

MISIÓN PARROQUIAL

La Iglesia de San Vicente de Paul, se propone construir, fortalecer y dar vida, a nuestra comunidad. Para esto es importante servir los unos a los otros, sin exclusión alguna, siguiendo como modelo nuestro patrón, San Vicente de Paul.

REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

July 4,

Jesús es rechazado en su ciudad natal (Marcos 6: 1-6).

Continuamos pues en la búsqueda de la Identidad de Jesús, como hijo de Dios.

Recordamos, su autoridad y poder sobre las fuerzas de la naturaleza al calmar la tormenta en el Mar de Galilea. De igual manera, el domingo pasado reflexionábamos sobre sus dos milagros, la sanación/ resurrección de la hija de Jairo, y la mujer con hemorragia. Y hoy Jesús, decide retornar a su pueblo natal. Es importante recordar que Jesús, comienza su ministerio en Galilea, así que hasta ahora apenas regresa a Nazaret. Lugar donde crece con su Madre María, y José, el carpintero.

Hoy encontramos su ejercicio de la enseñanza. No hay milagros por falta de fe, pero si enseña a su pueblo. Es sábado (día de descanso judío) y Jesús entra a la sinagoga a ejercer su ministerio de enseñar a su pueblo las grandezas de Dios. A traer las buenas nuevas. La gente está asombrada por lo que escuchan, pero tampoco pueden comprender cómo alguien que conocen tan bien, a el y a su familia, podría enseñar con tanta autoridad y poder.

Algunos detalles bien importantes. Los parientes de Jesús saben que es carpintero, un artesano que trabaja en madera, piedra y metal. Probablemente aprendió este oficio de su padre. Los miembros de la familia de Jesús también se nombran. Le describen como el hijo de María.

También se nombran hermanos y hermanas de Jesús. Lo cual se presta para malas interpretaciones. Sin embargo, Jesús más adelante, anunciará, que cualquiera que hace la voluntad de Dios es su madre y sus hermanos (Mateo 12:46; 12:50; Marcos 3:31; 3:35; Lucas 8:19).

Así que ellos conocen a Jesús de Nazaret. Sus parientes, el oficio de carpintería, el hijo de María, pero no conocen a Jesús, el Hijo de Dios.

Nosotros hoy, conocemos ambas versiones, conocemos el Jesús de Nazaret, y tenemos conocimiento de Jesús, el hijo de Dios. Conocemos a través de los Evangelios, su vida, su ministerio, sus milagros y su derroche de amor en la cruz por nosotros.

La pregunta, sin embargo, es, ¿cual es nuestra excusa hoy para no creerle? Para no seguirle, para no dejarle hacer su obra en nosotros. ¿Le amamos a Jesús, le creemos a Jesús? O le buscamos solo cuando le necesitamos, cuando estamos en problemas. Buscamos a Jesús el que nos hace milagros o al hijo de Dios que nos llama a una conversión de vida. Que hoy cuatro de Julio, día de la Independencia Americana, nosotros también busquemos y festejamos la independencia, la libertad absoluta de los malos hábitos y el pecado y nos acerquemos más a Jesús, el hijo de Dios.

Parish News

Gospel Reading



God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Sunday Scripture readings. Each Sunday to better understand the Gospel, we include in our church bulletin the background on the Gospel Reading which will help you to connect the Scripture to daily life in a meaningful way.

Mark 6:1-6

Jesus is rejected in his hometown.

This Gospel immediately follows upon last week's stories of the raising of Jairus's daughter and the healing of the woman with a hemorrhage. It sets the context of our Gospel readings for the next two weeks in which Jesus will extend the work of his ministry to his disciples. Today's Gospel describes what many believe to have been the typical pattern of Jesus' ministry: teaching in the synagogue followed by acts of healing. In his hometown of Nazareth, the people are amazed by what they hear, but they also cannot comprehend how someone they know so well might move them so powerfully. In this Gospel, we learn some interesting details about Jesus and his early life. Jesus' kinfolk know him to be a carpenter, an artisan who works in wood, stone, and metal. He probably learned this trade from his father. Family members of Jesus are also named. Mark describes Jesus as the son of Mary, which is an unusual designation. Adult males were more typically identified with the name of their fathers. It is unclear why Mark deviates from this custom. Brothers and sisters of Jesus are also named. Scholars are divided on how to interpret this. As Catholics, we believe that Mary was and remained always a virgin, thus we do not believe that this Gospel refers to other children of Mary. Some have suggested that these family members might be Joseph's children from a previous marriage, but there is little evidence to support this. Others explain this reference by noting that the words brother and sister were often used to refer to other types of relatives, including cousins, nieces, and nephews. This Gospel tells us that Jesus is hampered from performing miracles in Nazareth because of the people's lack of faith. Jesus is said to be surprised by this. He did not predict or foresee this rejection. In this detail we find a description of the very human side of Jesus. This passage unfolds a continuing theme of Mark's Gospel: Who is Jesus? His kinfolk in Nazareth might know the carpenter, the son of Mary, but they do not know Jesus, the Son of God. Mark is foreshadowing Jesus' rejection by his own people, the people of Israel. He is also reflecting on and trying to explain the situation of the community for which he wrote. While many of the first Christians were Jewish, Christianity took hold and flourished in the Gentile community. Mark's community was mostly a Gentile community, who may have been experiencing persecution. By showing that Jesus himself was rejected, Mark consoles and reassures his first readers. He also prepares us to accept this possible consequence of Christian discipleship.




