January 16, 2022 The 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

Last week I talked about the challenge of building our community during a pandemic. I am going to ask us all to work together to do just that. Why are we the Catholic Community of Sacred Heart? We are a community not just to worship together but to carry each other's burdens, and in this way fulfill the love of Christ. We have each other's back.

We are a community that does carry each other's burdens, and we can learn to do so even better. It is in this spirit, we are offering a Lenten program: Caring for Inactive Members: How to Make God's House a Home. I am hoping that many of our parishioners will get involved in this course. I hope YOU will be involved.

Caring for Inactive Members will teach us how to relate to inactive members and welcome them home. The course content includes:

- Hopes and Expectations
- How to Handle Chance Encounters with Inactive Members
- How to Converse Comfortably
- How to Guarantee 100% Success
- How to Set Up Visits
- How to Invite Gently

Much, much more takes place during the six hours of instruction. The topics offer vital knowledge every single parishioner needs to have because everyone of us is responsible for building community and making people feel at home. So often we come across in a judgmental way toward those individuals who have become inactive. This is neither Christian nor helpful. Developing greater understanding is essential, and that is one of the pillars of this course.

Who should take the course? YOU should, and so should every member of our community. The more who are aware of good and bad responses to those they haven't seen around the church for a while, the better. The more who are aware of the topics covered in Caring for Inactive Members, the more they will be part of the solution.

I am trying to make this as safe and as easy for everyone to participate. We will have 6 one-hour ZOOM classes on Each Tuesday of Lent beginning March 1st and ending April 5th from 7:00 P.M to 8:00 P.M. I will be the course facilitator; each session will be a combination of lecture, discussion, and practical application.

There is no registration fee! Each participant will receive two books. If you are interested in participating, please email the parish office or register on our website. Message Shaper's Corner The Vow

A miracle is when God shows us who He is. The first miracle Jesus ever performed was to turn water into wine, and this showed us who Jesus was. The miracle at Cana was a kind of foretelling of Christ's institution of the Blessed Sacrament: a miracle through water and wine based around His new commandment to love, which is found in community.

Jesus himself continues this great gesture today when we gather together for the Eucharist. He draws us deep into his sacrifice and gives us his own body and blood, the gift of himself. Through the words of the priest, Jesus speaks the same words today as he did at the Last Supper.

Reflection Questions

- Adults: When have you stepped in, as Mary did at Cana, to try and make a difficult situation easier for someone?
- Kids: What can you do this week to help make someone's job a little easier?

Ministry Needs

Since the beginning of the pandemic, many ministers have paused their ministry. In an effort to stay connected to all members of the parish during the on-going pandemic, we are in need of help is several areas, including:

Community Outreach Team— these people would be willing to call and stay in touch with other members of the parish community. This ministry can be done from the comfort of home. Please call/email the parish office if you can assist.

Cooking for the **Mustard Seed.** On the third Tuesday of each month, Sacred Heart parishioners prepare, deliver, & serve a dinner at the Mustard Seed. The Mustard Seed is a non-profit organization that serves the homeless & low income families and individuals in Worcester. Menus will be forthcoming.

Twice Blessed Thrift Shoppe

The Thrift Shop receives donated clothing, shoes and items which are sold to the public. All proceeds benefit the Sacred Heart Parish. Adult and teen volunteers are needed for sorting, creating displays, photographing and creating an on-line presence and working during operating hours.

Community Suppers

Since pausing in March of 2020 due to Covid-19, we have been providing Grab 'n Go meals every Thursday to those experiencing food insecurity. The meals are either purchased from local restaurants or prepared by volunteers and distributed from the Trinity Church entrance. Until Covid cases decline to an acceptable level, we will continue to alternate purchasing and preparing these meals.

Monetary donations are necessary to continue this Grab n' Go program. We are now serving over 150 meals weekly, as the number needy has doubled over the past two years. 
