Stewardship

At first, we suspected that the extreme cold temperatures of this January had taxed the ability of our heat pumps to provide a comfortable climate in our parish church, however, we learned that the cold environment in the church two weekends ago was the result of a blip in the power grid. Apparently, something during the cold spell caused the electrical service to the church to go off line. When it came back on line, six of the units did not reboot. As a result, the heat that we had was with less than half of our system operating.

Once we discovered the problem, we have been at work to resolve it by investigating the protection for a power surge to our electrical service to prevent future incidents of a similar nature. Once Victory learned of the problem, they had a laborer on site to put the systems back on line. The extreme cold made it longer than ideal in the midst of weekend liturgies to get the system back to a comfortable temperature. We appreciate that this work is covered by our warranty and was at no expense to the parish. We are still in the process of learning this new system and the particulars and demands of this technology to keep us all comfortable. Thank you for your understanding.

A Message from Father Peter

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend our nation marks the tragic anniversary of the Supreme Court decision in 1972 that legalized abortion throughout the land. Many constitutional lawyers question the validity of this decision as unprecedented and even unfounded in constitutional law, but the force of public opinion, strongly influenced by those who fund advertising and politicians with the profits from abortion in the intervening years, denies any argument to limit or abolish this decisive act for the future. Through the years, it seems that the more the effort succeeds to limit abortion on demand, the more the abortion industry fuels the argument with fears of limiting personal choice and individual freedoms. It is ironic to realize that when Clinton ran for president in the 1980s, the claim of his ticket was that abortion should be 'safe, legal and rare.' While never an acceptable position for the Church or the Pro-Life movement (that sold its integrity to the original Jane Roe of the decision), our society is further to the left of that position than ever before.

A century and a half ago, our country fought a civil war over the rights and dignity of every human being regardless of the color of their skin, or their country or continent of origin. Today, a similar conflict tears at the fabric of our country over the rights of every human being, whether in the womb or already born. The argument then was that it was their right and their profit was at stake is no different from the modern industry that fuels the mainstream of public opinion and fans the fears of limited freedom and individual liberty in order to protect their own interests and more importantly the sizeable profits that they reap.

Unfortunately, in our modern times we are used to quick sound bytes and easily digestible information that doesn't challenge us to think or to criticize the larger politically correct opinion. Sadly, most of our news media is more interested in creating news or determining it rather than reporting it for our understanding and analysis. A quick example is the restoration of the famed Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. A design is now underway that would remove almost any definable Christian imagery in the interest of a transcendental ambiance including a room specifically dedicated to the protection of the environment. Only one American news outlet has even carried the story, most choosing to ignore it since the direction devalues Christianity and is not politically correct to argue against it.

Thus, it remains to people who value life at every moment and at every instance to defend and argue for its sacredness. Not just for life in the womb, but the dying to have dignity and a natural death and not be forced for insurance profits to 'choose death' as a moral good when it is an objective evil. To recognize that human trafficking, the exploitation of minors, the abuse and neglect of children are all issues that revolve around this decision and the position that all life is sacred. Our local news outlets carry continuing stories of the disappearance of a five year old girl, TWO years ago! How does a five year old girl disappear and no one notices? Easily in a society where everyone looks out for oneself and there is no accountability for any other life.

A Look Back ... A Statue of Mary

When the committee was organizing an observance of the centennial anniversary in 1948 of the founding of the parish, it was suggested that a permanent memorial of the milestone could be a statue to honor Our Lady, for whom our parish was named. At the time, Fr. Foran recommended instead that Our Lady be honored by a statue of her beloved spouse, Saint Joseph, and that it simultaneously would honor the commitment of the Sisters of Saint Joseph who had taught in the parish schools for nearly half a century then. The committee followed Fr. Foran's recommendation and the statue that still faces Winter Street was installed in 1950 as a memorial of the parish's centennial.

The idea of a statue of Our Lady on the parish grounds resurfaced during the 1960s when the Class of 1966 met to consider a Class Gift to the school, as their legacy to their alma mater. Sr. Francis Dolores, SSJ, in her first year as Principal of the Central High School succeeding Sr. Rose Concepta, who had been assigned to St. Peter's in Worcester, suggested that a statue of Our Lady on the front lawn of the school named for her, would be very appropriate. The class leaders agreed. The Headmaster, Fr. Martin Manahan agreed and the class set to the task. However, the expense of an appropriate statue was beyond the means of the fundraising efforts of the class in their final year. As a result, the balance came from other students and alumni of Saint Mary's CCHS. The statue rested on a pedestal of about two feet, the back signed inscribed with the memorial as a 'Gift from the Class of 1966.' It was positioned at the southwestern corner of the school, facing the intersection between Main and Winter Streets sometime that year.



When the school property was sold to the Town of Milford in 1977, one of the concerns was the placement of a religious article on what would then become town property. The Pastoral Team at Saint Mary's agreed to the relocation of the statue to the front of the parish church to the left of the main entrance, still facing Winter Street. And so it remains until today, greeting parishioners at it did students to honor our patroness, Saint Mary of the Assumption.

Sanctuary Lamp Intentions

As we begin a new year, we will begin a new practice to take intentions for the sanctuary lamp as it burns each week to acknowledge the presence of our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament. These intentions may be made through our office every quarter. We will take intentions now for the weeks of January through March. Beginning March 1st, we will take intentions for April, May and June. **Only one intention may be booked per person/family for each quarter** to insure that all who want to have the opportunity to have the lamp burn for their intention from Saturday to Saturday. We will have three lamps for intentions: 1) the main church, 2) the lower church, and 3) the Saint Joseph Chapel in the center. The offering is \$10 for the week. These funds will be set aside for the purchase of any liturgical appointments for our sanctuary and worship.
