Pastor's Column

After five years of listening to my homilies most of you know about my fascination with the English language and the ways words and phrases have changed over the centuries. Lately, one of the phrases that I have been researching and mulling over is the phrase, "I can't wait." Most of us realize that the phrase "I can't wait" is a figurative way of saying "I am so looking forward to..." However, when you look at the phrase in its literal sense the obvious response to "I can't wait" would be "Well, you're going to have to wait." But lately, I've begun to see signs where in our American culture we are moving from "I can't wait" to "I won't wait!" We have already seen signs of this in our cultural behavior and our customs around holidays. Each year it seems that Christmas arrives earlier and earlier. Santa may arrive at the Macy's Day Parade on Thanksgiving day but the stores have already been selling Christmas items since before Halloween! Yet the Christmas holiday was traditionally meant to last for 12 days from December 25th to January 5th, the eve of the feast of the Epiphany. Now, by the end of the 12 days of Christmas, there are no longer any Christmas items on the shelves because our culture "can't wait" for Valentine's Day.

Those who study human culture (the people who get paid to do so—not people like me) have often observed that in a world of mass communication we spend most of our time in the past or in the future and not enough of our time in the present. This ongoing pandemic is just another example of how we have become the culture of "I won't wait." At the height of this pandemic we lived in fear of "catching the virus" and we were frustrated that there was no vaccination to protect us. However, as the pandemic began to subside with the growing number of the vaccinated we "could not wait" to take off our masks and so, as soon as authorities told us things were getting better we began to see fewer and fewer masks. Last year at this time we were complaining about wearing a facemask but we had not yet become a nation where wearing a face mask or not wearing one identified us as part of the great divide between "us" and "them" or "the informed" and "the foolish." We are a culture that unites quickly in a crisis, but the unity soon fades. Next month we will mark the 20th Anniversary of September 11, 2001. Like other places of worship and solace, our churches were filled in the days immediately after 9/11 but that unity soon dissipated and we were back to our divisions of "us and them."

Today, we are facing another surge in this pandemic with the "delta variant" and once again our emergency rooms and Intensive Care Units are filling with those afflicted with the virus. In the midst of this the debate of wearing a mask or not wearing a mask wages on. I doubt that there will be any universal "mask mandate." I too "am so looking forward" to the days when masks are not needed. But for myself, I know there are times when I feel safer wearing a mask; and times when I feel I am obligated to wear a mask for the sake of others. We all have our reasons why and when we will wear a facemask. While I am not asking anyone to imitate my behavior, I am asking all of us to respect the choices and behavior of others in this matter. There is no need for this earthly disease to divide the unity we find in Christ. Remembering the words of St. Paul, I am asking all us to "to maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" (Ephesians 4:3).

- One or both of the spouses need to be Catholic, with the marriage recognized by the Church
- The celebration is for couples; if it is not possible for both to be present, a certificate can be forwarded directly to the couple.

Flocknote

In case you missed our announcement at masses, our parish is excited to announce a new communication system with you! To help us gather these groups together, our parish is partnering with a communications system called Flocknote. Flocknote helps us to gather our parishioners emails and phone numbers in order to help us be more communicative with you.

This will be a great tool for us, especially when we need to notify all of you quickly. For example, if there is inclement weather and we are not able to hold mass, we can easily notify all of you quickly through text and email. The system will not share the information you provide with any other systems. It is free for all of you to use and you can opt out of the system at any time. To sign up, we simply ask you to pull out your phone and text “APP” to 84576.

It will then text you a link to finish your sign up. When you click on the link, it will ask you for your name and if you have one, your email address. When you hit next, it will show you a list of our parish groups. You can click on any group to receive notifications for that group. For example, if you have a child in religious education, you can join the group religious education parents group. If you want to be notified about the women’s group, you can join the women’s group that you will see on the list. Once you click on all of your groups, you’re sign up is complete.

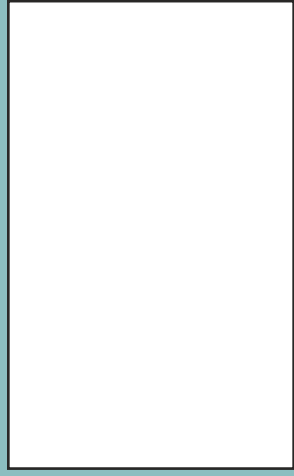
