5 Bible Verses to Pray When You Need Wisdom

- 1) Ephesians 1:16-18
- 2) James 1:5-8
- 3) James 3:17
- 4) Proverbs 2:1-6
- 5) Proverbs 8:12, 33-34

YOU SHOULD ASK GOD,

Wisdom

"I prayed, and prudence was given me; I pleaded, and the spirit of wisdom came to me." Wisdom 7:7

The Book of Wisdom was written about fifty years before the coming of Christ. Its author, whose name is not known to us, was probably a member of the Jewish community at Alexandria in Egypt.

To convey his message, he made use of the most popular religious themes of his time, namely the splendor and worth of divine wisdom, the glorious events of the exodus, God's mercy, the folly of idolatry, and the manner in which God's justice operates in rewarding or punishing the individual.

The book is 19 chapters long. The first ten chapters in particular provide background for the teaching of Jesus and for some New Testament theology about Jesus. Many passages from this section of the book, notably 3:1-8, are used by the church in the funeral liturgy. "The souls of the just are in the hand of God and no torment shall touch them."

The Book of Wisdom was the last book of scripture written before the coming of the Messiah, Jesus. Up to the 18th century, protestant bibles had the book of Wisdom in the King James version but later removed it, as they do not accept it as being scriptural. One of the reasons is that it was not part of the Jewish canon of scripture. However, it contains a very clear prophecy of Jesus Christ in Wisdom 2:12-20 (check it out).

So, just what is wisdom? The Bible gives a very concise answer to this question in *Job 28:28: "the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom, and to turn away from evil is understanding."* So, what is wisdom? Wisdom is loving God, loving His Word, and loving His ways. When you do that, you also hate evil.

This biblical definition shows that wisdom is not just knowledge. You can know all the facts and still do the wrong thing. It's closely connected to making the right choices in life.

As the saying goes, "A wise man learns by the experience of others. An ordinary man learns by his own experience. A fool learns by nobody's experience."

When we read all this about wisdom, we might get discouraged. It seems a high ideal that we can never achieve. Yet the Bible gives us the following promise and encourages us to pray for wisdom: "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all without reproach, and it will be given him." James 1:5


