

# PARISH MEMBERSHIP & SACRAMENTS

**Welcome** to Blessed Sacrament Parish! We hope that all residents of the Valley Stream area can feel at home in our parish and strive to be an active part of our faith community. Please take a moment to stop in the Pastoral Center Office to fill out a membership form and to meet a member of the Pastoral Staff.

## THE CELEBRATION OF THE SACRAMENTS

### **Anointing of the Sick**

Those who are seriously ill or in danger of death should arrange to receive this Sacrament as soon as possible. For those able, you may come to the church at any time to request to be anointed. For those unable, please contact the parish office and one of our priests will come to you at home or in the hospital. We encourage those who are preparing for a planned hospital stay to celebrate the Sacrament before entering the hospital. *Please note, that new safety protocols may limit the priests' ability to anoint in hospitals and homes. Call to find out options.*

### **Baptism**

Infant Baptisms are usually celebrated the Third Saturday of the month at 1:00 PM and on the Fourth Saturday of the month at 1:00 PM in Spanish. Parents & godparents are asked to attend a Baptismal Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Please contact the parish office as soon as you find out that you are expecting. Any child over 7 years old who has not been baptized should also be enrolled in parish Faith Formation and will need to attend classes for a time before being baptized.

### **Marriage**

Please contact the parish office as soon as you become engaged and not less than *six months* in advance of your anticipated wedding date. Contact the parish *prior* to making your reception plans to ensure date availability. All couples are required to attend a Diocesan Pre-Cana Marriage Preparation Program.

### **Reconciliation (Penance, Confession)**

Confession is on Saturdays between 12:00-1:00 PM and can also be heard by appointment.

### **Eucharist & Confirmation**

Inquiries for Eucharist (Communion) and/or Confirmation for all school-age children should be made to the Director of Evangelization, Guenevere Neuhedel.

### **Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA)**

For adults seeking Baptism, Communion, and/or Confirmation or even simply inquiring about the Catholic faith. Call the Parish Office at (516)568-1027

### **Holy Orders and the Consecrated Religious Life**

The celebration of the Sacrament of Holy Orders is reserved to the bishop. Any young man who believes he is being called to serve God as a priest should speak to one of the parish priests or contact Fr. Sean Magaldi the diocesan vocations director, at 631-424-9888. Any married man who believes he is being called to serve God should consider becoming a deacon. For those who are considering serving God as a consecrated sister or brother, please also contact the parish office or contact Fr. Magaldi.

## From the Pastor's Desk



Greetings! He is truly risen... Alleluia! Alleluia!! Happy Easter to everyone! Think about those times when you received good news; sometimes you screamed out, Alleluia! ~ this is an expression of joy for good news. With joy at this season, we say Alleluia! We sing this Alleluia for Christ has risen, but this year we also sing praise as we are gathered again to celebrate what we couldn't celebrate last year! The Risen Christ reminds us all that this horrible pandemic is neither winning the battle, nor have our dead loved ones lost the battle. The Resurrection shows us that Christ has won triumphantly over death and has saved us. This Easter shows us that God has not given up on us. In everything we have been through this year, He has saved us.

During the Prayers of the Faithful this Sunday, we will observe a minute of silence for all those that have died of coronavirus. We hope and pray that covid-19 will be a thing of the past soon and everyone can unite together again. Today's feast reminds us that this too will pass away.

Over the past few days, we have been reading the passion of our Lord Jesus, a horrible story that shows rejection, abandonment, denial, betrayal, false accusation, false witnesses, and killing. A horrible story that turns out to be the story of our salvation, the story of love. That the one who was rejected did not reject anyone, the one who was hated loves everyone, the one who was abandoned did not abandon anyone, and the one who was killed forgave and won victory over death by rising from that death. It is a story of our salvation and a story of love and that is the reason we sing, "Alleluia!"

There are two projects that we have in front us that I would like everyone to keep in mind. I got lost a lot on Central Avenue during my first two weeks in this parish. Whenever I was driving on Central Avenue, I would wind up driving pass the church because there is no sign. By the time I reached my third week here, 7-11 and Exxon gas station become a signpost for me to locate the church and rectory. This is when I knew that one issue which needed to be addressed was a sign for our parish welcoming parishioners and visitors. On Central Avenue you notice that there are many churches and businesses, most of them clearly identified with a sign. So, one of our projects this year will be to install a sign. Another project that we will be facing soon is the front facade of the Church, which is desperately in need of repair. The tiles are all cracking and need to be replaced. I will be calling on each of you in the near future to assist us in accomplishing these goals for our wonderful parish community and church building.

My gratitude for your continuous support and generosity. Without your time, talent, support, and generosity, it would be hard for us to accomplish all we do here. I appreciate every one of you ~ continue to be the greatest gift to your parish! Please know that our major source of income is our Sunday collections. This pandemic has affected us financially as it has done to most people. Please help us if you can. We are relying on your financial support to help the needy, pay our bills, and pay salaries.

Finally, know that we are here for you. We are glad that you are here! I pray that the Risen Christ who conquered death, will remove any fear or doubt and bring great love, unity and peace of mind to you and your family. Above all, may He continue to guide and protect you all and heal the world from this deadly disease. HAPPY EASTER to you and your family.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

*The Lord is truly risen, Alleluia!* Around the world and across Long Island, we proclaim this marvelous truth. Good news is ours. Sin and death have been vanquished. Christ has conquered. God is victorious!

