#### Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

Join us in prayer that as a nation, we may stop wandering in the wilderness of the culture of death and may enter into "life in abundance" (John 10:10) through our faith in Jesus Christ and our proclamation of the Gospel of Life!

Below are resources to aid in protecting all those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning to the end of their lives, and at every point in between.



#### For Families following an Unexpected or Challenging Prenatal Diagnosis of Disability

The Catholic Church teaches that prenatal diagnosis is morally licit, "if it respects the life and integrity of the embryo and the human fetus and is directed toward its safeguarding or healing as an individual" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2274). Advances in prenatal diagnostic technology have helped many families to seek out necessary medical treatment and to prepare for the birth of their child, and to understand potential complications. This same technology can also introduce new challenges to our Christian moral teaching. The often-confusing terminology of "early induction" or "medical induction" recommended by medical staff after an adverse prenatal diagnosis is, in fact, an abortion. Upon receiving an unexpected prenatal diagnosis, up to 90% of women decide to terminate their pregnancies.

# FROM YOUR SHEPHERD: PAX ET BONUM! Nev. Ryan Friedla Princeland andre derg

We are now starting Ordinary Time in our Liturgical Calendar. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which we celebrated last Sunday, took the place of the 1st Sunday in Ordinary Time. Ordinary Time began this past Monday and continues until the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday (March 1). It begins again on the Monday after Pentecost and ends before Evening Prayer I of the 1st Sunday of Advent.

Ordinary Time is not ordinary in the usual sense of the word; the season is called Ordinary time because the time is marked by ordinal numbers, such as 2nd or 10th Sunday. In other words, the Sundays are counted or numbered. The Sundays in Ordinary Time provide us with opportunities to ponder and live out the truth of Christ's Paschal Mystery – the salvific events of his birth, life, death, and resurrection. Indeed, unlike Advent or Lent, which have their own distinctive character, our readings will focus on the entirety of the mystery of Christ and all its dimensions.

This Sunday, our Gospel focuses on the Wedding Feast in Cana, the first sign that Jesus performed in the Gospel of John. The Church attaches great importance to Jesus' presence at the wedding in Cana. She sees in it the confirmation of the goodness and the sacramentality of marriage.

Marriage is not the only thing that is threatened in our society. Indeed, I started incorporating the Prayer to the Holy Family after the Prayers of the Faithful to remind us that we need to pray for our own families and for families in general. Another thing we can pray for, especially right now, is for the unborn children and for the end of abortion. In the dioceses across our country, January 22 is designated as the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. We will have a Mass at 8am followed by an exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with Benediction until noon. Please try to stop by the church for an hour or even for a few minutes and join the whole country in praying. Just remember that in Evangelium Vitae (10), Pope St. John Paul II says,

"A great prayer for life is urgently needed, a prayer which will rise up throughout the world." In Christ,
