

TODAY IS SUNDAY, MARCH 17, THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT. The Gospel reading is Luke 9:28b-36. As we journey through Lent, it can be easy to dwell on sacrifice. No chocolate, no alcohol, no meat on Fridays. Yet here, only in the

second week of Lent, we have the story of the transfiguration. This reading reminds us of the "why" behind what we do. We don't fast from dessert to lose weight. We don't donate money or serve others because it's merely a nice thing to do. Lent is about transformation!

Peter, James, and John trudged up the mountainside behind Jesus. This must have been a difficult hike, because when they reached the top, they fell asleep. Despite our best efforts, perhaps we are asleep to the deeper meaning of the Lenten season. Jesus is transfigured while they slumber, but eventually they become "fully awake, [and] they saw his glory and the two men standing with him."

This is no small thing! The disciples witness Jesus in his divine splendor and see the miraculous apparitions of Moses and Elijah. The entire mountain becomes a spiritual breakthrough. "A cloud came and cast a shadow over them, and they became frightened when they entered the cloud." These symbols are present in the Old Testament when Moses prayed alone and received the 10 Commandments on Mount Sinai. Elijah had a similar experience when he prayed alone before God. But here are ordinary men, former fishermen, who have been drawn up into an adventure beyond their wildest expectations. Jesus is the Christ, the Messiah, the fulfillment of all that came before. But Christianity is not the religion of the elite, where only the select few are allowed to participate. We all are invited into spiritual transformation, and Lent is the time for this!

REVITALIZE IN CHRIST - RAISING THE ROOF CAMPAIGN EXCEEDS GOAL!!

Great news this week! The Revitalize in Christ-Raising the Roof Campaign for St. John Fisher Parish has exceeded its goal of \$450,000 by over \$65 thousand! The total in gifts and pledges as of March 13 is **\$516,323**! What is even more affirming is that \$309,318 has already been collected and deposited in the renovation account.

Some 43 families returned their pledge forms since Commitment Sunday, bringing the number of families who have made a gift to 296 - a wonderful

response from our dedicated parishioners! The Campaign Committee is very excited and thankful that our parish has exceeded the target! We want to encourage those who have not yet made a gift to consider making one. Everyone doing their part, large or small, is a great measure of our common vision and hope for the future!

Please continue to pray and have patience as we begin the preparations for the construction phase of the project. It will be a busy spring and summer!

STEWARDSHIP:

SHARING THE GIFT OF TIME AND TALENT AID FOR FRIENDS

The freezer that sits in the corner of the Church Hall has become a lifeline for seniors in our community. Each week, parishioner Jim Chimienti packs a box with up to 28 frozen, home-cooked dinners to deliver to a hand-full of residents at Lutheran Knolls. Volunteer Joe Kane also distributes meals throughout the month. Jim began volunteering with our parish *Aid for Friends* program about two years ago. "It's a very worthwhile cause," Jim says. "There are people in Delaware County who need food. This is action I can take here, at home, not half way around the world."

Of course, this program wouldn't thrive without the help of parishioners who make an extra portion of dinner and freeze it in the provided foil pans, keeping the freezer stocked. Dozens of families provide approximately 150 meals that get delivered monthly. A few times a year, a few Knights of Columbus and volunteers meet in the parish kitchen to prepare a large number of dinners.

Aid for Friends was founded in 1974 by a parishioner of St. Jerome in Northeast Philadelphia. It is one of the largest free meal delivery programs in the state. Many seniors live alone, rarely leave their home, and have a fixed income. Volunteers at St. John Fisher help Aid For Friends provide vital assistance to the hungry in our own backyard.


