


FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

s you know, I am big on Baptism! Today we celebrate the baptism of Jesus certainly one of the major days in the season of Christmas. In fact, this day

brings the Christmas season to its conclusion. It is the beginning of the public

ministry of Jesus. We celebrate Jesus participating in what will become the cornerstone of the Christian faith. The first sacrament, Baptism, brings us sacramentally into the family of God. We recognize our adoption by God, his eternal love and care for us, and the responsibilities incurred at Baptism by the parents. The child's parents are charged with nurturing and encouraging the greatest gift they will ever give to their child – faith. Nothing can be more important than the love they will share with this


