



#### Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass

The Holy Eucharist, according to *Lumen Gentium* 11 (and expanded further in the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*), is the source and summit of Christian life.

Hence, both private and public devotions to the Eucharist are encouraged. Furthermore, when the faithful honors Christ present in the sacrament, whether reserved in the tabernacle or exposed in a monstrance for adoration, one needs to remember that this presence is derived from the sacrifice of Christ, and it should be directed toward sacramental and spiritual communion.



All of our devotions indeed must stem from our love of the Eucharist.

At St. Francis Xavier Church, it has been our practice to have a holy hour of adoration every Friday, after the 8am Mass. Last September, when the Men's Group started meeting again, we added an opportunity for half-hour adoration followed by Mass every first and third Saturday of the month. As we begin the year 2022, some of our parishioners have requested that we add another day for adoration. We now have adoration at 7am on Monday mornings before Mass begins.

Probably some of you have stopped by for a few minutes or stayed for a whole hour to do an adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in our church. Or perhaps, some of you do it in other churches. Whatever the case, please note that there are guidelines and a *Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction* published in *Holy Communion and Worship of the Eucharist Outside Mass.* All of the citations below are from this document, published by the Bishop's Committee on the Liturgy.

#### **Regulations for Exposition**

- 84 A single genuflection is made in the presence of the blessed sacrament, whether reserved in the tabernacle or exposed for public adoration.
- 85 For exposition of the blessed sacrament in the monstrance, four to six candles are lighted, as at Mass, and incense is used.
- 91 The ordinary minister for exposition of the eucharist is a priest or deacon. At the end of the period of adoration, before the reposition, he blesses the people with the sacrament.
- 95 During exposition there should be prayers, songs, and readings to direct the attention of the faithful to the worship of Christ the Lord. To encourage a prayerful spirit, there should be readings from scripture with a homily or brief exhortations to develop a better understanding of the eucharistic mystery. It is also desirable for the people to respond to the word of God by singing and to spend some periods of time in religious silence.
  97 Towards the end of the exposition the priest or deacon goes to the altar, genuflects, and kneels. Then a hymn or other eucharistic song is sung. Meanwhile, the minister, while kneeling, incenses the sacrament if the exposition has taken place with a monstrance.

# FROM YOUR SHEPHERD: PAX ET BONUM! Nov. Ryan Friends Princeland Quadro de g

Last week, our Gospel reading was about the Wedding Feast at Cana. Although I mentioned that one way to look at the Gospel is to see marriage as a metaphor for our covenant with God, my homily focused on the transformation of water into wine and our Lord's conversation with our Blessed Mother as the ushering of the manifestation of the glory of God that will be fully revealed at the Cross. In my homiletics class, my professor insisted that we only cover one point. Hence, as much as I would like to have spoken about marriage in particular, I did not have the chance to do it.

This is the reason why I want to use this column to talk about marriage. God is the author of marriage, and, as Catholics, we believe that marriage is a lifelong, faithful partnership between a man and a woman. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (1601) further says that marriage is ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of children. The bond of marriage is indissoluble, and it lasts "until death do us part." Furthermore, John Paul II says in *Familiaris Consortio* (14) that at the heart of married love is the total gift of self that husband and wife freely offer to each other, becoming "one flesh" and being open to children, "who are a living reflection of their love."

Unfortunately, some marriages end in divorce and separation. Probably, you are in a "regular" marriage, or you are not married at all. Or perhaps, you are in an "irregular" marriage (you are divorced and remarried but not in the Church). Definitely, almost all of us know someone who is in this last situation.

If you are having marital problems, please email me so we can chat about it. I am not a licensed therapist, but I can point you to the right person and offer some resources that might be helpful. Also, if you are divorced and remarried and would like to get your previous marriage annulled, let me know as well. The Church is here not to judge you but to offer her help in reconciling you. Finally, if your marriage is not blessed in the Church, let us talk about it so we can convalidate your marriage.
