Baptism of the Lord

SUNDAY REFLECTION

John preached a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. Jesus' baptism is the acceptance and the beginning of his mission. Jesus submitted himself entirely to his Father's will. Out of love he consented to this baptism of death for the remission of our sins.

The Father proclaimed his entire delight in his Son and spoke audibly for all to hear. The Holy Spirit was present as he anointed Jesus for his ministry which began that day as he rose from the waters of the Jordan River. Jesus will be the source of the Spirit for all who come to believe in him. At his baptism the heavens were opened and the waters were sanctified by the descent of Jesus and the Holy Spirit, signifying the beginning of a new creation.

The Lord Jesus is ever ready to renew us in his Holy Spirit and to anoint us for mission. We are called to be "light" and "salt" to those around us. The Lord wants his love and truth to shine through us that others may see the goodness and truth of God's message of salvation.


Baptism is not, as is true of all the sacraments, an isolated ritual. It takes place in the context of our whole life and the life of the community. Whether we are baptized as children or as adults, what primarily is happening is that we become incorporated into the Christian community. We become active members of the Body of Christ. It can never be something imposed on us against our will. As today's readings tell us, the Sacrament of Baptism is insufficient to save us. We must live our faith in Christ by obeying the commandments of God. Our faith without works is dead. It is insufficient to have faith in Christ to be saved.

When Jesus came out of water after his Baptism the heavens open and the Holy Spirit descends upon Him in the form of a dove. There is also the voice of the Father that comes from the cloud, "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased". The Spirit that characterizes Jesus is the Spirit of God's love. Everything Jesus says and does comes from the intimate communion that he has with God. He wants to reveal God's love to the whole world and he will do it gently, for he is gentle and humble in heart.

Let us recall our own baptism and today let us renew the promises made on our behalf at our own baptism and in so doing renew our commitment to follow Jesus, even though it be to the cross, for he is the Way, the Truth and the Life and he will take us to the goal for which we most long: intimate communion of love with God and so with the whole of creation.

REFLEXION DOMINICAL

Juan predicó un bautismo de arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados. El bautismo de Jesús es la aceptación y el comienzo de su misión. Jesús se sometió por completo a la voluntad de su Padre. Por amor, consintió en este bautismo para la remisión de nuestros pecados.

El Padre proclamó todo su deleite en su Hijo y habló para que todos lo oyieran. El Espíritu Santo estuvo presente al ungir a Jesús para su ministerio que comenzó ese día cuando se levantó de las aguas del río Jordán. Jesús será la fuente del Espíritu para todos los que lleguen a creer en él. En su bautismo se abrieron los cielos y las aguas fueron santificadas por el descenso de Jesús y el Espíritu Santo, lo que significa el comienzo de una nueva creación.

El Señor Jesús está siempre dispuesto a renovarnos en su Espíritu Santo y a unirnos para la misión. Estamos llamados a ser "luz" y "sal" para los que nos rodean. El Señor quiere que su amor y su verdad brillen a través de nosotros para que los demás vean la bondad y la verdad del mensaje de salvación de Dios.

El bautismo no es, como es el caso de todos los sacramentos, un ritual aislado. Tiene lugar en el contexto de toda nuestra vida y de la vida de la comunidad. Ya sea que seamos bautizados como niños o como adultos, lo que principalmente está sucediendo es que nos incorporemos a la comunidad cristiana. Llegamos a ser miembros activos del Cuerpo de Cristo. Nunca puede ser algo que se nos imponga contra nuestra voluntad. Como nos dicen las lecturas de hoy, el sacramento del bautismo es insuficiente para salvarnos. Debemos vivir nuestra fe en Cristo obedeciendo los mandamientos de Dios. Nuestra fe sin obras está muerta.

Cuando Jesús salió del agua después de su Bautismo, los cielos se abren y el Espíritu Santo desciende sobre él en forma de paloma. También está la voz del Padre que viene de la nube: "Este es mi Hijo, el Amado, con quien estoy muy complacido". El Espíritu que caracteriza a Jesús es el Espíritu del amor de Dios. Todo lo que Jesús dice y hace proviene de la íntima comunión que tiene con Dios. Quiere revelar el amor de Dios a todo el mundo y lo hará generosamente porque es 'manco y humilde de corazón'.

Recordemos nuestro propio bautismo y hoy renovemos las promesas hechas en nuestro beneficio en nuestro propio bautismo y al hacerlo renovemos nuestro compromiso de seguir a Jesús, incluso hasta la cruz, porque él es el Camino, la Verdad y la Vida y nos llevará a la meta: comunión íntima de amor con Dios y así con toda la creación.

- Siga las instrucciones de los de los ujieres para sentarse y en el momento de comulgar como también al salir de la iglesia.



The Office for Catholic Social Justice Ministry has scheduled a series of webinars based upon the US Bishops' Pastoral Letter against Racism. The next event is on **Wednesday, January 13th, 7:00pm**. The Office for Catholic Social Justice Ministry of the Archdiocese of Hartford will continue its conference series with the 60 minute webinar: **"Race and Human Trafficking"**.

Of the 210 children referred to the Connecticut's Department of Children and Families in 2018 for high risk or confirmed human trafficking, 73% were children of color. Race plays a role in every part of the exploitation of children; and in effort to combat human trafficking, our conversations and solutions must be racially inclusive.


