
A PRAYER FOR THE NEW YEAR

A few years ago, I happened to notice one that said "My child is Saviour of the World!---Mary."

REMEMBER

For reference the rite is reprinted here. **With the increasing difficulty for individuals to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation due to the current health crisis, the faithful of the Diocese of Scranton are reminded that by having perfect contrition one can receive the forgiveness of sins, apart from going to confession.**

Perfect contrition requires the following three things: A love of God above all else | A sincere desire for the forgiveness from sin | The resolution to go to confession as soon as possible when this health crisis subsides

RESERVATIONS FOR MASS

NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING OF SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious, or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse Hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313, or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. It is also the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator at (570) 862-7551 or any Diocesan official.


