



Stewardship

One of the great tragedies of the year just past was the horrible earthquake that rocked Haiti and destroyed the church of our twinning parish, Sacre Coeur. A silver lining to this cloud has been the generous response of our parish and individual parishioners who have donated to their need through our parish and our activities.



At the beginning of December, our Parish Council organized a Christmas gala that had expenses of only \$700, with food and drink donated by the various communities of our parish who cooked their ethnic specialties. Though the crowd was smaller than usual, everyone in attendance had a great time. The combined income of the ticket sales, a hat passed during the meal for Haiti, and the auction and raffle items brought in \$4,973. Our expenses for the DJ, Santa, and a liquor license from the town totaled \$700 for a net profit of \$4,273!

Just before Christmas a parishioner visited the parish office to donate \$25,000 to the Haiti Emergency Relief Fund. They offered that if the parish can match that amount, they will donate another \$25,000, for a combined total of \$75,000! *This would put our parish contribution into six figures.*

To date, we have forwarded to Pere Bernard \$3,300 from a collection September, \$2,650 from the Saint Vincent de Paul Bake Sale in November, along with another \$18,311 added to our monthly tithe of \$650 has made a total of **\$52,232.98**. *Thank you for your generosity to our brothers and sisters in Haiti!*

Information

A Message from Father Peter

Dear Parishioners,

Last week we celebrate the journey of the Magi and their adoration of the one true God. This event is identified as the Epiphany. However, in the tradition of the Church there are three moments in the life of Our Lord that are considered the Epiphany. Our English proper name comes from the Greek word meaning 'to make manifest.' Epiphany then is when the Lord is made manifest to the people as to who He truly is. The first of these, celebrated last weekend is when the pagan priests of the Orient see the star, understand its meaning and allow it to lead them to encounter the one, true God. Entering into the house in Bethlehem, they adore the child and present their precious gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. There are two other 'epiphanies' or moments of manifestation in the life of Our Lord.

The second of these is the event described in all four of the gospels, when Jesus is baptized by John in the Jordan River. This moment is the hinge between his private and hidden life with his family in Nazareth and his public ministry of preaching the Reign of God, working miracles as testimony of their truth, ultimately the witness of his suffering, death and resurrection. The third is one that we only hear in our Sunday lectionary every three years; it will be next Sunday's Gospel, the first sign in John's Gospel. It is the Fourth Gospel that tell us the first miracle of Our Lord took place at a wedding at Cana in Galilee when he changed water into wine. This first miracle celebrates the unity that Christ brings in manifesting his divine power over nature, as he weds heaven and earth in his person. These three events are the traditional Epiphany of the Church, those moments when Christ revealed Himself, or made manifest his person to those around him.

It may confuse us to wonder why Jesus was even baptized? John's baptism was one of the repentance, but Jesus was sinless so there was no need for Him to be baptized. His choice to be baptized is not out of necessity, as is ours, but as a gesture of humility to validate its meaning and affirm its practice. That the Lord is baptized is a reminder and a sign that we are in need of baptism, and that our baptism is so much more than that of John, since ours is of water and the Spirit. As such we are called by our baptism to live in Christ. This feast of the second Epiphany reminds us that we have been given great privilege, to belong to the Body of Christ and are called to be Christ in our world.

As we begin this year of 2022, we recognize that our society is in great need of our witness. In a world that is increasingly divided, polarized and violent, that resolves its differences with anger, resentment and violence, we are called to be Christ to others. The voice that speaks to Christ, speaks also of us who belong to Christ by the grace of own baptism: we are the beloved sons and daughters of God on whom His favor rests. And on whom He depends to bring his mercy and love to our world today. As the Church concludes her observance of the Christmas season on this day, let us be mindful to take the grace of this season into our ordinary lives, that we may be changed to bring the presence of Christ into our world today. A Look Back ... School Changes 1954-1962 Part 2 With the announcement, *The Milford Daily News* identified that the enrollment in the high school was 319, with 495 in the grammar school. There were 20 Sisters of Saint Joseph teaching with two lay teachers, "Albert Sayles, teacher-coach, and Mrs. Rita Hanlon, Latin teacher." Tuition for the central high school that September of 1954 would be \$50 while tuition for the grammar school was set at thirty dollars (\$30).

That December, Robert Costa Construction was busy at work on the construction of two additional rooms for Saint Mary's Central High School. These were built above the auditorium on the back of the building, facing the church and parish property. These were the first major renovations to the building since it had opened in 1925. This addition required the hoisting of steel girders over the building and the construction of an emergency fire escape between the rooms from the second story to the ground level.

The need for more space for teaching included more than the high school. The Grammar School was also struggling for space for the growing number of students in the lower grades. On December 9, 1958, a new four room school, situated between the as yet uncompleted convent and the original granite school built by Fr. Cuddihy, opened. It was a single story with four classrooms, built with the ability to expand if need be. The work by Robert Costa Construction Co., had been started the previous spring in a tan brick to match the new convent. The contract was for \$75,000. The building had modern lighting and heating as well as an office for Sister Superior and a room for supplies. The four new classrooms were two for grade 1 and 2 for grade 4. This building would later be sold to the Town of Milford and welcome some of those same students as the town's Senior Center until a larger and more modern facility was built at Central and No. Bow Streets.

