



Great Deals We Never Use

I reached to grab the truck keys and knocked all the folded Bed Bath and Beyond 20% off cards off the mail holder. The pile fell, blew apart and the cards went everywhere. Dagnab it! One card down between the boots and the heat, two floated over by the recycle bin and the others skittered over the floor under the table. I gathered them up and sat down on the bench I use to tie up my boots. Why don't I ever use these 20% off cards? I tried once, but the 20% off is never good for the item I want! Good deal. Worthless when you aren't a regular or take time to read all the fine print. I threw them in the burn bin and will deal with the wife's wrath on where they went later.

Walking to the truck, the Holy Spirit said, "Joe, you know I am way better than 20% off." "Say what Lord?" I stopped at the old milk house, which is now my tool shed to grab work gloves. The Holy Spirit said, "You have lots of tools." "Yep, I do Lord. I am not getting any work done in the next hour, am I?" "Hear me out," the Spirit said. I sat on the plastic bucket and stared at the wall of hanging tools.

"Today's second reading, 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 (from Paul), is about my Gifts. My gifts are way better than your 20% off stinking bed baffle and bull feathers card. My gifts are free. I have print, but it is not fine. My print is easy to find. It's in any bible. Some even admit when they start reading me, they start liking "My deals" even more! Some, of course, say the same thing you just muttered in the house." "Those gifts are for women or someone else. For sure, not me. They never work for me. It's a stupid store gimmick. A trick to get me in - and then boom, pay full price. It doesn't really save me anything; I will have to pay something! I don't have time to figure out how to use the gift. I'll be just fine on my own." "You know Paul said all of that just before I knocked him to the ground and made him blind for a few days. You know My gifts get found in lots of ways. It doesn't have to be like Paul."

"Do you love Me, Joe?" "You know I do, Lord. Lord, you know I do... Lord, you there?" "Look at all the tools you have to dig a hole. Look at them. How many tools do you need to work with Me, Joe? How many tools do you need? Are you there, Joe? You there?" "I am here, Lord. Just thinking. Lord, You have a list of gifts, but they all can't be for me?" "Yes, I know, Joe. The Importance of Going to Mass

Padre Pio once said, the earth could more easily exist without the sun than without the Mass. That statement should be taken seriously, rather than with a grain of salt. We live in an era of mercy, thanks to the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. God's mercy, through the Mass, sustains the world.

Mass is a sacrifice, an un-bloody re-representation of Christ's death at Calvary. Nearly 2000 years after the event, we participate in Calvary through the Mass. Why do so few Catholics attend Mass today? A lack of faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. A lack of a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

A recent Pew Pole revealed that only 30% of Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. If we truly believed in the Eucharist, there is no way we would be drifting away from Mass and the Church.

The Eucharist sustains us. It is our bread for the journey, our lives on earth. Recall the prophet Elijah as he was fleeing from Jezebel after slaughtering the prophets of Baal. An angel awakened Elijah and told him "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" 1 Kings 19:7. The angel was referring to a hearth cake that should be eaten before Elijah crossed the desert. This was a preview of the Eucharist. If we don't eat our bread for the journey, we will never make it across the desert of our lives on earth. If we aren't going to Mass, we aren't being fed for the journey.

There was a period during my life when I didn't go to Mass regularly. Looking back at that time, I was miserable but didn't know why. I was too busy pursuing worldly things and drifted away for a time. I didn't have a personal relationship with Jesus. I knew that keeping the Sabbath Day holy was one of the Ten Commandments, but following a rule wasn't enough to inspire me to go to Mass. Fortunately, during that time, I had a crisis that forced me to cry out to God, and I made it back to Mass!

Church scandal, viruses, or anything else should not keep us from coming to Mass. Think of the early Christians who risked their lives to go to Mass! Even today, Catholics in some parts of the world risk their lives to go to Mass and receive Jesus in the Eucharist, to receive their bread for the journey.

What will bring people back to Mass? Perhaps a personal crisis, like I went through. Maybe a large-scale event - remember after September 11, 2001, churches were packed. Maybe the best way to get folks back to Mass is the witness and personal invitation from one of us.

"We should not stay away from our assembly, as is the custom of some, but encourage one another, and this all the more as you see the day drawing near." Hebrews 10:25


