



Stewardship

The feast of Epiphany celebrates the journey and adoration of the Magi, pagan priests or astrologers, who make an arduous and lengthy trip in order to encounter the true God. They follow a star that illuminates their path to find the one true God, the God of Israel. When they reach him, they enter in and offer their adoration: precious gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh.



This feast is a wonderful lesson in stewardship. It is a reminder that the journey of our life is to imitate these Magi. All of our experiences should lead us by the light of faith to discover the presence of the living God. And when we do, we are welcomed to his house. Unlike the Magi, our expectation is not for a short visit with a newborn baby, but the promise of eternity and heavenly glory in the Father's house.

But it is not only the journey that should inspire and teach us. Their gifts should as well. These are not just any old item; these are precious, rare and extremely valuable. While they are chosen to represent Christ, as Priest, Redeemer and God, they also speak to our sense of stewardship. The journey is about bringing the best we have, the most precious that we can gain in life, not for ourselves but to give to God. The Magi bring their gifts with generosity and goodness, they should inspire us that our gifts should be the same, generous and from the best of what we have and are. Whether it is our time, our talent, or our treasure, we are invited to see in the Magi the invitation to be like them.

A Message from Father Peter

Dear Parishioners,

A year ago, we were thrilled to bid farewell to 2020 and the scourge of a pandemic that wreaked havoc on our society, our economy and our families. Several of us lost loved ones in that initial phase when parts of our society, all across the world, were shut down and shuttered. We suffered through the spring, relieved with warm weather and outdoor activities that summer, and the fall brought the anticipation of a vaccine to return our lives to normal.

Just a year ago, we were hearing wonders of the vaccine that had been rushed through trials but that promised to be safe and help us get back to social activities, indoor events, the theatre, sports games, and the like. We had expected that 2021 would be a better year, and that by now, we would settling into a 'new normal.' Figuring that curbside pick up and UberEATS would be new realities that would continue, that schools and offices would take advantage of 'zoom' possibilities so that snow days and daily clogged commutes could go the way of landline and rotary phones, phone books, and instamatic cameras.

But as the calendar turns to 2022, none of that expectation is our reality or 'new normal.' Beyond the initial vaccines, we are told we need a booster. Now we learn that even that doesn't hold a barrier against the omicron variant, and the numbers of infections, hospitalizations and even deaths are challenging the records of just a year ago, not only here but all across the world; Europe and many large cities are reinstating restrictions, travel prohibitions and limitations for social gatherings and public events. It is quite clear that this is not over and that we are heading to another round. However, this time we are tired, our medical professionals are exhausted and retiring in large numbers, and there is a supply chain dilemma with resources, groceries, construction supplies and consumable goods. And some research scientists are fearful that if the delta and omicron variants infect a person at the same time, they might mutate into a yet more deadly variant of COVID. It is worse than a year ago and we can't see an end in sight.

And behold! This weekend, a star appears. Bright. Brilliant. Unequaled in human experience. The religious people don't even notice it. The pagans do and know it leads them to the one, true living God. They follow. They see and believe. And they return a different route. This small detail at the end of the story seems obvious but unimportant. Yet, it is a reminder that once we meet the living God, we are never the same. Someone once said, 'you can never go home again.' You can return but who you are and what you encounter there are not what you left. So it is with the Magi, so it is with us. We are not to be afraid. We are to look up and to follow the light. In that, we are to make the journey of faith as they did, mindful that when we walk by faith we travel a different route and never return the same way we came or to be the same people again. May the Magi inspire, guide and bless us to find the one, true, living God. As is customary, let us bless our homes this day, asking God's special protection for a better and healthier year!

