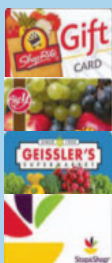

Because a spiritual and mature decision was made to close Saint Rose Church, we all must understand that the closure is not a sign of failure, but rather a sign of faithfulness. And it's an excellent opportunity to allow resurrection to happen.

While every Church has a sunset, there is no dusk for the glory of Jesus Christ. Let us all walk forward pointing to the light. May God bless our little Church of Saint Rose of Lima and all its parishioners, past and present. May The North American Martyrs give all of us the strength and the peace to move forward.

### HISTORY OF ST. ROSE CHURCH



During the end of the 19th century and early 20th century there was an increase in the growth of various ethnic groups in East Hartford. Since the new residents were primarily Catholic, on October 25, 1920, Bishop John J. Nilan established St. Rose of Lima Parish in the Burnside section of East Hartford. This was the second offspring of St. Mary's Church on Main Street in East Hartford. Father Alexander Mitchell was the first pastor and immediately secured a site of 10 acres of land that stretched from the western corner of Burnside Avenue down Church Street. The sizable tract was deeded to St.

Rose for a dollar by the Hamner family, owners of local mills since colonial times. A purchased house served as the rectory, and with the labor of his parishioners, Father Mitchell was soon able to build a frame church in the form of a Quonset hut. A more spacious structure, originally intended to function as a school and parish center, was built on Church Street with parishioners again supplying the labor. The new building was dedicated on June 22, 1924. Father (and future Bishop) Maurice McAuliffe preached the congratulatory sermon. Many friends from other East Hartford Christian churches had made contributions to the building fund. This building would permanently remain the church of St. Rose.

In 1929, Father J. Clement Martin succeeded Father Mitchell. He made St. Rose a well-known East Hartford institution. In the area of ecumenical relations, Father Martin worked closely with Burnside Methodist Church. Original parishioners recall how the two churches would borrow chairs from each other. Father Martin's avid interest in golf and baseball constituted another great meeting point with the larger East Hartford community. In the 1930s, local baseball became a powerful community instrument to lift spirits during the national Depression. Father Martin assisted in the founding of a Twilight League. In 1938, the town established a new playing field at Burnside playground. After Father Martin's death in 1944, the field was renamed Martin Park in his honor.

In 1945, Father Austin Munich became third pastor. The son of converts, the pastor was regarded as liturgically keen and once organized a joint Palm Sunday procession with Burnside Methodist Church. Father Munich enlarged the church, which was rededicated on January 8, 1950.

As the number of parish youngsters grew, the pastor began work on a long-anticipated parochial school. In 1954, he purchased two pieces of property, one south of the church and the other, which included a building, across from St. Rose Church at 20 Church Street. The dwelling was refurbished as a convent for the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, who would staff the new school. Construction on the school then moved forward. St. Rose Junior High School opened on November 28, 1955, and was dedicated by Archbishop Henry J. O'Brien on Sunday, December 11. The original intention was that St. Rose Junior High School would expand into a high school. However, after East Catholic High School was founded in 1961, St. Rose became a K through 8 elementary school.

At Father Munich's death in 1965, Father Raymond Kernick became pastor. He built a new rectory.

In 1971, the parish received its first team pastors, Fathers James T. Carroll and John P. Conte. On October 27, 1974, St. Rose was rededicated by Auxiliary Bishop John F. Hackett after a major restoration effort. In the tradition of this parish, the professional design and actual labor were provided by parishioners. On November 12, 1976, a second team pastorate, consisting of Fathers Conte and Peter S. Dargan, was appointed for St. Rose. This diligent team liquidated the parish debt. The parish continued to grow in social ministries as well as in numbers. A myriad of organizations and apostolates flourished. Outreach ministries included visiting convalescent homes, the wards of the state receiving home in Warehouse Point, and senior citizens. The centers of parochial enthusiasm were the parish council, Ladies' Guild, Men's Club, religious instruction programs, and several Mothers' Circles.

In 1987, St. Rose added Kindergarten and first grade to the school curriculum. The team of Fathers Ronald Osbourne and Robert Kwiatkowski became co-pastors of St. Rose on February 10, 1989. The parish continued to be characterized by a disposition of openness to neighbors' needs for the sake of the Lord. Various ministries were established in the late 1980s and early 1990s, including parish youth programs and a prayer line.

As the demographics in the town changed, the congregation at St. Rose also changed. As the number of Hispanics grew in East Hartford, the number of Spanish speaking Catholics grew. Catholics from Puerto Rico, Mexico, Colombia, Peru, and other Latin American countries found a home at St. Rose of Lima. The need for a Spanish speaking priest became obvious. In 1997, a Spanish Mass was added to the weekend schedule and very quickly, a second weekend Mass was required to minister to the growing number of Hispanic parishioners. As a result, a Spanish speaking parochial vicar, Father Ivan Ramirez, was added to the parish, serving from 2010-2013 and the Spanish community became a very active part of St. Rose Church. Fathers Carlos Echavarria (2013-2015), Michael Santiago (2015), and Gustavo Lopez (2015-present) have also served the Spanish community. In 2004, under the guidance of Reverend John P. Rohan and as a result of declining attendance and a reduction in priests, St. Rose began the process of joining St. Isaac Jogues and St. Mary's Churches into a Cluster named the Catholic Communities of East Hartford North. St. Rose and St. Isaac Jogues were linked in 2004; St. Mary's joined the cluster in 2005.

