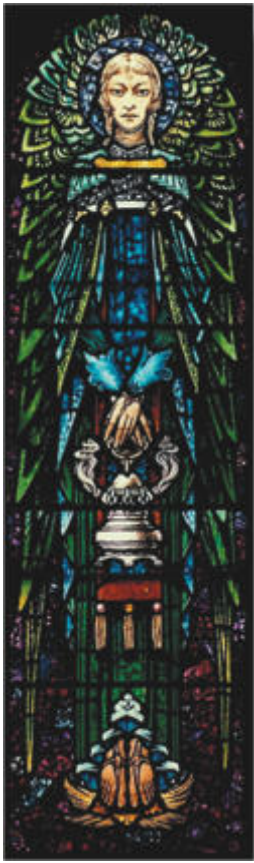

## REFLEXIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Agosto 22, 2021.

Simón Pedro confiesa su fe en que solo Jesús tiene las palabras de la vida eterna (Juan 6: 60-69).

Hemos llegado a la conclusión del "discurso del pan de vida" (Juan 6). Jesús se identifica como el pan bajado del cielo. Que dará vida eterna.

Recordamos algunos elementos importantes:

- Multiplicación de los panes y los peces- abundancia del Reino.
- Jesús el pan de vida bajado del cielo, y el llamado a trabajar por el alimento que no perece.
- La murmuración y apariencias tanto sociales como familiares. Jesús es condicionado por ser hijo de un carpintero.
- El número de personas que seguían a Jesús disminuyó de una multitud de más de 5,000 a solo 12 personas. Y es a estos Doce a los que Jesús dirige ahora su atención. Ratificando: "Solo los elegidos por el Padre [le] seguirán hasta el final."

Así que es una fe personal. Cada individuo debe responder a la gracia de Dios y confesar como propia la creencia de que Jesús es el de Dios. Esta fe luego nos compromete en el camino de la vida, llevándonos a la vida eterna. Nos llama a responder con generosidad.

## BELIEVING AND REJOICING

Revelations 11:19a; 12:1-6a, 10ab

1 Corinthians 15:20-27

Luke 1:39-56

One of the most poignant moments in John's Gospel comes from the meeting between Jesus and Thomas the Apostle after the Resurrection. "Doubting Thomas" refused to accept the truth of Jesus' triumphant return until he had physically touched the wounds in his hands and side. In their exchange, we witness Jesus invite Thomas to "put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side; do not be faithless, but believing." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe."

Although not this week's Gospel reading, connecting moments in Scripture can help the faithful cultivate a more profound understanding from the blessing of, in essence, remembering the rest of the story. St. Elizabeth's words to Mary at the Visitation illustrate the faithful response to God's promises and the markings of true faith. She says of Mary, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Words Jesus will echo in his exchange with Thomas 30-plus years later.

Mary believed in God's promise of a Messiah before experiencing the miraculous Resurrection — truly blessed by not needing physical evidence in order to accept the truth. She trusted in the prophecies, in the promises of God, recognizing He is our ultimate salvation. Mary did not allow any obstacles to hinder her faith, and for that, she was blessed and rejoiced.

How easily we can falter to believe, looking for signs and wonders as caveats of believing. Obstacles against seeing and accepting the truth of God's promises fulfilled can mount daily if we fail to view the world with the eyes of a heart willing to see God at work and embrace Jesus' glorious victory over sin, death, and the trouble of this world.

Mary allowed grace to fill every ounce of her being — strengthening her to give a daily 'yes' to follow and believe. Before Jesus even explained to the disciples that the work of God is to believe in the One sent by God — Mary believed. As she stood before Elizabeth with the Fulfillment incubating within her, her Magnificat's bursts forth, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior."

We receive the same promises through the Eucharist; we see these Mysteries unfold with Jesus literally within us every time we receive the Eucharist. The grace that filled every ounce of Mary's being is available to us abundantly; we merely need to ask, accept, and cooperate with it. "Ask, and it will be given you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you" (Matthew 7:7). What keeps us from asking? Although credited as doubting, Jesus did not withhold from St. Thomas what he asked for to help him believe. Mary reminds us that God "has mercy on those who fear Him in every generation." Believing without seeing, however difficult, is not impossible. God would never ask the impossible. He is a loving God that works the impossible within us through cooperation with grace. No one exemplifies the powerful results of allowing ourselves to be filled with the grace of God more than the Blessed Virgin Mary. May we turn to her intercession, especially today, so we too may be counted among the blessed who have not seen and yet believe.

## Message from Our Pastor

Our parish will host a Cross Catholic Outreach priest on August 28-29, 2021. The priest will preach in every mass about the Church's global efforts to serve the poor and vulnerable. All parishioners are invited to come and learn about what this ministry is doing and how we can transform lives, such as by feeding the hungry, loving the orphan, and empowering the powerless.

Gospel Reading



God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Sunday Scripture readings. Each Sunday to better understand the Gospel, we include in our church bulletin the background on the Gospel Reading which will help you to connect the Scripture to daily life in a meaningful way.

John 6:60-69

Simon Peter confesses his faith that Jesus alone has the words of the eternal life.

For our Gospel today we hear the conclusion of the "Bread of Life discourse" in the sixth chapter of John's Gospel. In the preceding verses, which we have heard proclaimed in our liturgy over the past few weeks, we have heard Jesus explain that he is the Bread of Life, given so that those who believe may have eternal life. This discourse follows the miracle in which Jesus fed more than five thousand people with five barley loaves and two fish. As Jesus has been teaching these things, John's Gospel describes a murmuring crowd unable to accept Jesus' words. In today's Gospel, the crowd has dwindled in number, and John no longer references them, or the Jews. Instead John describes the questioning of those considered to be Jesus' own disciples.

Today's Gospel first records the response of those in the crowd who are described as Jesus' disciples. Just as the larger crowd had struggled with Jesus' teaching, these disciples also cannot accept Jesus' words. Jesus is said to know about their murmuring. He responds by acknowledging their unbelief and by reiterating that only those chosen by the Father will follow Jesus to the end. John's Gospel reports that many of those who had been Jesus' disciples ceased to follow him at this point. The number of people following Jesus dwindled from a crowd of more than 5,000 to only 12 people. And it is to these Twelve that Jesus now turns his attention.

Simon Peter's response to Jesus' question as to whether those closest to him will also leave, reminds us of the reports of Peter's confession of faith in the Synoptic Gospels. Peter announces, on behalf of all the Twelve, that they have come to believe all that Jesus has taught about himself: Jesus is the one from God in whom they have found the path to eternal life.

This conclusion of the Bread of Life discourse focuses on personal faith in the life of Christian discipleship. Each person must make his or her own judgment about who Jesus is and in doing so determine the way of life that he or she will follow. God's grace invites us to be Jesus' disciples, but each person must respond to the grace of God and confess as his or her own the belief that Jesus is the one from God. This faith then commits us to the path of life, leading us to eternal life.

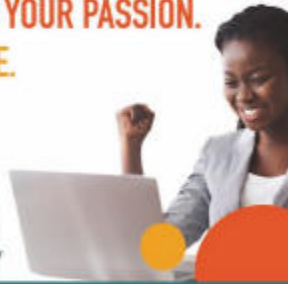
