we stand on the threshold of working for the Lord and wonder: Will I be effective and successful? Will I like it? Or will I be sent where I'd rather not go? Those who are grieving know this feeling. After a loved one is taken home to the Lord or a friend is lost in a failed relationship, our lives change drastically. It feels like it shouldn't have. How can we recover from the emptiness, which by its very nature forces our attention onto ourselves and our unmet needs, so that we become full of service to others? Every change in our lives is a commissioning. Every loss is the beginning of a new calling. Every experience is training for a work of God's kingdom that the Lord wants to accomplish through us. Why are you standing there looking at the sky? Jesus has been your teacher and your guide: Although you cannot see what he's doing now, he has not abandoned you. He is fulfilling his promise: "You will receive power from the Holy Spirit, and you will be my witness throughout the earth." Indeed, you were given that Holy Spirit in baptism, and it is this Spirit of God that empowers you to continue the ministry of Jesus using your particular gifts and talents and experiences. We must confidently raise our foot to step forward and, while it's still in mid-air, ask: "Okay God, where do You want me to place this foot down next?" #### Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord (Year B)

This Sunday we are presented with a Gospel reading that should deeply challenge us. These are readings that remind us of who we really are—disciples of Jesus Christ. We are not only his friends, called to stay near to him, but we are also his missionaries, called to go out and to spread his Good News.

### Hacia Adelante con el Espíritu Santo

Pareciera que no ha terminado. Hay más cosas que Él debería estar haciendo. Nuestro mundo necesita la Segunda Venida de Cristo -- ¡y ahora! ¿Cuál es la demora? Ahhh, pero Él nos dijo que no deberíamos quedarnos por ahí, mirando tontamente y esperando, sino que fuéramos y propagáramos la Buena Noticia. Nos dijo que lleváramos lo que Él nos había dado y lo usáramos para servir a los demás, para hacer una diferencia donde fuera, como fuera y a quien fuera. ¿Por qué nos quedamos mirando fijamente al cielo vacío? Porque nos sentimos incapaces. Los padres conocen este sentimiento. Después de dar a luz o de adoptar a un niño en una paternidad asombrosa con Dios el Dador de Vida, tenemos la sorprendente tarea de transformar a este pequeño ser humano en un adulto lleno de fe y emocionalmente saludable. Guau. Será necesario más de un milagro. Los graduados conocen este sentimiento. Después de completar la universidad o un programa de entrenamiento para un Ministerio Laico, o los votos finales o de ordenación, nos paramos en el umbral para trabajar por el Señor y nos preguntamos: ¿seré efectivo y exitoso? ¿Me gustará? O ¿seré enviado donde no me guste? Aquellos que están sufriendo conocen este sentimiento. Luego que un ser querido es llevado al hogar con el Señor o que un amigo se pierde en una relación fallida, nuestras vidas cambian drásticamente. Sentimos que no debería haber sucedido. ¿Cómo podemos recuperarnos del vacío, lo que por su naturaleza, fuerza nuestra atención hacia nosotros mismos o hacia nuestras necesidades insatisfechas, de manera que nos transformemos en un servicio para los demás? Cada cambio en nuestras vidas es un envío. Cada pérdida es el comienzo de un nuevo llamado. Cada experiencia es un entrenamiento para trabajar para el reino de Dios, que el Señor desea lograr a través nuestro. ¿Por qué estás allí parado mirando al cielo? Jesús ha sido tu maestro y tu guía: aunque no puedas ver lo que está haciendo ahora, no te ha abandonado. Él está cumpliendo su promesa: "Recibirán el poder del Espíritu Santo, y serán mis testigos en toda la tierra." Realmente, se te ha dado el Espíritu Santo en el bautismo y es este Espíritu de Dios el que te capacita para continuar el ministerio de Jesús, usando tus dones y talentos y experiencias particulares. Con confianza, debemos levantar nuestro pie para caminar hacia adelante, y mientras está aún en el aire, preguntar: "Bien Dios, ¿dónde quieres que ponga ahora este pie?" ### The Ascension of the Lord

There is always something very tender and heartwarming about a kiss. When someone who loves us offers us a kiss, it sends a clear message that we are valued and special. We occupy a unique place in their lives and have a distinct purpose. Kissing celebrates the wonder and beauty of human life. In a very powerful way, we are connected, through intimate touch, with another human being. With the incarnation of Christ, God kissed humanity. God, revealed so perfectly in Jesus Christ, showed us that we have value and are made in God's image and likeness. Mortal human beings radiate with the presence of God and are worthy enough to reveal the intimacy of the Divine Mystery. The human race is not simply something God created from a distance but something special within which God dwells.

It is no wonder then, why the poor hold such an honored place in Jesus' ministry. They speak of God's love and they cry out for the compassion that is due them as children of God. Justice is about setting relationships right because we are all filled with God's love and have dignity. The human story is understood as a partnership, a true and new covenant, celebrating a love relationship between all of creation and their Creator. It is a story that does not end with the Cross or even the Resurrection. The story finds its happy ending in the Ascension. Our human narrative is still evolving and moving ever more closely toward that day when all will be one in Christ.

Jesus now sits at the right hand of the Father as the Christ of God. In the ascended state, we see what we are all meant to become and have before us the transformed life that awaits all of creation. The disciples got a glimpse of what this transfiguration would be on the holy mountain and it is an essential part of the Good News we are called to proclaim! Christ, now ascended to the Father, sets our paths straight and gives us a look at what awaits us. The day-to-day challenges of life often find us struggling with our incompleteness. Today's celebration gives us the strength to persevere, knowing that we'll eventually be well. May our hearts be enlightened so that we can know this hope and the surpassing greatness of Christ's power! ©LPi
