

Using IRA Distributions for Charity

An increasingly popular way to transfer IRA assets to charity is via a tax provision which allows IRA owners who are 70½ or older to direct up to \$100,000 per year of their IRA distributions to charity. These distributions are known as qualified charitable distributions, or QCDs. The money given to charity counts toward the donor's required minimum distribution (RMD), but doesn't increase the donor's adjusted gross income or generate a tax bill.

Keeping the donation out of the donor's AGI (annual gross income) is important because doing so can (1) help the donor qualify for other tax breaks (for example, having a lower AGI can reduce the threshold for deducting medical expenses, which are only deductible when they exceed 10% of AGI); (2) reduce taxes on the donor's Social Security benefits; and/or (3) help the donor avoid a high-income surcharge for Medicare Part B and Part D premiums (which kick in if AGI is over certain levels).

Further, because charitable contributions will not yield a tax benefit for those taxpayers who no longer itemize their deductions (thanks to the larger standard deduction for 2018 and thereafter), those who are age 70¹/₂ or older and are receiving RMDs from IRAs, may gain a tax advantage by making annual charitable contributions by way of a QCD from an IRA. This charitable contribution will reduce RMDs by a commensurate amount, and the amount of the reduction will be tax-free.

As always, be sure to consult with your tax advisor on how you may benefit.



Share Your Colt with Jesus

Palm Sunday begins the highest holy week of the liturgical year. Will it also begin in your life a high holy experience of uniting yourself to Jesus and to his awesome love? There's a key phrase in the reading that we hear at the beginning of this Mass, during the Procession with Palms, which sums up this experience of your union with God: "The Master has need of it." Why do you think the Gospel writer spent time explaining how Jesus obtained the colt for his ride into Jerusalem? It's meant to teach us something in our current circumstances. We each have a "colt" tied up somewhere in our lives. It's anything that belongs to us and is not yet being shared with Christ: It could be our possessions, money, talents and skills, creativity, time and energy, etc. The Master has need of it! But sometimes we selfishly tie these up with our own agendas and busyness. They would be useful to Jesus if we let him have them. Like the colt that Jesus rode, they could become gifts that glorify our Savior. Palm Sunday teaches us that he deserves to be glorified for his awesome love, which he made visible on the cross. Who else would die for you -- with that much suffering? Jesus sacrificed his comfort and his body and blood to take the punishment that we deserve for our sins. We should rejoice gratefully for this every Sunday with hosannas and admiration, for in the Eucharist we reunite ourselves to that tremendous love. In this communion, why aren't we grinning like lovers who have become joined to their beloved? The answer to that is: Our "colts" are still tied to the post. Jesus has sent his disciples to you to ask you to share your "colt" with Jesus. They are at the altar consecrating the Eucharist for you. They are writing bulletin "help wanted" blurbs. They are interrupting you at work asking for your prayers or counsel or other assistance. They are the strangers who are in need of your charitable donations. El Domingo de Ramos da comienzo a la semana más sagrada del año litúrgico. ¿Le dará comienzo también en tu vida a una mayor experiencia sagrada de unirte a Jesús y a su amor increíble? Hay una frase clave en la lectura que escuchamos al comienzo de esta Misa durante la Procesión con las Palmas, que resume esta experiencia de tu unión con Dios: "El Maestro lo necesita". ¿Por qué crees que el escritor del Evangelio gastó su tiempo en explicar cómo obtuvo Jesús el potrillo para montar hacia Jerusalén? Lo hizo con intención de enseñarnos algo acerca de nuestras circunstancias actuales. Todos tenemos un "potrillo" atado en algún lugar de nuestras vidas. Es algo que nos pertenece y que aún no hemos compartido con Cristo -- pueden ser nuestras posesiones, dinero, talentos, habilidades, creatividad, tiempo, energía, etc. ¡El Maestro lo necesita! Pero a veces atamos todas estas cosas de manera egoísta a nuestras propias agendas y ocupaciones. Les serían útiles a Jesús si dejásemos que las tuviera. Igual que el potrillo que montó Jesús, podrían convertirse en regalos que glorifiquen a nuestro Salvador. El Domingo de Ramos nos enseña que Él merece ser glorificado por su amor increíble, que hizo visible en la cruz. ¿Quién más moriría por ti -- con tanto sufrimiento? Jesús sacrificó su comodidad, su cuerpo y su sangre para aceptar el castigo que nosotros merecíamos por nuestros pecados. Deberíamos alegrarnos con gratitud por esto, cada domingo, con hosannas y admiración, ya que en la Eucaristía nos volvemos a unir con a ese tremendo amor. En esta comunión, ¿por qué no estamos sonriendo como amantes que se han unido a sus amados? La respuesta a esta pregunta es: nuestros "potrillos" aún siguen atados al poste. Jesús ha enviado a sus discípulos a pedirte que compartas tu "potrillo" con Jesús. 



