REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

JULY 11.

La gran comisión/envió de los doce apóstoles (Marcos 6: 7-13).

Después de los últimos tres domingos <u>descubriendo</u> la identidad de Jesús, como hijo de Dios, hoy el evangelio nos presenta <u>el envió de los doce apóstoles.</u>

Para entender mejor el contexto del evangelio recordamos pues que el domingo pasado Jesús fue rechazado en su ciudad natal de Nazaret. La <u>pregunta sin embargo</u> es, ¿si esto hicieron con Jesús, cuanto mas con sus discípulos? Y hoy, el evangelista San Marcos nos recuerda que también podemos <u>encontrar resistencia</u> al elegir ser discípulos de Jesús.

Algunos detalles relevantes: *La palabra apóstol significa "uno que es enviado". *El número doce también es un número simbólico, que representa a las doce tribus de Israel. Al nombrar a los doce apóstoles, Jesús muestra que su misión está en continuidad con la misión del pueblo de Dios, Israel.

Jesús les instruye en no llevar nada, en ser hombres desprendidos de las cosas del mundo. Su misión es el evangelio, no las posesiones. Esta quizás sea una de las mas <u>grandes enseñanzas</u> hoy para nosotros. <u>El seguir a Jesús implica, libertad de espíritu, sacrificio, amor por el evangelio.</u> Los apegos de riquezas, poder y tener, no son contrarias al evangelio, pero si se deben saber administrar. Nos deben acercar más a Dios y al hermano que necesita. Son bendiciones de Dios que se deben compartir. Amen.

Our Obligation By Carol Monaco

Recently my archdiocese announced that due to the decline in coronavirus cases, it is lifting the general dispensation from the obligation of Catholics to attend Mass. Dispensation still applies to the ill, the homebound, and those with serious underlying health conditions. Other archdioceses are doing the same.

Therefore, our obligation to attend Mass in person is on the return. Of course, attending Mass does so much more than fulfill our obligation. We (priests, deacons, lectors, altar servers, Eucharistic Ministers, choir and congregation) encounter the True Presence of Christ in the Word and the Eucharist.

At Mass, the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Savior comes to us. In Christ's words: "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day" [John 6:54]. What an incentive this is to love the Mass and to savor the fruits of Holy Communion!

Obliging Love

Perhaps as we contemplate our obligation, we see in the Mass that our Lord's obligation to us is one rooted in love. By our Lord's love for each of us, He gives us the miracle of changing bread and wine into His Body and Blood for our salvation! "By giving himself to us Christ revives our love and enables us to break our disordered attachments to creatures and root ourselves in him" [CCC 1394].

Rooting ourselves in our Lord roots our obligation in love. Do we accept this divine offer of love from Christ? We say we do from the moment we make the Sign of the Cross during the Introductory Rite. An expression of faith, when we cross ourselves, we renew our baptismal promise, rejecting sin and Satan. The Sign of the Cross reminds us we are children of God. We pledge ourselves—we obligate ourselves—to God the Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit.

Do we mean it? We say we do through our prayers of faith, penance, praise, and thanksgiving during Mass. Therefore, when we fulfill our obligation, we pledge to share the greatest love we will ever receive. Don't be afraid; the Liturgies of the Word and Eucharist teach us how to experience the intimacy of the Trinitarian life. By the power of the Holy Spirit, Christ lives within our body and mind, heart and soul. Truly, the Kingdom of God opens to us if we open ourselves.

Our Mission

The Mass instills loving graces within us to carry us through our joys, works and sorrows so that we may enter into the glory of God's kingdom. Let us be open to its healing power. The Mass helps us to see the holy purpose of our lives in every circumstance. We see that all lives are redeemable even in the final hour. Therefore, let us rejoice in renewing our obligation and let us pray for our fellow parishioners who cannot attend Mass in person.

Consider this: The word "Mass" is derived from the Latin word missa. This comes from missio—the root word of "mission." The Mass gives us the mission to go in peace to love and serve our Lord. Doing so, we partake in the redemption and salvation for ourselves and our world. Thanks be to God!

Gospel Reading

Parish News



God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Sunday Scripture readings. Each Sunday to better understand the Gospel, we include in our church bulletin the background on the Gospel Reading which will help you to connect the Scripture to daily life in a meaningful way.

Mark 6: 7-13

Jesus instructs his disciples and sends them to preach repentance.

This week's Gospel and the one for next week describe how Jesus sent the disciples to minister in his name and the disciples' return to Jesus afterward. These two passages, however, are not presented together in Mark's Gospel. Inserted between the two is the report of Herod's fears that Jesus is John the Baptist back from the dead. In Mark's Gospel, Jesus' ministry is presented in connection with the teaching of John the Baptist. Jesus' public ministry begins after John is arrested. John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus, who preached the fulfillment of the Kingdom of God. While we do not read these details about John the Baptist in our Gospel this week or next week, our Lectionary sequence stays consistent with Mark's theme. Recall that last week we heard how Jesus was rejected in his hometown of Nazareth. The insertion of the reminder about John the Baptist's ministry and his death at the hands of Herod in Mark's Gospel makes a similar point. Mark reminds his readers about this dangerous context for Jesus' ministry and that of his disciples. Preaching repentance and the Kingdom of God is dangerous business for Jesus and for his disciples. Mark wants his readers to remember that we, too, may find resistance as we choose to be disciples of Jesus. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus sent out the Twelve. These twelve were selected from among Jesus' disciples and named by Mark in chapter 3. Mark notes that these twelve are also called "apostles." The word apostle means "one who is sent." The number twelve is also a symbolic number, representing the twelve tribes of Israel. By naming twelve apostles, Jesus shows his mission to be in continuity with the mission of God's people, Israel. Jesus' instructions to the apostles are very specific. He repeats the mission that they are sent to preach and to share his authority to heal and to drive out demons. Jesus sends them in pairs, establishing his mission as a communal endeavor. Jesus also instructs them to travel lightly, without the customary food, money, and extra set of clothes. These instructions mean that the Twelve will be dependent on the hospitality of others, just as Jesus depended on others to provide for his needs. Jesus continues to send us into the world as his disciples. But like the first disciples, we are not sent alone. Jesus has given us the community of the Church, which strengthens our life of discipleship. The Christian message can only authentically be proclaimed in and through the community of faith that is the Church. In our work with others, we build this community of faith and can invite others to share in it.


