

From the Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

John the Baptist, such a central figure in our preparations for Christmas, now returns as we bring the season to a conclusion. It seems strange that this great season of Christmas is concluded by celebrating a sacred moment; the baptism of Jesus, that ushers in a new beginning! An ending moves immediately into a new beginning! So much of life revolves around that truth! A pregnancy ends with the joy of new life! A child grows and learns and parents eventually send that child off to college, marriage, parenthood themselves! So many beginnings and ends in life itself. REMEMBER

The dispensation from attending Mass is still in effect and will be for some time. This dispensation means there is no obligation to attend Mass each week. For the duration of the pandemic, Bishop Bambera has said that safety of parishioners is of the utmost importance during this time. If you feel uncomfortable in any way, please do not feel it is necessary to come to Mass. It is still completely acceptable to participate in Mass virtually, either through the Masses we provide online through YouTube and our media pages, or through televised Masses on EWTN or CTV. If you are uncomfortable attending confession, the prayer of Perfect Contrition will be more than adequate during this time. For reference the rite is reprinted below. **With the increasing difficulty for individuals to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation due to the current health crisis, the faithful of the Diocese of Scranton are reminded that by having perfect contrition one can receive the forgiveness of sins, apart from going to confession.**

Perfect contrition requires the following three things:

-A love of God above all else -A sincere desire for the forgiveness from sin-The resolution to go to confession as soon as possible when this health crisis subsides

SUPPORT CHILDREN THROUGH DIFFICULT TIMES

As the pandemic continues throughout the country, it can be challenging to reassure children that all is well. Try these tips to calm fears and manage stress. **Keep routines in place.** Even if you're at home all day, sticking to a regular schedule is key. Try to make sure youngsters have some structure, like getting up, eating and going to bed around the same time every day. Have children dressed, breakfast, and ready for class at the usual hour. Youngsters benefit from knowing what to expect and when. **Add variety.** In the evenings, play a board game, put together a puzzle, bake desserts, take turns reading a new book aloud. **Share your confidence in god's care.** During family prayer, teach children to commit concerns to God. Together, read Bible stories that demonstrate how others have relied on God's care.

NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING OF SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious, or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee, or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania's Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse Hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313, or electronically at www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis. It is also the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to adhere to all civil and state regulations. To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator at (570) 862-7551 or any Diocesan official.

FOOD PANTRY—NOW OPEN!

Free food is given, **by appointment**, to qualifying households in the Pittston Area and Wyoming Area School Districts (excluding citizens of Avoca and Duryea, as they have their own Community Food Pantries). Households may receive food once per month from September through May.

Pre-qualification is done by phone at **570-654-9923**. Proof of address (recent utility bill) is required at your first appointment **each year**. Food Pantry appointments are made for the **First and Second Wednesdays** of each month. This ministry is closed from June through August.

KID'S CLOSET—NOW OPEN

The Kid's Closet offers new and gently used clothing for free to children (sizes newborn through 16) to families in the Pittston Area and Wyoming Area School Districts.

Photo ID is required to participate in this ministry. Families are able to visit the Kid's Closet every **6 weeks**.

This ministry is open the **First and Second Wednesdays** of each month from **9am to 11:30am** with **no evening hours**.

TOY AND BOOK CORNER—NOW OPEN

The "Corner" offers new and gently used toys and books for free to children and families in the Pittston Area and Wyoming Area School Districts. **Photo ID** is required to participate in this ministry. Families are able to visit the Toy and Book Corner every **6 weeks**.

GOSPEL REFLECTION from LPI

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest, exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept, and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the human journey, or personal painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed. If we lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction, and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God's voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds and be reconciled to our Creator. Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need in order to be productive stewards and faithful Christians. Baptism calls us to remember, accept, and deal with the sins and inequities of our past regardless of how hurtful and serious. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Christ. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they are saying and learn from them. If we ignore the past, collectively or personally, or pretend that it never happened, we will never grow. We will surely die. People need to hear the message, lived and spoken, delivered by the baptized members of the Body of Christ. It is an essential message of hope that is layered with visions of justice, peace, reconciliation, redemption, blessing, and healing. It is a message that helps us remember what has gone before, the graces and the sins, and bring ourselves by God's help where we need to be. We are called to do much more than sit home behind our closed doors. We have a message to deliver. Are we ready to do so?


