

Dear Parishioners,




ell, another Christmas season is behind us. We carry the spirit of Christmas with

This week we see Jesus obeying the fourth commandment, to honor his mother. Why would Mary make such a big deal about wine? It is necessary to view this event in the context of a Jewish wedding. It was a celebration for the entire community. Apparently, the wine ran out, for whatever reason. Mary anticipates the difficulty and embarrassment this could bring and asks a very big act from her son. As usual, the action of Jesus provides so much more than expected. Jesus' generosity in this event provides for us an understanding of what is to come. Jesus will reach out to all in need, bringing them what they need. Most of all, he provides insight into the immense love the Father lavishes on all of those he has brought into existence. We spend our lives finding ways to repay that generosity. It may be challenging, but it is not difficult. It is a choice we make. Jesus chose to obey the request of his mother and act in a way that provided what was needed. When we are put in a position to respond to a need, we too must find a way and generously respond to God's love in our lives by bringing it to those in need. Kindness and generosity, both of heart and otherwise, must not only exist during the Christmas season. It must be a lesson we learn and use in our lives all year long.


