

"Jesus came to Nazareth, where he had grown up." Luke 4:16

Did you know that the little hamlet of Nazareth, population 250, was situated on the side of a long mountain ridge overlooking the beautiful Jezreel Valley? That's right, when Jesus, Mary and Joseph walk around their hometown, they see, 900 feet lower down, a broad fertile valley, about ten miles wide and twenty-five miles long, dotted with towns and villages surrounded by fields of crops and groves of olive trees. One of the busiest trade roads of the Near East traversed the Jezreel Valley. It would have reminded Jesus that his salvation was not only for the Chosen People, the Hebrews of the Jewish faith, but for all people of every race, nation and language. The good news of the Gospel is for everyone! The name Jezreel in Hebrew translates as "Yahweh scatters or sows seed." When Jesus spoke his parable about the farmer who went out to sow the seed of the word of God, which fell on rocky ground or good soil, he would have been reminded of the peaceful farmland of Jezreel that he had seen every day.

Nazareth was a happy place. Here the angel Gabriel announced to Mary that she would be the mother of the new King of the Jews. Here it was that Joseph taught Jesus carpentry. Probably the Holy Family had a little vegetable garden outside the village that they tilled and weeded in the cool of the summer evenings. The synagogue that Jesus had attended for so many years was his Father's house. Nazareth's water source was a spring on the side of the mountain, about half a mile away. The women of the village would walk to the spring and back each day with their water vessels, and their little ones would come along. The child Jesus and his playmates would have enjoyed those walks. When he was older, Jesus may have helped some of his young friends tend their herd of sheep and goats, in exchange for milk and cheese to bring to Mary and Joseph's dinner table.

There was also evil in Nazareth, in people's hearts, from the evil spirits which tempt all of us. In today's gospel reading, we see Jesus' Good News rejected in the synagogue. His town-folk companions wanted to see miracles; they wanted Jesus to put on a show for them. We witness their anger and rage as they drag him to the edge of the cliff to hurl him down.

Today, Nazareth has grown to 100,000 inhabitants, and it sprawls along the side of the ridge for several miles. There is a large modern-style shrine, the Basilica of the Annunciation, at the place where Mary virginally conceived our Redeemer some 2040 or so years ago. Thousands of pilgrims come to pray there every year.