Thoughts from the Principal Debbie Traum <u>dtraum@sfdscs.org</u>

One of my goals as principal of St. Francis de Sales Catholic School for the past five years has been to propel our technology resources to a level that would promote twenty-first century skills in our students. These vital attributes include collaboration, problem solving, communication, creativity and critical thinking. The most important outcome of reaching this goal is graduating digital leaders from our eighth grade class who transition successfully to high school and beyond.

We offer a multi-disciplinary, project-based approach to instruction called STREAMS. This is our unique acronym for science, technology, religion, engineering, arts, mathematics and Spanish. During any given lesson, students are exposed to two or more of these subject areas. For example, students in an eighth grade algebra class may launch a rocket. Facets of this may include drawing the design, building the rocket, discussing physic topics like gravity, and collecting data in order to make the algebraic expression of a parabola come to life.

A unit in first grade about penguins may include walking around the room like a penguin, creating a model of a penguin habitat, examining global warming effects on the penguin's environment and writing a story from a penguin's point of view. Joining several subjects in a lesson has research-based benefits and clearly makes learning more fun!

The original STEM programs began a great trend in education. When students use more than one discipline to learn, their brains make better connections that enhance retention and recall of content and skills. Recently educators have realized that it's not only the math and science related fields that can benefit. The addition of the humanities enhances the traditional STEM programs bringing in creativity and a different part of the brain. When we incorporate the arts, language and religion, students learn an appreciation for human society, ideologies and beliefs. Educators are challenged to teach students to be creative problem solvers capable of incorporating world class skills.

We are grateful to our Home and School Association, parish and the Richard A. Henson Foundation for the financial support that enabled us to offer all students in grades one through eight their own Chromebook. We are a Google Classroom school with a teacher, Mary-Tyler Upshaw, who is a certified Google Classroom administrator and coach. Our faculty, student body and families continue to work together as partners in education.

It's the Universal Church

We have been invited by the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to participate in Pre-Synod preparation for **Synod 2023**. He has called this Synod gathering of Bishops throughout the world to be a time for the Church to focus on the topic of synodality itself. The two fundamental questions that will guide this process are: "How does this 'journeying together' take place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal level), allowing the Church to proclaim the Gospel?" and "What steps is the Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?" (Preparatory Document, 2).

Here is a message from our Bishop William Koenig last year, "I am eager to share with you that on Sunday, October 17, 2021 we will be joining dioceses throughout the world in commencing our own Diocesan Pre-Synod here in the Diocese of Wilmington. Pope Francis has challenged our Church to "journey together" and our Pre-Synod will provide us the opportunity to live out this calling.

Our parish sent five representatives to participate in the Deanery Listening Session and now we will have Listening Sessions in our parish community. Our general gatherings will be Saturday, April 23rd at 2:00 p.m. in the Holy Redeemer Church Hall and Monday, May 16th at 7:00 p.m. in the St. Francis de Sales Church Hall.
