

TODAY IS NOVEMBER 15, THE 33nd SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME. THE GOSPEL READING IS MATTHEW 25:14-30.

God gives us the gift of His very self and asks us to invest it. Investing this gift wisely allows His

kingdom to grow and flourish. God trusts us with this pearl of great price in hopes that it will produce abundant fruit. God's gift is not meant to be solely for personal benefit. It is intended to be shared. Faith, hope, and love are at the heart of Jesus' blueprint for happiness, the Beatitudes.

Investing God's gift means nurturing the well-being of all of our brothers and sisters and the world in which we live. It is a call to be stewards and properly manage not only our own affairs but the affairs of those around. God has put tremendous confidence in us. Do we have that same confidence in God?

ADVENT GIVING TREE

The Advent Giving Tree is a parish custom that provides gifts at Christmas to those who have little. This year has been a challenge to all of us, most especially for those who have lost their jobs, those who live alone, and seniors who have had few visi-



tors and cannot leave their homes. Parishioners are encouraged to select a tag from the tree that lists a gift for someone of a certain age or gender. Take one ornament (or more) from the tree, purchase and wrap the gift, and tape the tag to the outside of the package. (Baby diapers need not be wrapped.) Some of the charitable organizations we support through the giving tree are: Mother's Home, Darby; Emmaus Home, Aston; St. Katherine Drexel Food Cupboard and Clothing Closet; Bernadine Center, Chester; Lutheran Knolls Senior Housing and Parkview at Naaman's Creek, Upper Chichester; and the ministry at the Chichester School District.

JUST A REMINDER...

We are happy to welcome you back to Mass in the Church. However, if you are sick, or someone in your household is not well, PLEASE STAY HOME! Those who have an underlying medical condition that puts them at higher risk of getting ill also should stay at home. The obligation to attend Mass on Sundays has been dispensed by the Archbishop, and we do not want to put anyone at risk.

Please wash your hands before leaving home. Every person age 3 and older must wear a face mask or cloth covering when entering Church. Once inside, please use non-touch hand sanitizer, and have your non-touch temperature taken. If



you are running a fever and are asked to leave, please understand that it is for your benefit as well as for the benefit of others.

Every other pew is taped off for social distancing. Those living in the same household can sit together. Please sit 6 feet away from another person or family. The Church Hall is available for seating.

Please leave 6 feet of space when walking in the Com-

munion line. We ask that you receive the Eucharist in the hand. Wear your mask, receive the Sacred Host in your hands, step to the side, lift/lower your mask, receive Holy Communion, refit your mask and proceed



back to the pew. Anyone who prefers to receive the Eucharist on their tongue is asked to join the end of the line for the priest.

Before leaving the Church, check the pew and make sure you have everything with you. You may pick up a bulletin from the table in the church foyers. When you exit the Church, please do not congregate; proceed directly to your car. Please leave your mask on until you reach your automobile. Thank you for adhering to these standards and helping to keep our parish community healthy!

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: Saturdays, 3:00 - 3:45pm; other times by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY: One party must be a registered member of Saint John Fisher Parish. Couples must make arrangements with the Pastor at least six months prior to the intended date. Weddings can be held at Saint John Fisher or at Immaculate Conception Church. Couples are required to attend the Archdiocesan Sacramental Preparation Program for Marriage (four sessions) or a Pre-Cana program.

PARISH REGISTRATION: We welcome new members to Saint John Fisher! If you are new to our parish, please call or visit the Parish Office to register.

LETTERS OF ELIGIBILITY: If you need a Letter of Eligibility from Saint John Fisher Parish to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, you must be

- a registered member of the parish.
- at least 16 years of age,
- a practicing Catholic (have received the Sacraments and attend Mass regularly).
- If married, you must be in a 'valid' marriage.

The pastor is unable to sign a letter unless you meet these requirements. To request a letter, please speak with Father McDermott after any Mass or call the Parish Office at 610-485-0441, ext. 2.


