

### **Christ's Victory for Your Crosses**

Alleluia! Celebrate the healing and increased faith that comes from growing closer to Jesus through the faith-building exercises of Lent and the solemn meditations of Holy Week! The doorway into heaven is the cross. Experiencing the glory of the celebration of Easter -- deep within our hearts, within our needs, within our desires -- began with accepting our sorrows and sacrifices and sufferings are our own personal connections to Jesus. And now, Easter joy comes not only from accepting what Jesus did for you on the cross but also from continuing the journey, side by side, step by step with Jesus. When we're sincere about following Christ, if we truly want to grow in faith, we do whatever he does, united to his ministry of helping others grow in their eternal relationship with God. In this, we face the cross again and again. There is no gain in salvation without the pain of sacrificial love. The victorious alleluia of Easter is the triumph of the cross. It's the realization that life doesn't have to be free of troubles in order to be full of joy. It's the day-to-day living out of a faith that comes from trusting that God is carrying us through the trials and bringing good out of bad. Our cross is a soft word that we speak when someone else is angry and we feel like shouting. Our cross is a hand outstretched to comfort the afflicted when it's inconvenient and we feel like withdrawing. Our cross is a good deed that we do to those who treat us unjustly and we feel like retaliating. And our resurrection is the joy that comes from knowing that we have made a difference in the lives of others for the sake of God's kingdom. Love that's given when it's difficult is a suffering love, a passionate love, a salvific love, i.e., it benefits the eternal lives of others. Then, our sacrifices have a value of endless worth. This is so much better than a selfserving, easy life. It's eternally better! "The Paschal Mystery" is a phrase we hear and use in the Mass and sacramental rites, but do we understand what it means in the greater story of Salvation, from the Passover in Egypt to the Last Supper and Crucifixion of Jesus?



Perhaps it refers to the prophet Isaiah himself, perhaps the entire nation of Israel, or possibly the promised Messiah. Christian faith sees these prophetic utterances fulfilled in the life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus the Lord.

# **Growing in Faith...**



### It's the Universal Church

We have been invited by the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to participate in Pre-Synod preparation for **Synod 2023**. He has called this Synod gathering of Bishops throughout the world to be a time for the Church to focus on the topic of synodality itself. The two fundamental questions that will guide this process are: "How does this 'journeying together' take place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal level), allowing the Church to proclaim the Gospel?" and "What steps is the Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?" (Preparatory Document, 2).

Here is a message from our Bishop William Koenig last year, "I am eager to share with you that on Sunday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, 2021 we will be joining dioceses throughout the world in commencing our own Diocesan Pre-Synod here in the Diocese of Wilmington. Pope Francis has challenged our Church to "journey together" and our Pre-Synod will provide us the opportunity to live out this calling.

Our parish sent five representatives to participate in the Deanery Listening Session and now we will have Listening Sessions in our parish community. Our general gatherings will be Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> at 2:00 p.m. in the Holy Redeemer Church Hall and Monday, May 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. in the St. Francis de Sales Church Hall.