A Look Back ... School Changes 1954-1962 Part 1

The postwar era was a boon to Catholic life, especially for the faithful in Milford. Many of our young men and women had needed to head off to serve in the armed forces and sadly not all of them returned. But for those who did, it was a time of great prosperity. Europe was an eager market for American money and prosperity was seemingly on every corner. Returning GIs could now attend college and improve the lot of their family, families were growing so that parishes and schools were flourishing. Milford had been identified as part of the new Diocese of Worcester, created in 1950 and its young bishop, John Wright, set about to build a diocesan church of impressive activity and deep faith. It was no surprise that the expectations of the faithful were high for him, he would rise to be cardinal of the Church and hold a position in Vatican.

In Milford, Saint Mary's Schools were feeling the success of the times and there was to improve and expand the education provided to a new generation of Catholics who were filling the parish schools. On May 21, 1954, the headline of *The Milford Daily News* announced that Saint Mary's "Is Made a Central High School." This designation, decided at the annual meeting of the School Corporation, at which Bishop Wright presided, made the decision that the Corporation and not the parish would be responsible for the administration of the high school. The administration of the Grammar School was transferred to the pastor of Saint Mary's Parish while the school corporation would be solely responsible for the high school.

The original members of the corporation were reelected to serve the new Board: Bishop Wright was elected as President with the Very Rev. William Foran, Pastor of Saint Mary's as treasurer, the Hon. John Swift as clerk, and Benjamin Clancy, Patrick Lally, Patrick Lawless and John Neilan as lay representatives. Fr. John P. Farnon was elected to the school corporation and named its headmaster with Sr. Rose Concepta, SSJ as Principal. She, along with Sr. Mary Nativity, the superior, were also elected to the Board. The other members of the Board were fourteen pastors from the area, from Southboro to Uxbridge.

The Board planned its annual meeting for the fall, before the opening of the new school year. Saint Mary's was then the third high school in the diocese to become a Central High School, the others being Saint Bernard's in Fitchburg and the Academy of the Sacred Heart in Worcester. The determination of a central high school is done on a regional basis and allows students from the member parishes in that geographical area to have equal access to a Catholic education. The designation also places the larger expenses of

maintaining a high school facility and curriculum on a single parish since the administration of the school is the responsibility of the headmaster of the school.


Lower Church Notice:

BLESSING YOUR HOME FOR THE NEW YEAR!



The Feast of the Epiphany is the customary day to bless the home for the new year, or a blessing is fitting whenever you can gather your family during January. You can bless the house by simply praying a special prayer of blessing as a mealtime grace, or by embellishing the blessing by writing, 20 + C + M +

B + 22, above the front door or individual bedroom doors with blessed chalk.

Sanctuary Lamp Intentions

As we begin a new year, we will begin a new practice to take intentions for the sanctuary lamp as it burns each week to acknowledge the presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. These intentions may be made through our office every quarter. We will take intentions now for the weeks of January through March. Beginning March 1st, we will take intentions for April, May and June. Only one intention may be booked per person/family for each quarter to insure that all who want to have the opportunity to have the lamp burn for their intention from Saturday to Saturday. We will have three lamps for intentions: 1) the main church, 2) the lower church, and 3) the Saint Joseph Chapel in the center. The offering is \$10 for the week. These funds will be set aside for the purchase of any liturgical appointments for our sanctuary and worship.



Do you like to knit or crochet?

The "Hands-to-Work Ministry" at Saint Mary's needs new members to join them in work, prayer, and fellowship. They create prayer shawls for parishioners experiencing lengthy or chronic illness, who are hospitalized, or recovering from surgery. SAINT JOSEPH CHAPLET

In a revelation in Brazil, Saint Joseph asked that the first Wednesday of each month be dedicated to him and his Most Chaste Heart in prayer. To those who make the 9 first Wednesdays (similar to the promise of nine first Fridays to the Sacred Heart), he promised special graces to the sick and dying. This revelation included the 7 Sorrows and Joys of Saint Joseph and special provent for his charlet Warrill and the sick and dying the side of the side

special prayers for his chaplet. We will pray the chaplet in the Saint Joseph Chapel of the Parish Center Wednesday, January 5, 2022 the 1st Wednesday of the month.

