

Mercy: How it Helps Evil-Doers

How do you feel when someone who's been hurtful, cruel, or morally corrupt gets hit with a hardship that makes them suffer? Our natural tendency is to rejoice because justice has finally been meted out. Jesus addresses this in this Sunday's Gospel reading. He wants us to understand that we cannot truthfully say that someone is a "greater sinner", even if that person is doing more damage than anyone else, is more unChristian than we are, or is blatantly an evil-doer. Every person has been created in the image of God, even the worst ones. Those who display an opposite image are nonetheless loved by Jesus Christ, who died for them. It's a tragedy that they do not live as the person God created them to be, because this harms others. But it will be an even worse tragedy if no one invites them to turn their lives over to Christ by loving them as he loves them. No person is an evil person. Evil-doers are children of God living in ignorance of their true identity. They are victims of evil and were seduced by it into believing that it's the best way to live. They don't understand that they can be healed by the Sinless One who conquered evil for their redemption. We should feel sorry for them -- this is the gift of mercy. We should mourn with Jesus for the tragedy that continues within their souls -- this is the most precious gift of mercy. When we don't care enough to grieve over a person's inner destruction, we are sinning. We are disregarding what Jesus did for them on the cross. We are damaging our own souls. All those who have sinned against you are like the fig tree in Jesus' parable. If you have access to them, he wants you to till their soil. He wants you to fertilize their souls with love and with the truth of the Gospel as taught by your actions and, when they're ready, by your words. He wants you to give them a gentle but obvious invitation to grow in the right direction. Notice that Jesus doesn't want us to keep a diseased, disintegrating tree in the garden forever. After (and only after) we have done everything possible, if the evil-doer does not want to change, the best care we can give to the garden is to cut down the tree. This means walking away or calling in the authorities for intervention and letting the sinner reap what he sows. This, too, is very loving. When fertilizer won't produce good fruits, a fallen tree becomes mulch and enriches the ground for a new beginning. ©2022 Terry Modica. Catholic Digital Resources, www.catholicdr.com. Misericordia: cómo ayuda a los que hacen el mal

¿Cómo te sientes cuando alguien que ha sido hiriente, cruel y moralmente corrupto es golpeado por una penuria que le hace sufrir? Nuestra tendencia natural es alegrarnos porque finalmente se ha hecho justicia. Jesús aborda esto en la lectura del Evangelio de este domingo. Quiere que entendamos que, en verdad, no podemos decir que alguien es un "gran pecador", incluso si esa persona está haciendo más daño que nadie, es más anti Cristiano que nosotros, o descaradamente es un malhechor. Cada persona ha sido creada a imagen de Dios, incluso las peores. Sin embargo, aquellas que muestran una imagen opuesta, también son amadas por Jesucristo, quien murió por ellas. Es una tragedia que no vivan como las personas que Dios pensó que fueran, porque esto perjudica a otros. Pero sería una tragedia aún peor, si no se les invita a entregar sus vidas a Cristo para amarlo como Él las ama. Ninguna persona es una persona malvada. Los malhechores son hijos de Dios viviendo en la ignorancia de su verdadera identidad. Son víctimas del mal y fueron seducidos por él en la creencia de que es la mejor manera de vivir. No entienden que pueden ser sanados por Aquel Sin Pecado que conquistó al mal para su redención. Debemos sentir pena por ellos -- este es el don de la misericordia. Deberíamos llorar con Jesús por la tragedia que continúa dentro de sus almas -- este es el regalo más precioso de la misericordia. Cuando no nos importa lo suficiente, hasta el punto de hacernos sufrir, la destrucción interna de una persona estamos pecando. Estamos haciendo caso omiso de lo que Jesús hizo por ellos en la cruz. Estamos dañando nuestra propia alma. Todos los que han pecado contra ti son como la higuera de la parábola de Jesús. Si tú tienes acceso a ellos, Él quiere labrar su tierra. Él quiere fertilizar sus almas con amor y con la verdad del Evangelio por medio de tus acciones y, cuando estén listos, por medio de tus palabras. Él quiere darles una invitación, amable pero evidente, para crecer en la dirección correcta. Observa que Jesús no quiere que mantengamos en el jardín un árbol enfermo y desintegrándose. Después (y solo después) que hayamos hecho todo lo posible, si el pecador no quiere cambiar, el mejor cuidado que podemos dar al jardín es cortar el árbol. Esto significa alejarse o llamar a las autoridades para que intervengan y así dejar que el pecador coseche lo que sembró. Esto, también, es muy amoroso. 






It's the Universal Church

We have been invited by the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to participate in Pre-Synod preparation for **Synod 2023**. He has called this Synod gathering of Bishops throughout the world to be a time for the Church to focus on the topic of synodality itself. The two fundamental questions that will guide this process are: "How does this 'journeying together' take place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal level), allowing the Church to proclaim the Gospel?" and "What steps is the Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?" (Preparatory Document, 2).

Here is a message from our Bishop William Koenig, last year, "I am eager to share with you that on Sunday, October 17, 2021 we will be joining dioceses throughout the world in commencing our own Diocesan Pre-Synod here in the Diocese of Wilmington. Pope Francis has challenged our Church to "journey together" and our Pre-Synod will provide us the opportunity to live out this calling.'

Our parish sent five representatives to participate in the Deanery Listening Session and now we will have Listening Sessions in our parish community. Our general gatherings will be Saturday, April 23rd at 2:00 p.m. in the Holy Redeemer Church Hall and Monday, May 16th at 7:00 p.m. in the St. Francis de Sales Church Hall.



KNIGHTWATCH!

On this coming Tuesday members of The Knights of Columbus will celebrate what we refer to with pride as Founder's Day, the 140th

anniversary of the reception of the Charter granted to the fledgling Order by the State of Connecticut: March 29, 1882. Seven weeks earlier, on the evening of February 7th, the young pastor of St. Mary's Catholic Parish, in downtown New Haven Connecticut, with a group of 24 men of his flock whom he had summoned for the purpose, formally voted The Knights of Columbus into existence. Thus was laid the seed for what was to grow into the world's largest Catholic men's fraternity with, today, over 2 million brother Knights here and in 14 lands abroad, *including Ukraine*. Our Order is presently working with its Councils in Poland, and with the Latin and Greek Catholic Churches in Ukraine, to provide temporary shelter, food, medical supplies, clothing and communications to Ukraine's besieged people. Knights and friends have so far donated in excess of \$6 million to this cause.


