Hospital and Homebound: Please call the office for First Friday or Anointing.


Priesthood and Religious Life: Contact our priests for an appointment.

Lord, Jesus Christ, with Mary and Joseph you formed the Holy Family: remain in our home, that we may know you as our guest and honor you as our head. We pray:

At this time the Leader sprinkles the house and all present with Holy Water. The family may then place, in chalk, above the main door of the house the inscription:

20 + C + M + B + 22

All then bless themselves with the Sign of the Cross.
