From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

When we need a thought of peace, or a calming moment, we need only to think of that starlit night when Joseph and Mary searched for a place to stay as Mary was about to give birth. Taking refuge in what amounts to a cave, where animals slept, the heavens opened, and the Son of God was born! He was born not with the mountains quaking or the fire burning but instead the Spirit filling Mary with the joy every mother feels at the birth of their child. It shouldn't surprise us that God chose to enter the world as a child, born of humble beginnings, in the most humble of places. The incredibly beautiful story of the Annunciation repeats itself this last Sunday of Advent. Mary, also a humble virgin, has found favor with God. It must have been surprising to her, but she uttered those words of trust, "behold I am the handmaid of the Lord, May it be done to me according to your word". Trusting in the words of the angel Gabriel, her life would never be the same, again, much as for any mother. She would witness the joys, the fears, the unknown of being a mother. So much trust goes into that moment. Trust, hope, faith, and joy meld together to allow this sacred task of being a mother to unfold. Advent has invited us deep into itself, with some of the most beautiful words of scripture of the entire church year. Advent has challenged us to hear the word of God and then to give witness to it in Jesus Christ. Advent invites us into that moment where the history of salvation also was changed. The swelling God sought was not one of brick or marble, but a dwelling within the hearts of his people. That quiet, peaceful night gave the world its greatest gift. During this last week of Advent, let God calm your heart as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Christ. Every year, we need to be reminded of this selfless gift, but perhaps especially *this year*. We could only have come this far during this challenging time, a time none of us could have expected, without the loving, all encompassing love God has shared with the world. Pray through this last week, and prepare to celebrate with that same sense of peace and calm that the approaching holy night brought about. *Fr. Elston*

THE CHRISTMAS STAR

The orbits of Saturn and Jupiter are aligning. This happens every 20 year or so. It is not visible from earth that often. This is the closest these planets will be to each other since 1623 and the closest visibly since 1226. Yes, that was not a typo..... it has been that long since this astronomical occurrence has happened. They will be visible in the southwest portion of the sky here in the United States on December 21 just after sunset. This occurrence is often called the "Christmas Star". It will not be visible again until 2080. Unless you are very young, you might not get to see that one (from Earth, at least!) In this year when we could all use all the good and hopeful things we can get, it would be a particularly good year to make sure you seek out this star on December 21, the winter solstice. If you see it, make a special wish for health, happiness, and peace for all in the coming new year!

Pre-qualification is done by phone at **570-654-9923**.

Proof of address (recent utility bill) is required at your first appointment **each year**. Food Pantry appointments are made for the **First and Second Wednesdays** of each month. This ministry is closed from June through August.


