


#### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

n rare occasions, we might find ourselves to be the eyewitnesses to a news event. We might see an accident, or worse yet, be involved in one. We might see a fire or be a part of some other event that is newsworthy. It definitely makes an impact on us. It gives us a certain perspective when we are actually present when something happens that affects others. Often this might be in a bad way, but sometimes not. Luke opens his two-fold account of the events of Jesus' life by setting it in a certain context. He informs us that his Gospel, and later his authorship of the Acts of the Apostles,



relates real stories, real events that take us back to the eyewitnesses of Christ. This framing of the events helps us to approach the reality of Jesus being a real person, who lived, who was grounded in historical events at a specific time in history and in a certain place. Luke tells us that these are not magnificent "fairy tales" but instead relates these stories after much investigation. Like most stories of newsworthy events, those reporting the events want their accounts to be specific and accurate. We can be aware of the presence of Christ every day. It is important for us to be able to take this man, centered in human history, of whom much is written, spoken, and thought, and make him real before our



eyes and hearts. It is up to us to bear the message, to in fact, be the message to those we encounter. If we do not do this, the reality of the event does not get communicated to anyone. God works through us to bring the peace and presence of Jesus Christ, his beloved Son, to a church, a community, and a world that very desperately needs him. The message is meant for all people. As has been said many times before, "we are all in this together". And that together includes the person Jesus Christ who journeys with us in this life and leads us with passion and purpose to eternal life. This dramatic scene in the synagogue on a sabbath day reminds us of the depth of life to which we are all called to live, with Jesus in our midst.