Sunday, January 2, 2022 Overjoyed

Today's readings: Isaiah 60:1–6; Psalm 72:1–2, 7–8, 10–11, 12–13; Ephesians 3:2–3a, 5–6; Matthew 2:1–12.

"They were overjoyed at seeing the star." The Magi had gone to the palace because their way of seeking wisdomfollowing the natural signs of the world—told them a king had been born. A king whose importance was so great that his birth was told in the stars. But the king was not in the palace. This birth, so significant as to be marked by a star, was hidden away in Bethlehem, a small town. The Magi were not Jewish. They did not know about the promise of God that was now being fulfilled. But God gave them a light to follow. The new thing that God was doing—fulfilling the promises of old to bring salvation to the ends of the earth—included them. Scripture tells us that when the star stopped over the place where Jesus was, the Magi were overjoyed to see it. Inside the home, they found Jesus with Mary, his mother. They fell down and worshiped him, so overcome were they with joy at what God was doing and at the gift of being allowed to share in it. Then the Magi went home by another route.

This is, of course, practical, in that they were avoiding Herod. But they went home a different way because they were themselves different. They were changed by their joy. What light has God given you to follow? When have you been filled with joy? How did it change you?

This Week at Home

Monday, January 3 A Great Light



"The people who sit in darkness have seen a great light." Jesus reveals himself as the light when he preaches the kingdom of God and heals those who come to him. One purpose of the healing Jesus performed was to return to the community those who were separated from society because of illness or disability. As Jesus heals, his identity shines forth as clearly as it did in the star of Bethlehem. With each healing, he also enters into the vocation of the messiah.

Today's readings: 1 John 3:22—4:6; Psalm 2:7bc-8, 10–12a; Matthew 4:12–17, 23–25.



Tuesday, January 4 St. Elizabeth Ann Seton

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was the first person born in the United States to be canonized a saint. As a young widow and mother of five, she converted to Catholicism. She founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, and began the first Catholic girls' school in the United States. She is the patron saint of Catholic schools.

Today's readings: 1 John 4:7–10; Psalm 72:1–2, 3–4, 7–8; Mark 6:33–44.

Wednesday, January 5 Perfect Love

"Perfect love drives out fear." John certainly knew that the world was a broken place when he wrote his first letter. He had witnessed the crowds turning on Jesus and the early persecutions, in addition to the daily worries and anxieties all human beings experience. John knew that there were many dangers in the world. He does not say that perfect love causes fear not to arise. He says perfect love drives it away. This is not about a feeling but about whether we choose to let fear overwhelm us, or whether we choose a different path. Do not be afraid, God says. How can you choose love today?

Today's readings: 1 John 4:11–18; Psalm 72:1–2, 10, 12–13; Mark 6:45–52.




Thursday, January 6 Fulfilled in Your Hearing

Proclaiming the Scripture from Isaiah, Jesus describes the messiah and the era he has come to inaugurate. As Christ's hands and feet in the world, we too must live this fulfillment. What might it mean to proclaim glad tidings to the poor? How can you proclaim liberty to captives? Where can you heal brokenness? The heartbreak that you feel over conditions is your call to live in the kingdom of God.

Today's readings: 1 John: 4:19—5:4; Psalm 72:1–2, 14, 15bc, 17; Luke 4:14–22.

Friday, January 7 Carrying the Light



Some people keep their Christmas tree or manger until the traditional date of Epiphany, which was yesterday. There is also a tradition of keeping some decorations until the Feast of the Presentation in the Temple, or Candlemas, which is celebrated February 2. It can be beautiful to carry the joy of Christmas into Ordinary Time by leaving up a few decorations, possibly some lights to symbolize that Jesus is the Light of the World.

Today's readings: 1 John 5:5–13; Psalm 147:12–13, 14–15, 19–20; Luke 5:12–16.

Saturday, January 8 Joy Made Complete

Human beings are prone to conflict. In today's Gospel, we hear the disciples of John the Baptist perceiving rivalry between John and Jesus. Can you look at a difficult situation with new eyes?