In 2010 St. Rose School closed due to a decreasing enrollment.

St. Rose continued to be a diverse population with a congregation characterized by openness to neighbor's needs for the sake of God. On June 29, 2017, the three parishes of the Cluster were dissolved, and one new parish, the North American Martyrs Parish, was created. While the church buildings remained the same and kept their respective names, there were no longer three individual parishes.

The continued growth of the Ghanaian Community and their desire to form their own "quasi parish" was realized on January 1, 2019 when St. Isaac Jogues Church separated from the North American Martyrs Parish and became the St. Isaac Jogues Ghanaian Catholic Quasi Parish.

As a result of continuing pastoral planning at the Archdiocesan level, a determination was made that the town of East Hartford could no longer support five parishes. The decision was made in early 2024 that St. Christopher Church would merge with St. Mary's Church and become the North American Martyrs Parish; Our Lady of Peace and St. Rose Churches would be closed. Sunday, June 23, 2024 will be the farewell Mass for both of these churches.

### Historiografía Breve de la Misa en Español en la Iglesia de Sta. Rosa

El Consejo Pastoral de la Iglesia de Santa Rosa de Lima reconoció que la comunidad latina de East Hartford crecía y se necesitaba una misa en español para los pueblos al este del río Connecticut. El pastor, el difunto padre Ronald Osborne, informó a la Arquidiócesis de esta necesidad. No había en Sta. Rosa sacerdotes que hablaran español y el pastor de la Iglesia del Sagrado Corazón, en Hartford, vino a ayudar.

La primera misa en español se celebró el sábado 1o. de marzo de 1997, a las 5:30 PM con menos de 10 asistentes. El Padre Alberto Zanatta, un sacerdote italiano de la Congregación de los Somascos, fue el celebrante. El padre Zanatta era el Pastor de la Iglesia del Sagrado Corazón en Hartford y también servía a la comunidad latina de la Iglesia de San Miguel.

En junio y agosto de 1997 el Padre Franco, celebró las misas en español pero regresó a Italia en septiembre. Los asistentes eran pocos porque la misa no se había promovido más allá de la comunidad de la iglesia de Santa Rosa.

En septiembre de 1997, el Padre Giulio Veronesi, venía los sábados de la Iglesia del Sagrado Corazón a celebrar la misa en español a Sta. Rosa. Gracias a los esfuerzos de un pequeño grupo de latinos que les encantaba escuchar la misa en su idioma más personas supieron de la misa en español. Poco a poco "La Buena Nueva" se transmitió de boca en boca y con volantes que los parroquianos latinos hicieron y distribuyeron en los negocios. Así, la asistencia a la misa aumentó.

En febrero de 1999 el Padre Tomás Mitchell fue nombrado Administrador de la Iglesia de Sta. Rosa de Lima. En el otoño se convirtió en el primer pastor bilingüe de la parroquia.

En marzo de 1999 "Padre Tomás", empezó a celebrar la misa en español. Él decidió que se pusiera un anuncio grande en la esquina de Burnside Ave. con Church Street para anunciar la misa en español a todos los latinos que pasaban por ahí. Residentes de Manchester empezaron a asistir a la misa al ver el anuncio cuando viajaban en coche o autobús de Hartford a Manchester.

En diciembre de 1999 el Diácono Rafaél López fue asignado a Santa Rosa de Lima, donde sirvió a la comunidad hispana por casi dos años.

En junio del 2004 el Padre Tomás fue nombrado pastor de la Iglesia de San Agustín, en Hartford. El Padre Zacarías Pushpanathan vino a celebrar la misa en español y algunos meses después el recién ordenado Diácono Julio C. Maturana, colombiano, fue asignado a Santa Rosa de Lima.

En febrero del 2005 el Padre Carlos Zapata, colombiano, empezó a celebrar la misa en español, los domingos a las 12:30 pm. El número de asistentes a la misa continuó creciendo.

Hoy en día los parroquianos latinos sirven en muchos ministerios de las Comunidades Católicas del Norte de East Hartford. Colombianos, peruanos, puertorriqueños, ecuatorianos, salvadoreños, guatemaltecos venezolanos, nicaragüenses, mexicanos, y de otras nacionalidades se encuentran entre los parroquianos latinos. ¡La comunidad multiétnica, multicultural y multilingüística de nuestras tres parroquias recibe bendiciones al compartir la Palabra de Dios en la misa en español! ¡Estas bendiciones se extienden más allá de nuestras parroquias para ayudar a otros en la comunidad mundial!

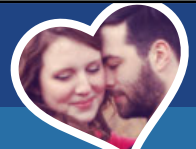
