Second Sunday in Ordinary Time



There are multiple actors in the scene of the Wedding at Cana. Jesus and Mary take the center stage with their conversation and interaction. There is the married couple who invited the Holy Family. The headwaiter and servers taking care of the guests. Finally there were the guests who drank all the wine. As you listen to the story, who can you relate to in the story? If you were present at this wedding feast, what would you be doing? Each person has a role to play in the miracle. The servers needed to trust Jesus in serving the people and the headwaiter. They just filled stone jars with water, jars that were used to wash people's feet and they were asked to take this "foot water" to their boss. "Do whatever He tells you." There is the headwaiter who was the first to witness the miracle. He was able to authenticate that this was indeed the best wine. He might not have known where it came from, but he was able to share his story and encounter with the people. "Everyone serves good wine first" Then there was the married couple, who were spared from embarrassment. Things were going wrong and they did not know how to fix it. "They have no wine!" Did they even notice the miracle? Mary, always directs people to her Son. Jesus is willing to help us if it leads us to a greater relationship with Him. The parish office will be closed Monday, January 17 in observance of Martin Luther King Day.


