

Blind Trust in Jesus

This Sunday's Gospel reading is short and to the point: Jesus, our Good Shepherd, is the only one we follow, the only one we can trust blindly. Others who have authority in our lives might be good shepherds, but none of them are to be followed blindly, not even the best of them. We respect the positions of bishops, parish pastors, employers, teachers, parents, etc., but all make mistakes, all sin, all have incomplete understandings of the situations for which they're responsible. We must use the Holy Spirit's gift of discernment in each case so that we don't behave like dumb sheep inadvertently cooperating with decisions that grieve our Father God. Only Jesus can be blindly trusted. Only Jesus is perfect and knows all, understands all, and never sins. Only Jesus can successfully make the right decisions all the time and lead us through the various situations of life without inadvertently cooperating with evil. Only Jesus can discern and implement a plan that's best for every person who's affected by the plan. Only Jesus can lead us closer and closer to heaven while guiding us through the pitfalls and dangers of the journey. And it is only Jesus who can smile at our blunders when we stray from his plans, because he knows that we still really do love him and want to do what's right. He knows how to implement a new plan that will steer us back into safe pastures. He compassionately holds onto us so that we don't wriggle away from the Father's hand forever. Whenever we distrust anyone -- ourselves, included -- we can safely trust that no matter what happens, Jesus is always there, steadfastly guiding us and re-guiding us after we stray. Because we really do love him and want to do what's right, he is securing our safety, redeeming our mistakes, making good come from bad when we repent of our sins, and of course always making sure that we'll get home to heaven. 

It's the Universal Church

We have been invited by the Holy Father, Pope Francis, to participate in Pre-Synod preparation for **Synod 2023**. He has called this Synod gathering of Bishops throughout the world to be a time for the Church to focus on the topic of synodality itself. The two fundamental questions that will guide this process are: "How does this 'journeying together' take place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal level), allowing the Church to proclaim the Gospel?" and "What steps is the Spirit inviting us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?" (Preparatory Document, 2).

Here is a message from our Bishop William Koenig, last year, "I am eager to share with you that on Sunday, October 17, 2021 we will be joining dioceses throughout the world in commencing our own Diocesan Pre-Synod here in the Diocese of Wilmington. Pope Francis has challenged our Church to "journey together" and our Pre-Synod will provide us the opportunity to live out this calling.

Our parish sent five representatives to participate in the Deanery Listening Session and now we will have Listening Sessions in our parish community. Our general gathering will be Monday, May 16th at 7:00 p.m. in the St. Francis de Sales Church Hall.

KNIGHTWATCH!

The current Columbia, the Knights of Columbus (K of C) monthly magazine, is replete with articles concerning the war in Ukraine, and the extent to which our Order is involved in the provision of humanitarian relief to the victims of that war, both in Ukraine itself and in places where thousands of refugee Ukrainians are either settling or passing through. Since the first European K of C Council was established in Poland in 2005 the Order has flourished there. Polish Knights are now at the forefront of Poland's rendering of humanitarian aid to its besieged neighbor. This is done through closest fraternal collaboration with their Ukrainian brother Knights. The first Ukrainian K of C Council was established in 2012. There are now more than 25 active Councils there, men of both the Roman Catholic Church and the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church working in unity to provide to those in need. In February the K of C Ukrainian Solidarity Fund was established. and to date over \$13 million has gone, 100%, to assist internally displaced persons and refugees. (See kofc.org/Ukraine).






