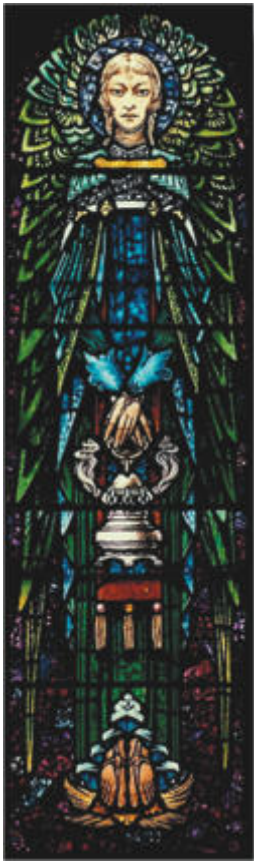

REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Aug, 8, 2021.

La gente murmulla sobre sus enseñanzas y Jesús responde (Juan 6: 41-51)

En este domingo, continuamos leyendo el "Discurso del pan de vida" (Juan 6). Discurso que hemos venido reflexionando y continuaremos durante las dos semanas siguientes.

La semana pasada, la multitud pidió una señal para creer Jesús. ¿Otra señal? Jesús se presenta como la gran señal venida del Padre, el pan de vida enviado por Dios. Esto incomodo grandemente a los judíos.

Ellos conocían a su familia y sabían que era el hijo de José y María, proveniente de una familia sencilla y del común. Sin títulos ni aristocráticos o militares. Es así como su arrogancia y poca fe, les limita a ver mas allá de las apariencias humanas.

De igual manera, las simples apariencias del pan y el vino no deben ser para nosotros motivo de distracción, ya que, en las manos del sacerdote, a través de las palabras de la consagración, se transforman en el mismo santo cuerpo y sangre de Cristo, que se entrega para alimento vivo y eterno. What is our reason for living? One of our duties on earth is to be faithful stewards of God's creations. We live for a purpose greater than ourselves. Therefore, what do we need to succeed in our faithful stewardship? We need to love God with all our strength, mind, heart, and soul, and love one another as God loves each of us. This love is our driving force. It is the inspiration that sets our priorities in life.

For Freedom's Sake

For this love to flourish in our stewardship, we must fight off temptations of sin and protect our God-given freedom. "Sin is an abuse of the freedom that God gives to created persons so that they are capable of loving him and loving one another" [CCC 387]. Therefore, God gives us every opportunity to repent our sins. Repentance is our shield that protects and preserves our freedom and love from irreparable harm in order to carry out our stewardship. Although Baptism washes away our original sin, that sin has weakened human nature. As a result, we are still prone to disobey our Lord, obscuring our purpose in life. By that first sin—"man, tempted by the devil, let his trust in his Creator die in his heart and, abusing his freedom, disobeyed God's command" [CCC 397]. Indeed, repentance is a vital necessity. Disobedience prevents us from seeing and believing that we are truly redeemable in God's eyes! In other words, God does not give up on us. That fact should be enough reason for living as God's faithful stewards. Our repentance keeps our loving trust in God alive.

Look Forward with Hope

Because our lives and our world can be redeemed, we have reason for hope. As faithful stewards, we are called to pray for the conversion of sinners. We are called to make sacrifices for the salvation of souls. Do we think it is not worth the effort to offer up our time, talent, and treasure for God's sake? We need only to look at Jesus Christ for the answer. God-made-man came into the world. In his great love for humanity, he sacrificed himself for our salvation. His life, death, resurrection, and ascension into Heaven tell us it is worth the effort. If life in this world seems bleak right now, it is because so many have abandoned God in their hearts. They have forgotten their reason for living. They have given up their faith and their stewardship. Remember, our faithful stewardship on earth, according to God's plan, leads us to eternal life in Heaven. That can only happen with an open heart that does not harden. Mary, our Blessed Mother, is a beautiful model of opening her loving heart to all people. Throughout the centuries, the apparitions of the Mother of God remind us that with an open heart, we have Heaven on earth. From Heaven, our Lord sends his loving graces and blessings into our hearts and souls to guide us in our thoughts, words, and deeds. With that daily guidance, by way of the Holy Spirit, we see that when we stop offending God, we stop offending one another. And when we stop offending one another, we stop offending God. As God's stewards, loving and living faithfully, we keep hope alive, giving us peace on earth. Our reason for living is truly worth the effort. Amen!

Parish News

Gospel Reading



God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Sunday Scripture readings. Each Sunday to better understand the Gospel, we include in our church bulletin the background on the Gospel Reading which will help you to connect the Scripture to daily life in a meaningful way.

John 6:41-51

Jesus responds to the murmurs of the crowd, who wonders what he means when he says that he came down from heaven.

On this Sunday, we continue to read from the “Bread of Life discourse” found in the sixth chapter of John’s Gospel. Recall that we have been reading from this chapter for the past two weeks and will continue to read from it for another two. Last week, the crowd asked for a sign that would show that Jesus came from God. Jesus replied by saying that he is the sign and the bread of life sent by God. At this point, our Lectionary omits six verses in which Jesus predicts the unbelief of the crowd and further develops his connection with God the Father. In these verses, Jesus says that he was sent by God to do the Father’s will. Jesus promises that those who look upon the Son with faith will find eternal life. Some of these themes are repeated in today’s Gospel reading. Today’s Gospel begins with a report that the Jews complained about Jesus’ claims regarding his identity. They knew his family, and they knew he was the son of Joseph. They could not comprehend what Jesus meant when he said that he came down from heaven. Jesus responds to the complaints by saying that only those who are chosen by God will recognize him as the one that God sent. This is a recurring theme in John’s Gospel, that God has chosen those who will have faith in Jesus. In the verses that follow, Jesus talks more about his unity with the Father. He is the one who has seen the Father and, therefore, knows the Father. Those who listen to God will recognize that Jesus is the one sent from God. Those who believe will have eternal life. Jesus concludes with the central element of our eucharistic theology. He promises that the bread of life will bring eternal life to those who partake of it, and he tells us that the bread of life will be his own flesh, given for the life of the world. In today’s reading, we hear Jesus say again, as he did in last week’s Gospel, that he is the bread of life. We also hear Jesus add that he is the living bread. Both of these statements help us understand better the gift that Jesus gives us in the Eucharist. We celebrate this gift of Jesus each time we gather for Mass. We believe that receiving Jesus in the Eucharist will lead us to eternal life.

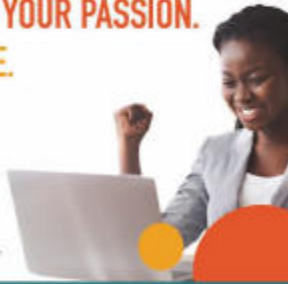