These efforts were helpful, but not enough. The demand for Catholic education and the quality of that provided by Saint Mary's Central High School presented the need for an addition to the current high school that would be a major effort. This effort would provide for a gymnasium

for school athletics and physical education programs, a cafeteria with a kitchen to prepare hot lunches and additional classrooms to accommodate the demand for expanded curriculum and students. This would need a special fund drive to raise the needed money to finance this project. A parish goal of \$300,000 was announced to raise funds to finish the convent, and to finance the parish's share in the Central High School's classroom and gymnasium addition.

BLESSING YOUR HOME FOR THE NEW YEAR!




The Feast of the *Epiphany* is the customary day to bless the home for the new year, or a blessing is fitting whenever you can gather your family during January. You can bless the house by simply praying a special prayer of blessing as a mealtime grace, or by embellishing the blessing by writing, 20 + C + M + B + 22, above the front door or individual bedroom doors with blessed chalk.

Blessed chalk & copies of the prayer are available in the vestibule of the Church.

Sanctuary Lamp Intentions

As we begin a new year, we will begin a new practice to take intentions for the sanctuary lamp as it burns each week to acknowledge the presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. These intentions may be made through our office every quarter. We will take intentions now for the weeks of January through March. Beginning March 1st, we will take intentions for April, May and June. *Only one intention may be booked per person/family for each quarter* to insure that all who want to have the opportunity to have the lamp burn for their intention from Saturday to Saturday. We will have three lamps for intentions: 1) the main church, 2) the lower church, and 3) the Saint Joseph Chapel in the center. The offering is \$10 for the week. These funds will be set aside for the purchase of any liturgical appointments for our sanctuary and worship.


John the Baptist pointed away from himself and toward Jesus. He spoke God's Word to the people and baptized those who came to him, but he knew that he was not the messiah, the one who will baptize "with the holy Spirit and fire." And then one day, Jesus came to him to be baptized. The heavens opened and the Spirit came down in the form of a dove. "You are my Beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." The Holy Spirit descended bodily, making Jesus ready for his public ministry. What joy John must have felt to see the fulfillment of God's promises to him and to the people of Israel! It was the beginning of Jesus' public ministry, in which he preached the kingdom of God but also revealed it in everything that he did. On the day of our baptism, we receive the same Holy Spirit that descended on Jesus two thousand years ago. It is the beginning of our own vocation to reveal the kingdom of God in our words and our actions: to be like Jesus. How is God calling you today? You are God's beloved child, in whom God is well pleased. How will you carry the joy of that revelation into your life beyond the Christmas season?

This Week and Beyond

January 10—March 1 Ordinary Time

The word ordinary can feel like a synonym for "boring," but Ordinary Time is far from it. This season takes its name from the ordinal numbers (first, second, third, fourth, fifth, and so on) that are used to count the Sundays and the weeks that follow them.

While the seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter have a certain importance in the liturgical year, that does not diminish Ordinary Time. Consider that as the priest prepares the paschal candle at the Easter Vigil, he states, "All time belongs to him." How might you use this season to grow closer to God?



January 18–25 Prayer for Christian Unity

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity spans an octave, or eight-day observance, a time frame that lends significance to the week. It is a great sorrow to be separated from our brothers and sisters in Christ, unable to join around the Eucharistic table together to "do this in memory of me." We wait in hope in a special way during this week for the day when all divisions among Christians will cease.



January 25 Conversion of St. Paul



This feast commemorates the day when Saul, an observant young Jewish man who opposed the early Christians and even participated in the stoning death of St. Stephen, had an encounter with the risen Jesus. Saul, also known as Paul, left behind his former life to become an apostle to the gentiles. To preach the Gospel, you might offer forgiveness and mercy to someone who is not sorry, serve a meal at a soup kitchen with a joyful heart, or drop off a box of diapers at a place that serves mothers and children.

Today's readings: Acts 22: 3–6 or Acts 9:1–22; Psalm 117:1bc, 2; Mark 16:15–18



January 28 St. Thomas Aquinas

Known as the angelic doctor, St. Thomas Aquinas was a Dominican priest whose writings are essential to the way we understand what we believe. He was a great theologian and philosopher, engaging with the intellectual currents of his day as well as those of ancient philosophy. St. Thomas described the beatific vision, unending happiness and union with God, as the goal of human life.

Today's readings: 2 Samuel 11:1–4a, 5–10a, 13–17; Psalm 51: 3–4, 5–6a, 6bcd–7, 10–11; Mark 4:26–34 January 31 St. John Bosco



St. John Bosco was an Italian priest who worked to improve the lives of young people who lived in poverty. He went into the world to encounter the young people who had traveled to the city to try to find a better life but were living in abject poverty and unsafe conditions. He began many initiatives and organizations to assist children and was the founder of a religious congregation.

Today's readings: 2 Samuel 15:13–14, 30, 16:5–13; Psalm 3:2–3, 4–5, 6–7; Mark 5:1–20.

February 2 The Presentation of the Lord



This feast, forty days after Christmas, is traditionally a time to bring candles to church to be blessed. In Luke's account of the Gospel, we hear Simeon proclaim Jesus "a light for revelation to the Gentiles and glory for your people Israel." The Gospel according to John is also a source of the imagery of light associated with Jesus. Anna and Simeon watched and waited for the light throughout their lives. At times, it can be difficult to wait for what we most hope for. Watching and waiting for the light, we can unite ourselves with the waiting of Anna and Simeon. What desires of your heart are you still waiting to have fulfilled? You might decorate a tealight holder and light the candle to remind you to wait in hope.


