


Soul of Reverend John F. Andrews. May the Lord grant him eternal peace.

EPIPHANY BLESSING You are still encouraged to participate in a traditional Catholic blessing of your home by the use the blessed chalk in the New Year. The home blessing can be done as follows: Use the blessed chalk from your Church to write: C+M+B+22 above the main

doorway: 22 for the year 2022; C, M, B for the 3 Magi – Casper, Melchior, and Balthasar – and for *Christus Mansionem Benedicat*, Latin for "May Christ Bless this House." As you are writing, pray one of the following prayers: May all who come to



our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen. Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen. May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart, gentleness, and the keeping of your law. We give thanks to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and for ever. Amen

Pope Francis called for the World Synod to take place in October 2023. It is about how we as disciples are journeying together. Synodality represents the path by which our local Church can be renewed by the action of the Holy Spirit, listening together to what God has to say to his people. One of the most effective methods of enabling us to develop a biblical worldview is by addressing critical questions that consistently lead to beliefs and behaviors that are in tune with biblical teaching. It simply means that we view life through the lens of God's Word. We believe that the Bible is inspired by God who is inerrant, and infallible. The Second Goal: Listen to God, the Architect The Second Vatican Council insisted on the unique character of the vocation of the laity: the vocation to "seek the Kingdom of God by engaging in temporal affairs and ordering them to the plan of God." When this vocation is lived out in our professions, men and women of faith become architects who see their work as a call from God. They are led by the spirit of the Gospel, their lives and their work contribute to the sanctification of the world.

The Holy Name of Jesus gradually fills our souls with a peace and joy we never had before. The Holy Name of Jesus gives us strength that our sufferings become light and easy to bear. Wed Jan. 5, St John Neumann, Bishop of Philadelphia +1860, missionary form Bohemia, known for his holiness, promoter of parochial schools. Thur Jan. 6, St. Andre Bessette +1937. Orphaned at 12 known as the healer and the "miracle Man of Montreal", patron of caregivers. Fri Jan. 7, St Raymond Penyafort, priest. +1275. 2nd master General after St Dominic, promotor of cannon law, noted for work on penance Summa de casibus paenitentiae, patron of lawyers.
