Pastor's Column

This Sunday at the 11:00 AM Mass we will be introducing a new monthly event that will coincide with our parish Faith Formation program: a monthly "Family Mass." As our Religious Education program starts up this weekend we are opening it with this Mass which will be followed by the opening classes for the 2021/2022 program year. Each month, as we move through the liturgical year and school year there will be a Family Mass at the 11:00 Mass. This year, we are seeing an increase in registrations for our Religious Education program. Along with that we are also seeing an increase in baptisms and new families with young children joining the parish. We have all heard the phrase that in Real Estate the main focus is on "location, location, location." Well the same can be said about our parish right now. We are situated in a beautiful part of the state of Rhode Island with nice neighborhoods, plenty of open space, and good schools. In addition to that, we are the parish that is closest to Interstate 295 and the Massachusetts state line. This all makes us a perfect location for young couples and their families. Having quick access to the interstate means that parents who are working in either Massachusetts or Rhode Island have an easy commute into work AND often an easy access to childcare. In most cases, when the parents set off in the morning for work, one of them, either mom or dad has to "drop off the kids" with the best child care provider they know of: also known as grandma and grandpa. As we seek to respond to these young families we all have to be conscious of the call we share to become part of the "Family of God." We recognize that our biological families are changing constantly, children and grandchildren grow up and get married. They have children who also grow in our midst. All of which has an impact on the parish community. As much as we appreciate the history of our parish and the way things were in past, we also have to be constantly aware of how our parish is changing. This is the image of the Church as a people on a pilgrimage. We are all journeying together through time to the eternal reality of the Kingdom of God. Each one of us can play a part in shaping and nurturing this wonderful family we know as St. Aidan-St. Patrick parish.

As part of the family of God, we gather weekly for "the Lord's Supper" as one family. But this is not solely at time for our personal reflection. At Mass, we not only receive the Body of Christ, we also make up the Body of Christ. This applies to our worship and also to our efforts to pass on the faith to our children. Religious Education is not solely having your son or daughter sit in class once a week to learn about God. Religious Education is an experience of being part of the Family of God. This places the responsibility on all of us in recognizing that all adults in the parish are called to be examples of what it means to live out our faith.

Another dimension we must consider is to recognize the challenges that parents face in today's world. Here in the northeastern part of the United States we live within a culture which talks about God less and less. When was the last time you saw a family on television go to church? The practice of one's religion in this world is generally ignored completely by the entertainment industry. Our role as Catholic Christians, regardless of whether or not we have children, is to assist parents in their efforts to instill a sense of faith and prayer in their children. Each one of us share in the responsibility to be examples of faith to each other—even the youngest among us.

We may not all become Religious Education instructors in the parish, but all of us play the role as teachers. It is in our worship, our prayer, as well as our demeanor, and our attitude that all comes together to make the parish a place where children learn of the presence and love of God in Jesus Christ.

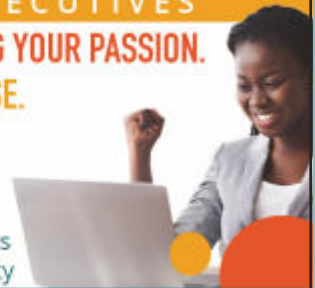
