



A Pretzel A Day Is A Way To Pray

Pretzels are part of our culture. We eat them and they are the most globally recognized and oldest snack food. In New York hot pretzel vendors line the street corners. In Philadelphia mustard is a pretzel's best friend. In dark movie theaters pretzels are discreetly dipped into melted cheese. But until 610 A.D. the pretzel had not been born. The legend holds that a monk in northern Italy was delighted that his students had learned all their Lenten prayers. He wanted to thank them for their good work. But Lent, in Medieval times, had strict fasting laws – no sweets, dairy or eggs. What could be given? The monk cooked with the ingredients that were acceptable. He combined flour and water to make a dough and then while rolling it out the inspiration struck him. He had just taught the pupils the crossed arm **Prayer Posture** popular in Medieval times. The monk folded the dough into the shape of arms crossed over the heart, the pretzel shape we now know. The pretzel was designed to symbolize the prayer of thankfulness for God's embrace in prayer. The gesture evokes holding close to one's heart that for which one is grateful. The word pretzel in Italian *pretiolas* means little rewards or gifts. The pretzel quickly moved north into southern Germany where it became extremely popular. Centuries later, German immigrants would bring the pretzel to the United States.

My prayer is that we will never see a pretzel again in the same way, but rather will see arms folded over grateful hearts in prayer and thanksgiving. Prayer helps us to see things differently. The disciples and Jesus praying on the Mount of Transfiguration in today's Gospel saw Jesus and themselves in a different light. As we continue to explore our parish Theme **Eucharist: Giving Thanks As One Body** we know that thankful prayer is the meaning of the word Eucharist. We seek ways that help us to be more aware of the gifts for which we give thanks. Hopefully we will see and experience our lives and worship differently. Today you will receive a **Prayer Card**. There is an interpretive drawing of the invention of the pretzel and the symbol of crossed arms in prayer. On the reverse side of the prayer card is our **Lenten Prayer** which you are invited to pray several times a day. The prayer card is also downloadable online. As a **Lenten Prayer Practice**, place your prayer cards somewhere that will catch your attention. Assume the Medieval folded arm prayer posture for yourself. Pray the prayer and choose how you will be good news as love in action for others. Being the Body of Christ, being Eucharistic people means that we give thanks and express our gratitude with acts of charity. So, a pretzel a day is a way to pray.

Reflection Questions and Activities

Learning a Medieval prayer posture and its meaning is an entrée into taking a closer reflective and prayerful look at our prayer postures at the Eucharist at Mass. Prayerfully reflect on a few postures that are part of our Liturgy. Perhaps our prayer postures have not occurred to you. This is good news for if we make the time to pray and think about what we do, a deeper meaning and a different awareness will occur helping us to move closer to God in prayer.

- * The sign of the Cross Why are hands folded in prayer?
- * Standing and at what times? Why? What does this say about paying attention?
- * Sitting while hearing God's Word and during the offertory. Does this repose suggest receiving and giving?
- * Kneeling what does kneeling teach us about God's Providence, Glory, Worship and Presence among us Sacramentally?
- * The sign of peace how are we being invited into relationship with each other?
- * The singing of hymns what does singing together say about our community and our part in God's Body in Christ?
- * What one action will you take with your physical self to be Christ for another person using your voice, a visit, corporal works of mercy?