In light of the suffering and death of the past year, how blessed we are to behold again the Mystery of the Resurrection. These months have been dark and bleak. They have been long and challenging. Yet, as we encounter Easter 2021, we are reminded that God has the final word. Indeed, *Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it* (John 1:5). This Light, Jesus Christ, illumines our path. He gives hope. As the Fathers of the Second Vatican Council said:

Through Christ and in Christ, the riddles of sorrow and death grow meaningful. Apart from His Gospel, they overwhelm us. Christ has risen, destroying death by His death; He has lavished life upon us so that...we can cry out in the Spirit: Abba, Father.<sup>1</sup>

With significant challenges facing us still on Long Island and across the globe, with darkness still afoot, perhaps the joy of Easter is difficult to embrace. Our hearts maybe like those of the disciples who went on Easter dawn to anoint the Lord's body. At the strange sight of an empty tomb and an apparently absent Jesus, instead of experiencing immediate joy, they were confused and distressed. Only in seeing the Lord face to face did they come to embrace His rising from the dead.

Like Mary Magdalene and the other disciples, we need to see Christ alive among us. We need to see the Resurrection in our midst. So, this Easter, let us ask, "Where is Christ alive?"

Christ is alive in the countless frontline workers, civil servants, and medical professionals who have served so faithfully and so heroically this past year. Their sacrificial love and Good Samaritan-willingness to help neighbors in need radiate the Lord Jesus!

Christ is alive in the catechumens who have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. Their reception of the Sacraments reminds us of the power of our own Baptism – where each of us has died with Christ and risen with Him to new life.

Above all, Christ is alive in His risen and glorified presence in the Eucharist and in the transforming power of His Body and Blood that we receive in the celebration of the Mass. Christ

is alive, and therefore the Church is alive. The Eucharist is the source of this life – and its power has become perhaps more evident than ever, after months of separation from the weekly and daily celebration of the Mass. Together, we recall the disciples' recognition of Jesus following the Resurrection at Emmaus in the opening of the Scriptures and the breaking of the Bread. We are grateful for the many ways in which our parishes and schools have continued to foster creatively this Emmaus experience on Long Island, both in-person and virtually. May we continue to recognize the Sunday Eucharist as the source from which the life of the Resurrected Christ bursts forth into the world.

At his Sunday Angelus on January 3, 2021, Pope Francis beautifully reminded us of Christ's continued presence in our midst:

"I like to think that when the Lord prays to the Father for us, he does not merely speak: he shows him the wounds of the flesh, he shows him the wounds he suffered for us. This is Jesus: with his flesh he is the intercessor, he wanted to bear even the signs of suffering. Jesus, with his flesh, is before the Father. Indeed, the Gospel says that *He came to dwell among us*. He did not come to visit us, and then leave; He came to dwell with us, to stay with us."<sup>2</sup>

May we continue to encounter the presence of Jesus Christ who dwells in and through His Church. May we continue to experience signs of His Resurrection even amidst the challenges and crosses we embrace, and may this encounter continue to fill our hearts, so that our voices can confidently cry out: *The Lord is truly risen! Alleluia!*


## Easter Mass Remembrance

## THE POWER OF SHOWING UP SERVING OTHERS IN LENT

First, SHOW UP in prayer. Praying is always the first step to serving others. It is the source of strength and where we go to receive God's love so that we can give it to others. Without prayer our work means nothing. I'll be the first to admit that sometimes I get distracted in my prayer. But the important thing is that I'm SHOWING UP consistently everyday.

So, my first challenge to you is to commit to praying a prayer of generosity each morning. SHOW UP to prayer on the good days and the bad days. Your faithfulness in your prayer life will allow you to be a more selfless servant to others.

Second, SHOW UP in Fasting. Another important part of Lent is Fasting. Whether you are giving up sweets, Facebook, etc. that's great. But, Fasting can truly be a gift for others. We are so fond of saying the phrase "offer it up". Meaning we will offer our own suffering for the good of another. We cannot do that if we shy away from the discomfort of fasting. When we feel hungry for whatever we have given up, the easy thing is to distract ourselves from that feeling. But instead should SHOW UP and lean into our pain and embrace the fullness of our hunger and thirst.

My second challenge to you is to the next time you feel discomfort in fasting, SHOW UP to your own suffering and offer it up for someone you know who struggles with their faith.

Third, SHOW UP to the suffering of others. The call of Almsgiving in Lent challenges us to show up to the suffering of others. The same way that we cannot shy away from our own pain, we have to enter into other people's mess. Put away your phone, turn off Netflix and be fully present to the people around you. We pass by the face of Jesus in the poor every day without even noticing because we are too busy looking down at our phone or distracted by list of things we have to do. We can't serve others in Lent if we do not even notice them. SHOWING UP is the key. Look at the world through the heart of Christ and feel his compassion for the poor and suffering around us. Serving others in Lent can be as simple as offering an ear or smile, just to let someone know that their lives have value and they are worth your time.

SO, my third and final challenge to you is to put away any distractions when you are with people and to SHOW UP to the suffering of others.

## An Act of Spiritual Communion

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart.
